Twenty-Seven To Receive Diplomas

Commencement for the 1975 Graduating Class at Wheeler High School will be Tuesday, May 25 at 8:00 P.M. in the High School Auditorium. Twenty-seven students will receive their diplomas.

Kenneth Elliott will give the salutatorian address. Elliott maintained a 91.41 grade average through high school; he is the 19 school; he is the 18 year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Perry Elliott.

Mr. Lawrence Barnhill, Jr., of Graham, will address the graduates at the commencement exercises. Barnhill is with Amicable Life Insurance company.

Diplomas will be presented by Mr. Harold Loyd Lee, president of the board of Trustees for Wheeler.

Names as honor students are Marilyn Moore, Billy McWhorter, and Bill McIlhenny. The students are recognized for having maintained a grade average above 90.

CITY COUNCIL MEETS MONDAY

The regular meeting of the Wheeler City Council Monday evening opened with a prayer by Charlie Wagner. Minutes of the previous meetings were read and approved.

Richard Wallace with Baldwin and Rucker, presented and discussed the 1976-77 City budget with the council. The budget was accepted.

Wesley Masters, Arden Kenady and Don Dean of Amarillo along with Harold Kenady and Lyndon Loyd met with the council to discuss the obtaining of water from the land owned by Kenady and Masters. No decision was reached, however, investigations into the proposal will continue.

Wheeler County Produce representatives met with the council concerning the parking of anhydrous ammonia tanks on their property on Oklahoma Street. A city ordinance prohibits the tanks being kept in the city limits above ground. How-

ever, due to the small amount in the tanks and the fact no loading takes place in the city limits, the produce will be allowed to keep the tanks in the city limits until the first of 1977 at which time the matter will again be discussed.

Citizens are reminded of the City ordinance against burning. If a fire is set and it becomes necessary for the Wheeler Fire Department to be called, the citizen will be charged the cost for extinguishing the fire.

Four Wheeler Firemen are to attend the Fire School at A & M in July. The city voted to pay the expense of three men and the county will pay the expenses of the fourth.

The council voted to have a flagpole erected in front of the city office.

Three men and an alternate were appointed to the Equalization Board which will

meet in July.

Bills were reviewed and passed for payment.

A special meeting of the Wheeler City Council was held Monday evening, May 3, for the purpose of interviewing applicants for City Patrolman.

Seven men were present for the interview. They were Gary Lee Lambert of Oklahoma City, Alfred Watson, Bruce Bailey of Oklahoma City, Jimmy Ray Snyder of Amarillo, Jerry Kelly of Amarillo, Loyd Fitzgerald of Spearman, and Donald Ford.

The council voted to accept Jerry Kelly. Kelly completes Amarillo College May 27 and will report for duty June 1. Kelly is married and has two children.
