Accidents Investigated By The Highway Patrol In Surrounding Area

The Highway Patrol investigated three rural accidents in Wheeler County during the month of November according to Sergeant J. W. Wilson, Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These wrecks accounted for one person injured and an estimated property damage of \$1,600.00.

The rural traffic accident summary for Wheeler County from January through November 1962 shows a total of 69 crashes. As a result of these crashes there was one person killed and 45 persons injured. The estimated property damage amounted to \$41,435.00.

Traffic wise, December is traditionally the most dangerous month of the year.

New social security tax rates go into effect on January 1, 1963, according to Hal Geldon, district manager of the Amarillo Social Security office.

This is one of the regular tax increases, provided in the law, to cover the payment of retirement, survivors and disability benefits, and all administrative costs of the program.

For people working for wages, the new 1963 rate will be 3-5/8% on their first \$4800 in yearly earnings. The employer will contribute a like amount. For the self-employed, the new rate is 5-4/8% of the first \$4800 in yearly net earnings. Wages and self-employment earnings of more than \$4800 a year are not taxable for social security purposes.

Geldon noted that the new social security tax rate applies only to wages paid and self-employment income earned after December 31, 1962.

The present rate of 3-1/8% on wages is applicable for wages paid in 1962 even though they are not reported by employers until early 1963. The current rate of 4-5/8% for the self-employed is likewise applicable to self-employment income earned in 1962 but not reported until 1963.

ACCIDENT KILLS 19 YEAR OLD MAN

Donald Leo Carey, 19 of Amarillo, died about 6:30 p.m. Monday as the result of injuries suffered when a truck his father was driving accidentally ran over him on the Trout farm five miles northwest of Mobeette.

The youth had gone to the farm with his father, Melvin Carvey, an employee of the J. M. Tindall Gin and Oil Mill, to help unload cottonseed cake. He was guiding his father who was driving the truck slowly backward before unloading the feed. One of the sacks of cake started to fall from the truck and the youth ran to catch the feed which knocked him under the wheels of the truck.

He died in an ambulance on the way to a Wheeler doctor.

Carey was born June 4, 1943 in Veedersburg, Ind., and had lived in Twitty and Shamrock for three years prior to moving to Amarillo. In Amarillo he was employed by the Memorial Park Cemetery.

Survivors include his wife, June, and a son, Donald Eugene; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Carey of Twitty; five brothers, Cecil L. of the U. S. Army in Germany, Virgil Wayne of Indiana, Charles L., Jackie Lee and Fred all of Twitty; three sisters, Manila Pearl, Sharon and Karen, all of Twitty.

He attended Kelton Schools and was a member of the Church of Christ. He was married to Karen Christie Dec. 20, 1952 at Borger.

High School Seniors Are Eligible; 400 Four-Year Scholarships Each Year

Senior students at Wheeler high school are eligible to apply for nearly 400 four-year scholarships offered by General Motors at more than 200 colleges and universities. There is no restriction on course of study or career. Stipends range from an honorary award of \$200 to a maximum of \$2,000 per year, depending on demonstrated need.

Participating colleges have full discretion in the awarding of the scholarships. Their scholarship committees review the applicants' high school academic records, available entrance test score, participation in extra-curricular activities and leadership traits. Interested persons should write to the directors of admission at any of the participating colleges.

Any secondary school senior or graduate who is a citizen of the United States is eligible for consideration. The initial awards are made to entering freshmen and are continued through the normal four undergraduate years for those with satisfactory records.

The participating institutions include 131 private and 173 public colleges and universities in 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico.

Fort Worth, (Special) — The Wheeler County Riding Club has been invited by F. M. Dougherty, Stock Show vice-president and parade chairman, to participate in the opening parade of the 1963 Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show.

The all-western parade through downtown Fort Worth will start at 2 p.m. Friday, January 25. The Southwestern Exposition will wind up its 10-day run Sunday, Feb. 3.

More than 10,000 head of livestock will vie for honors at the nation's oldest livestock show, founded in 1896. There'll be eight breeds of swine, 10 of sheep and 12 of cattle on exhibit.

WHEELER COUNTY Soil Conservation News . . .

The terracing season seems to be upon us again. With the cotton being rapidly taken from the fields farmers are thinking about protecting their fields from washing.

In the last few days terrace lines have been laid out on the H. B. Krug and G. B. Sloss farms. A couple of diversion terraces have been completed on the E. R. Errington farm.

Several other farmers have expressed their intent to terrace their fields. All of the above terraces and diversions are to be installed through the Great Plains program.

The Great Plains program is going strong at the present. Contracts are being worked up on the N. D. Ware Jr. and R. H. Lacy

farms N. D. plans to install some terraces, a diversion terrace and a waterway. He will also do some range seeding.

R. H. Lacy plans to sod some Midland Bermuda grass & irrigate it. He will also seed some switchgrass.

Bill Godwin of Mobeetie plans to revise his Great Plains contract to include about four acres of wildlife food and cover plants. He will be building some terraces soon under the Great Plains program.

The Soil Conservation District plan on the Zack Miller farm was recently revised. He has a water problem that needs fixing. A couple of deep gullies are being shaped on the E. R. Errington farm at Kelton. These gullies will be seeded back to grass.

AGRICULTURAL AGENT'S NOTES

County Agent
By CHARLES JACKSON

Although Wheeler County is not in the area where sterile screw-worm flies are currently being dispersed, farmers and ranchers in this country are still deriving the benefits of the Southwest Screw-worm Eradication Program.

A number of local livestock producers have expressed the feeling that they have contributed or are being asked to contribute to a program in which they are getting none of the results. This is not the case he says.

Sterile flies are being dispersed in the 80,000 square miles of Texas and New Mexico where native screwworms normally spend the winter, while winter temperatures are expected to kill them out east side of the overwintering area. In all but a few abnormal years, screwworms do not overwinter in Wheeler County.

You could disperse millions of sterile flies in this country, but you wouldn't accomplish a thing if

you didn't eradicate them in the "incubator" of southern Texas and Southwestern New Mexico from which they can move into the northern areas each spring. "I have said if sterile flies had not had been released in the southern part of the state this past year, the screwworm infestations experienced in this country would have been many times more numerous than they were."

Farm-accident fatalities are not declining in proportion to the decline in farm population, according to studies made by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In calling attention to the report, the Texas Farm and Ranch Safety Council said, "We can no longer take safety for granted because the ever-increasing use of machinery, electricity, chemicals and other labor saving devices and materials make training in safety a must for farm people. The safety record of agriculture can stand a lot of improving and it is up to those in the industry to do something about it."
