WHEELER MAN KILLED ON OIL RIG NEAR HERE

Leroy H. Church, 54, was killed around 8:00 a.m. Sunday, Dec. 20 at the No. 1 Well located 11 miles northwest of Wheeler.

The men were in the process of making drill stem tests. Pressure on the drill stem caused a piece of stem to blow apart. The pipe struck Mr. Church knocking him against something sharp and causing instant death.

Mr. Church was raised near Chickasha. He had been with Phillips for nearly 20 years and the couple had lived in Wheeler for one year, having moved here the last of January. They had lived in Wheeler previously only for a few months. Both times they lived in Wheeler, they had parked their trailer house at Don's Courts.

Burial will be at Chickasha. The services will be held at the funeral home on Wednesday, December 23, at 10:30 a.m.

He is survived by the wife, Anna Lue, of the home; one son of Chickasha and two grandchildren also of Chickasha.

FEEDER PIG STOLEN; 150 lb. FFA PROJECT

A feeder pig belonging to Dan Trimble was killed in the feed lot Saturday night or early Sunday morning. The hog was killed in the lot and a trail of blood led to the vehicle which carried him off for butchering.

Dan is a FFA member and had been feeding the pig for 3 months in preparation for the spring shows as his project in FFA. The lot was located 150 yards from the house, but the fam-

ily heard no commotion. The pig had been weighed Saturday morning and tipped the scales at 150 lbs. Dan reported that he had somewhere around \$30 worth of feed in the pig. Bus Dorman stated that due to the frozen ground, no tracks were found, but he personally is offering a \$10 reward for information leading to the capture of the thieves.

CO. AGENT REPORTS

This has been a poor year for range cows due to the drought conditions. Pastures have been short and cows have been unable to prepare themselves for the winter months. Thus livestock producers should be thinking in terms of how they can best supplement these cows to prevent future problems such as small weak calves, pneumonia, pink eye, and various other problems that arise when cows are suffering from poor nutrition.

Cows are most likely to be short on protein. This requirement can be met with 2 lbs of 41 percent, 3 lbs of 32 percent or 4 lbs of 20 percent protein. The main thing to consider is which one of these sources of protein is the most economical in your particular case. Every year the controversial question comes up as to which one of these you should feed. The major differences in these supplements is that the lower protein feeds have been diluted with energy such

as grain. For example 2 lbs of 41 percent meal and 2 lbs of grain would make 4 lbs of a 20 percent protein feed. Thus 2 lbs of a 20 percent protein feed would be the same as feeding 1 lb of 41 percent meal and 1 lb grain.

If you can do this cheaper than you can buy 20 percent protein supplement then this would be the most economical method of wintering your cows. Anytime a cow is not performing satisfactory on 2 lbs of a 41 percent protein feed, it is not due to protein shortage because you have met her protein requirement. Thus a livestock producer should not add more protein but most likely energy. A cow obtains her energy primarily from grass and when grass is not available then this energy should be supplied in the form of hay, bundles or grain. On an energy basis 1 lb of grain is equal to 3 lbs of hay. You can see that by far the cheapest source of energy is grain.

Another problem to watch for this year is vitamin A deficiency. Most cows have not had enough

green feed so that vitamin A could be stored for the winter months. If wheat pasture is not available, then vitamin A should be added to the protein supplement or it can be injected into the cow. Either method of supplementation is satisfactory.

Feel free to contact the County Extension office if further information is needed concerning wintering beef cows.

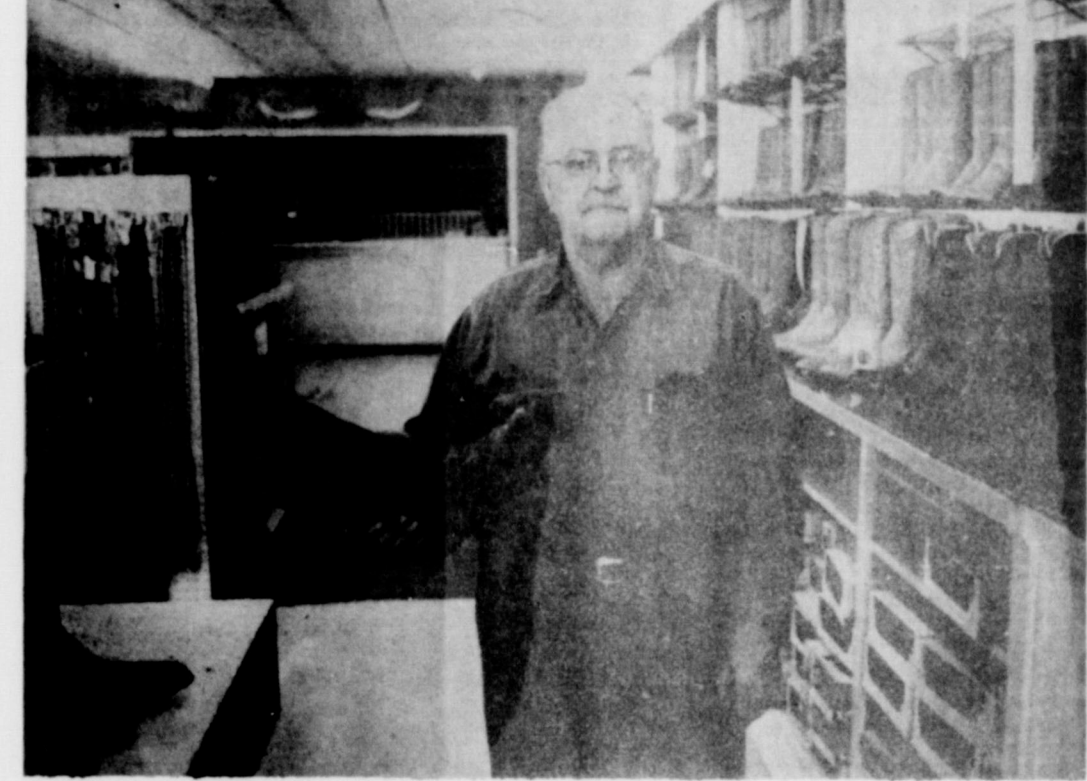

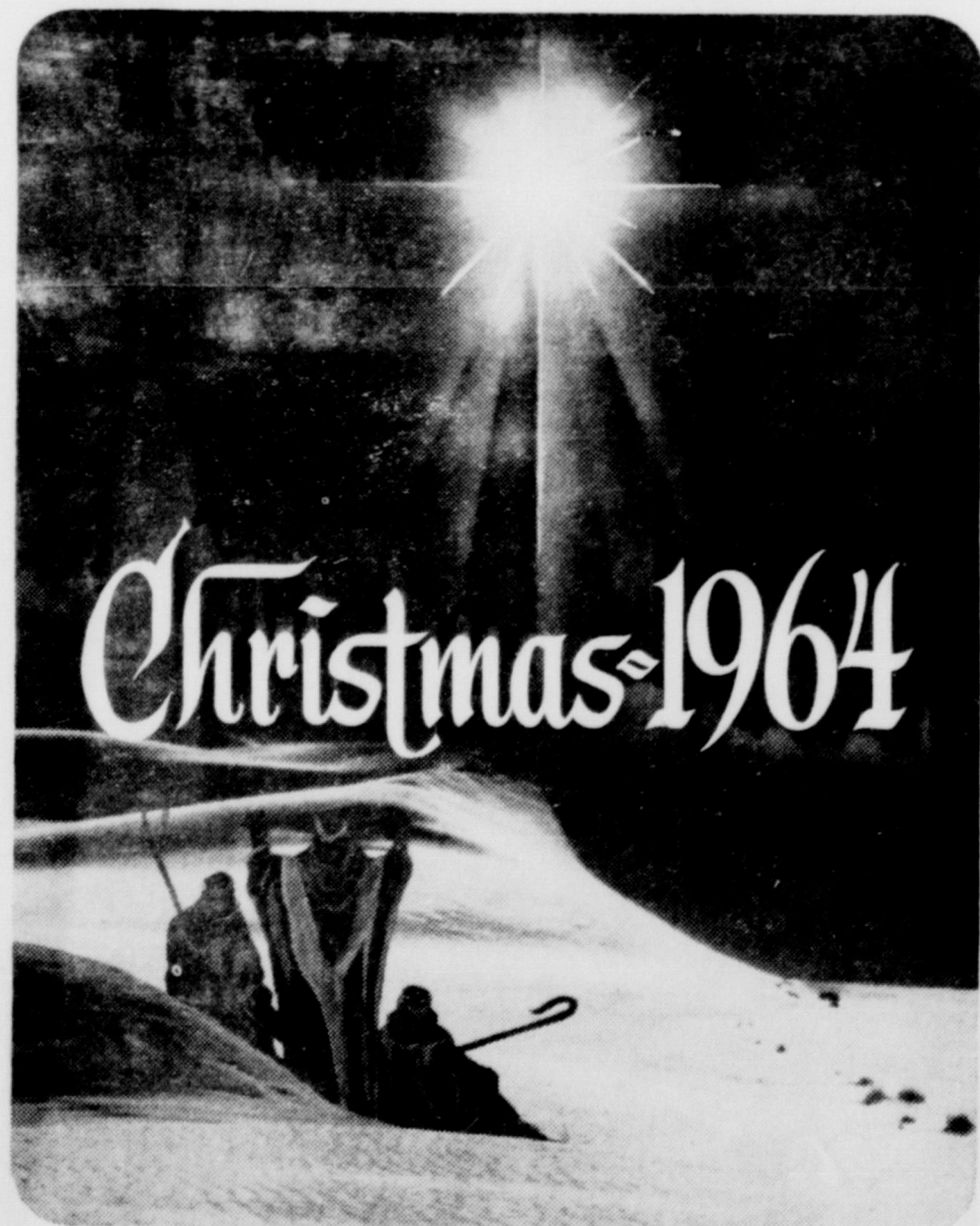
Dunn named to Honor Roll
