

The Great Plains Conservation Program now has funds available for new contracts. Funds are appriated on a fiscal year basis beginning July 1 each year. Fund for the year ending June 30 were exhausted before the end of the year and no new contracts could be made until after July 1.

Cost-sharing under the Great Plains program is made on most of the permanent type practices used in this District. Seeding pracics such a grass or cover cro at eighty per cent of the average cost. Earth moving practices such as terraces or diversions are costshared at seventy per cent of the average cost. Range practices such as cross fences, brush control of stock water development are cost shared at fifty per cent of the av-

The Wheeler District now ha thirty five active contracts with farmers and ranchers. Funds will allow for about twenty or thirty more during the next year.

Details of this program can be had by contacting the Soil Conservation Service personnel assisting the District.


