The family suggests memorials be to BSA Hospice in Amarillo; or a favorite charity.


Betty M. Pendleton, 62 Buried In Wheeler Thurs.

Wait Training To Be Introduced To Parents

Worth the Wait will sponsor a Parent Meeting at Wheeler Schools on Monday, January 8, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. The purpose will be to introduce curriculum to be implemented this semester in Wheeler. The curriculum, Wait Training, is designed to equip today's teens to postpone sexual activity, thus avoiding teen pregnancy. The speaker is National Wait Training Speaker and trainer, Shelly Donahue. Life skills such as communication, goal setting, relationships, and refusal skills are included in the curriculum. Parents and any adults interested in teens are strongly urged to attend.

Worth the Wait is a nonprofit educational organization created to address the problems associated with early teen sexual activity in the Texas Panhandle. Their goal is to delay the onset of teen sexual activity and thus reduce the incidence of teen pregnancy. Worth the Wait promotes abstinence until marriage (waiting until marriage for sex) from a health-care perspective with a strong emphasis on the physical, emotional, and social benefits from this lifestyle.



Texas became a Cowbelle state in 1972. When the Cowbelles changed their name to CattleWomen in 1986. the Texas CattleWomen embraced this more modern image and a new surge of membership and renewed interest in our goal of BEEF education and promotion took place.

Who are Texas CattleWomen today? We are women whose purpose is to maintain and build demand for BEEF products that satisfy consumer needs and wants to promote a positive image of the cattle industry. We are active in BEEF promotion, education and legislation. We serve as ambassadors of the BEEF industry and insure consumers that beef is safe and wholesome product. CattleWomen share a common interest in the BEEF industry. We share friendships and support each other during the challenges and successes that being involved in the beef industry presents. We are ranchers, teachers and industry affiliates. Owning a cow (or being married to a rancher) is not a requirement. Sharing a passion

for BEEF is. The Top O' Texas CattleWomen consists of a nine county area in the eastern Panhandle - Carson, Gray, Wheeler, Roberts, Lipscomb, Ochiltree, Hemphill and Collingswith

counties. The primary goal of Top O' Texas CattleWomen is to work to keep consumers informed of nutrition information related to beef. We serve as ambassadors of the Cattle Industry and insure consumers that beef is a safe and wholesome product. We work closely with Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers, The National Cattlemen's Association, The Texas Cattle Feeders, The Beef Industry Council and any independent CattleWomen's or Cattlemen's orga-

The number of people involved in the cattle business continues to shrink each year. 
