WHEELER MAN KILLED **ON OIL RIG NEAR HERE**

Leroy H. Church, 54, was killed around 8:00 a.m. Sunday, Dec. 20 at the No. 1 Well located 11 miles northwest of Wheeler.

The men were in the process of making drill stem tests. Pressure on the drill stem caused a piece of stem to blow a part. The pipe struck Mr. Church knocking him against something sharp and causing instant death.

Mr. Church was raised near Chickasha. He had been with Phillips for nearly 20 years and the couple had lived in Wheeler for one year, having moved here the last of January. They had lived in Wheeler previously only far a few months. Both times they lived in Wheeler, they had parked their trailor house at Don's

Burial will be at Chick. asha. The services will be held at the funeral home on Wednesday, December 23, at 10:30 a.m.

He is survived by the wife, Anna Lue, of the home; one son of Chickasha and two grandchildren also of Chickasha.






This has been a poor year for range cows due to the drouth conditions. Pastures have been short and cows have been unable to prepare themselves for the winter months. Thus livestock producers should be thinking in terms of how they can best supplement these cows to prevent future problems such as small weak calves, pneumonia, pink eye, and various other problems that arise when cows are suffering from poor nutrition.

Cows are most likely to be short on protein. This requirement can be met with 2 lbs of 41 percent, 3 lbs of 32 percent or 4 lbs of 20 percent protein. The main thing to consider is which one of these sources of protein is the most economical in your particular case. Every year the controversial question comes up as to which one of these you should feed. The major differences in these supplements is that the lower protein feeds have been diluted with energy such
