**LINES from LINDA**

An electric mixer with a dough hook is an excellent idea for home-makers interested in breadmaking. Dough hooks are designed to produce kneading action similar to hand kneading. However, most mixer models include other beaters to perform traditional mixing jobs. If this type of mixer sounds like a good idea check these items when shopping: Is the shape of the dough hook easily clean? It is easy to insert and remove? Is the mixer easy to operate with controls easily read and operated? Is the bowl gear-driven or is it moved by the beater action? A gear driven bowl maintains a steady speed when mixing very thick or thinner dough, while beater-driven bowl tend to be slow at times and 'runaway' at other times. Is an authorized service center located nearby? "Dough hooks" mixers comes with high, medium, and low powered motors. The medium powered motor produces enough speed for most jobs and uses less energy than the high powered motor. Of course if you don't have a mixer with a dough hook there are bread recipes that require no kneading. Full of energy giving carbohydrates and the essential B-vitamins bread is an important part of daily nutrition. This butter loaf is prepared with out kneading and needs to rise only once. The texture is smooth and the bread a creamy yellow color.

**Butter Loaf**  
1 pkg dry yeast  
1/4 cup warm water  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 pound butter or margarine (soft)  
4 1/2 tablespoons sugar  
1 1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 cup of warm milk  
3 eggs  
4 1/2 cups all purpose flour (sifted)  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Dissolve yeast in warm water with one teaspoon sugar. Cream together butter with flour and one-half tablespoons sugar. Stir in milk. Add eggs and beat well. Add yeast, mixing well. Add flour and salt about one cup at a time, add vanilla. Dough will be very soft. Refrigerate overnight or several hours. Divide dough under hand into long pieces and then braid together. Makes two loaves. Let rise until double in bulk, about one and one-half hours. Bake at 375 degrees F. for 30 minutes. For fancy loaves, brush the top of the risen loaves with egg white and sprinkle with poppy or sesame seeds.
