

# **Allison & Wheeler First Methodist Churches Revival Begins Thursday Eve.**

The First United Methodist Churches at Allison and Wheeler will conduct revival services beginning Thursday, September 7. The services tonight will begin at 7:00 P.M. at the Allison Church; the revival will continue at Allison on Friday and Saturday evenings. Services Sunday morning at Allison will be at 9:00 A.M. The revival is then moved to Wheeler at 11:00 A.M. Sunday and will continue at 7:30 Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

Evangelist will be Rev. Billy McCauley. McCauley is known for both his message and his music. His saxophone brings "a new sound to revivals and renewals.

When invited to a local congregation, Billy provides a blend of traditional and contemporary music with the saxophone and guitar, and he preaches uplifting sermons on renewal and Christian Growth.

The soprano sax, often called the trumpet of the common man, has a way of helping people let down their defenses, Billy says. "People who haven't been in church in a little while will come back," he adds. They'll come to a revival that's a little different."

McCauley has been a General Evangelist of the United Methodist Church for three years and a member of the Northwest Texas Annual Conference, He served local parishes for eight years.

"The call to evangelism was separate from my call to preach," Billy says. "I felt the Lord pushing me to use my music. I had set it down as a pastor."

## **New Arrival**

His interest in music dates back to ninth grade. "I was 125 pounds and had played football in junior high." He knew his football career was over, so he focused on the band. A friend let him borrow a tenor saxophone that had been stored in the attic. He later switched to the soprano sax and majored in music at Texas Tech.

Billy, who also uses the guitar in his performances, writes much of his own material. He recorded his first album in 1993, setting the Beatitudes to music in the title song, "Blest."

The move from pastoral work to faith ministry was a "scary step" for Billy, his wife, Mary Kay, and their three sons, Ben, Josh and Luke. But people have clearly been touched by the ministry of the man some people call "the Christian Kenny G."

Billy seems embarrassed to be compared with the popular musician. " dusted off my saxophone and the Lord has blessed it. He uses the saxophone as a way to open people's ears."

# **Britt Ranch Wins Texas CattleWomen's Award**

The Britt Ranch in Wheeler has won the Texas CattleWomen Environmental Stewardship Award for 1995. The award recognizes cattlemen and women whose natural resources stewardship practices contribute to the environment and enhance productivity and profitability.

Begun in 1913 by S. P. Britt, the ranch was run by his son, T. M. Britt, and is currently run by his grandson, David Britt. Presently, the Britt Ranch is leased to Cameron and Cameron in Goodnight, a company that runs a cow/calf operation with limits on numbers set by the Britt family.

The Britt Ranch's stewardship practices demonstrate its owners' conservation commitment to the land. Cross fencing allows pastures to rest more frequently, which increases grass coverage. The Britt Ranch has been recognized for its conservation efforts by the National Audibon Society and the Nature Conservancy.

The ranch's windmills supply water in pastures where surface water is not found. Also a dozen dams are built on the ranch that catch rainwater run-off and prevent erosion of low lying areas. Bluestem grass is combined by commercial seed companies for it's high quality seed. Wildlife on the Britt ranch is abundant with white tailed deer, quail, dove, turkey, prairie chickens and various freshwater fish and song birds. Hunting and fishing rights have never been leased.

The Britts are active locally in civic organizations and have been members of various industry organizations on national level. The ranch was chosen by Ohio State University decades ago as a place where crossbreeding experiments were first tried. David Britt currently serves on an agricultural committee for Texas A&M University and has served on Target 2000, also at Texas A&M. The ranch has also been active with the Demonstration Agents Office, conducting trials to determine the benefits of fertilization on native hay pastures. The Britts are an example of how Texas Ranchers can continue to product quality cattle and grass while practicing effective conservation efforts to protect the natural environment and wildlife with whom they share the land, a CattleWomen spokesperson said.



Stamford will remain the Association's headquarters. Member-borrowers will continue to be served from branch offices located in Abilene, Childress, Matador, Munday, Spur and Stamford as well as Canadian, Pampa, Perryton and Wheeler. No changes in staffing are anticipated as a result of the merger.


