### FINSTERWALD-McCASLAND TAKE TOP HONORS AT COUNTY 4-H DRESS REVIEW

Miss Judy Finsterwald of the Briscoe 4-H Club and Miss Brenda McCasland of the Wheeler 4-H Club will represent Wheeler County at the District Dress Review in Amarillo on July 23rd. Both girls were high point winners in the Senior and Junior Divisions in the Wheeler County 4-H Dress Review which was held Thursday, July 2, in the Home Demonstration Office. Each of the girls held a total of 121 points out of a possible 125.

Twelve 4-H girls modeled and were judged for the garments they made themselves. Judges for the occasion were Mrs. Roberta Pugh, Co. Home Demonstration Agent of Lipscomb County and an adult leader from her county. Narrator for the girls as they modeled in review was Mrs. R.J. Holt, Jr. of Wheeler. In the absence of a County Home Demonstration Agent, Mrs. Jeff Puryear, Adult Leader of the Briscoe 4-H Club was in charge of the dress review. Construction of the garments was under the supervision of Adult Leaders. Prizes and ribbons were awarded 1st through 4th place and were furnished by the Home Demonstration Club Council. Wheeler takes on its annual festive appearance next Thursday afternoon, when the local Riding Club kicks off the Eighth Annual Rodeo Celebration with a parade through town. The wagon train from Pampa and Canadian will participate in the parade Thursday. Following the traditional event at 4 p.m. which will feature riders from here as well as other Panhandle Cities and Towns, all roads will lead east to the rodeo grounds where serving of the big free barbecue begins at 6 p.m. John Barr of Wheeler, "Barbecue King of the Panhandle", will prepare the barbecue, which is being sponsored by the Riding Club and Chamber of Commerce. Wheeler business people will serve the meal. Hundreds are expected here for the rodeo and related activities.

Rodeo performances will be held at 8 p.m. on July 9, 10, and 11, and a Kid Pony Show is scheduled for 7 p.m. on the final day of the celebration.

Producer of the rodeo will be Charley Plummer of Elk City, Oklahoma.

#### Seven Events

Included in the rodeo events will be bareback bronc riding, saddle bronc riding, calf roping, bull dogging, bull riding and ladies barrel race. Added

this year to the list of events is Heading and Healing which will be held the first night of the rodeo only and is open to a limited number of contestants. Contestants will compete in these events each night during the three-day rodeo. Admission will be \$1.25 for adults and 50c for children.

Wheeler Boot Shop is rodeo headquarters. Entries close at 3:00 p.m. Thursday and persons interested in competing should contact

the Wheeler Boot Shop. The telephone is 5471. Entry fee for each event is \$15. Added prize money will be offered in bareback bronc riding, saddle bronc riding, bulldogging and bull riding.

During the three day rodeo celebration, the Wheeler American Legion Post and Riding Club will hold a dance from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m. nightly at the Legion Hall. Playing for the dance will be Art Orth and his Country Gentlemen.

The Hospital Board for the North Wheeler County Hospital met Wednesday evening to approve the final working drawings for the new hospital.

The plans were approved by the board and were taken to Austin by the Architect, Gene Hollar for final approval by the State Health Department. The Department of Health gave preliminary approval of the plans some months ago.

Contractors may pick up copies of the plans at Gene Hollar's office at 512 W. Kingsmill in Pampa. Bids will be opened August 6 at 2:00 p.m. in the Commissioner's Courtroom in Wheeler.

The board voted to name the hospital "Parkview Hospital." An effort was made to include parts of the communities' names, but the group chose Parkview over the other suggestions.

It is estimated that construction of the new hospital will require six months.

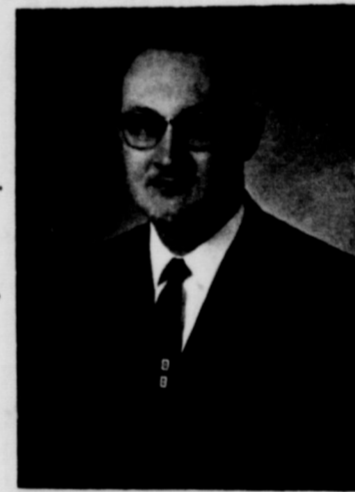

The total bonded indebtedness of the District is \$55,500. These bonds are the obligations made by the old Wheeler District during the 1930's and 1940's. The Kellerville District has no bonded indebtedness whatever and has not had any for the last several years.

The tax rate of \$1.35 per \$100 of assessed valuation is the same tax rate which Wheeler has had for several years. The Kellerville rate has been \$1.50, but when


