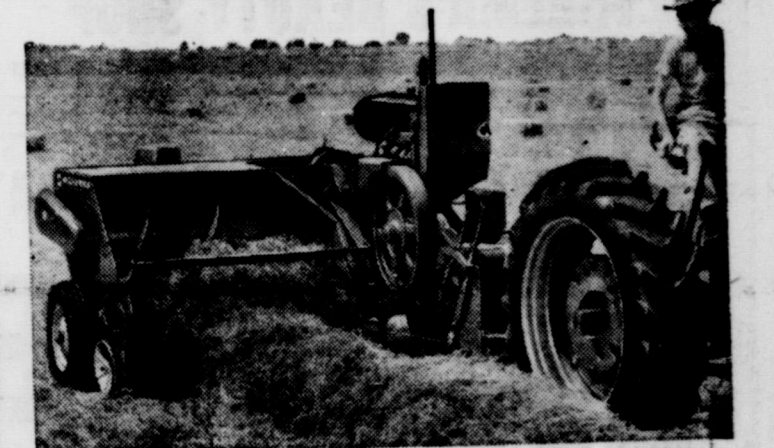

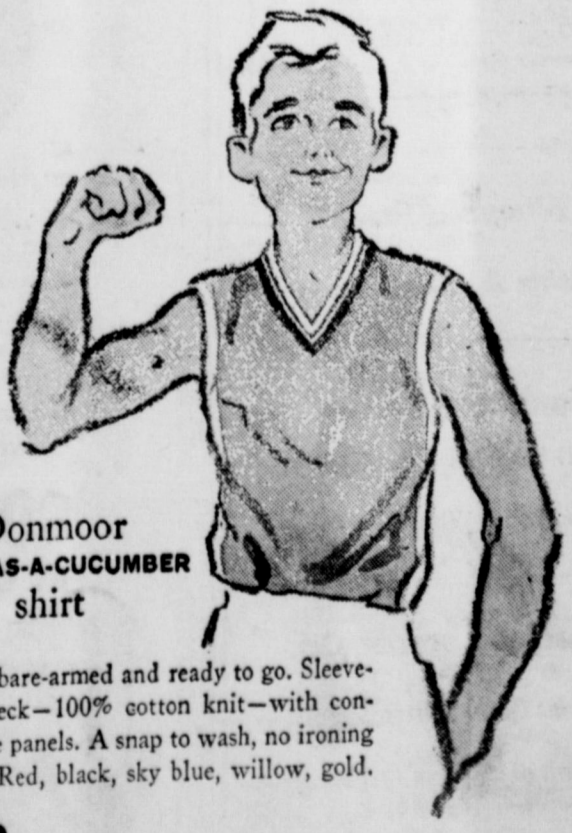

Rural Carrier To Distribute Survey Cards

Postmaster Virgil Jamison, Jr. reminds rural patrons of the Wheeler Post Office to be on the lookout for June Livestock Survey cards. Next week, mail carriers will leave survey cards in a sample of boxes along their routes.

“USDA bases livestock and poultry estimates on replies to this survey,” Mr. Jamison explains. “It is important for everyone who gets a card to fill it out and return it to the carrier. This way, USDA gets a true sample of the area's livestock and poultry holdings.”

Carrier assisting with the survey will be William A. Goad, Jr., RT 1. Survey cards will be forwarded to Cary D. Palmer, State Agricultural Statistician in Austin. After adding and analyzing these cards, U.S.D.A. statisticians are able to estimate the State's milk production, calf and pig crops and the number of pullets and hens.

Information from this survey will guide livestock and poultry in making important decisions,” Mr. Jamison concludes.

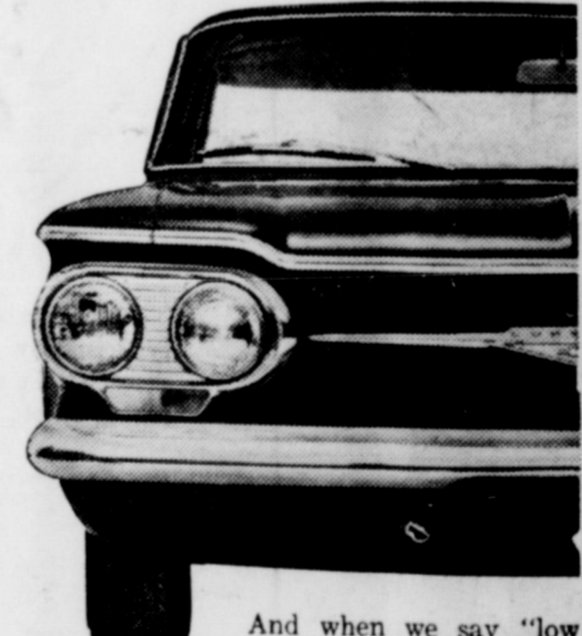

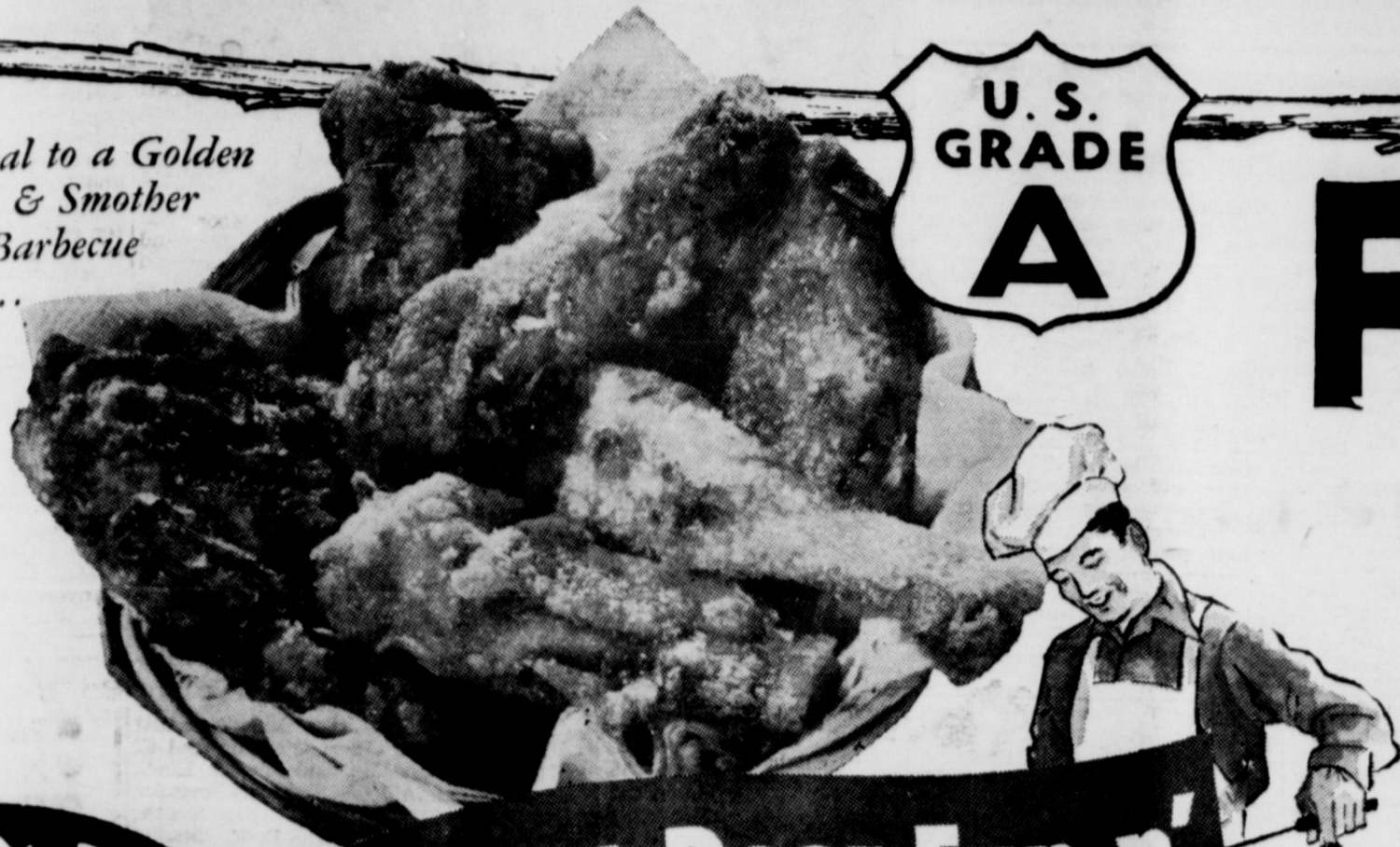
