## Track Team Takes Dist.

Although team events in the district 2-B track meet went exactly as expected yesterday, with Wheeler winning overwhelmingly, there were a number of startling upsets in individual

Probably the fastest Class 100-yard dash finish in area was recorded as Henry Lewis of Wheeler ran a tremendous 10.1, matching the fastest Class B time posted this year, edging. Big Ray Corcoran of Mobeetie, who ran a 10.2 and Wheeler's freshman flash, Little Bobby Vanpool, who was clocked in at 10.25. Lewis' time ties the district record established by Shayne Slovacek of Booker last vear.
