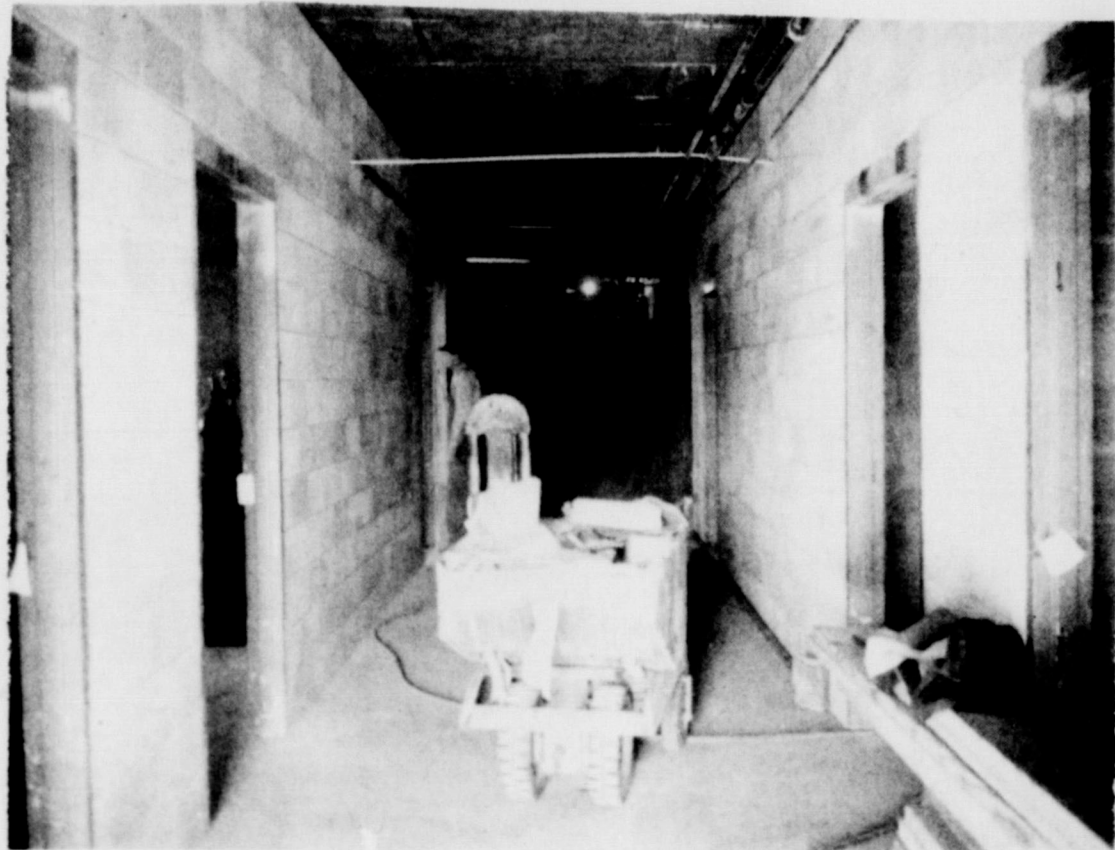

She is survived by three sons, Deward, Earl and Clint Wofford and one daughter, Reba Wofford, all of Wheeler.

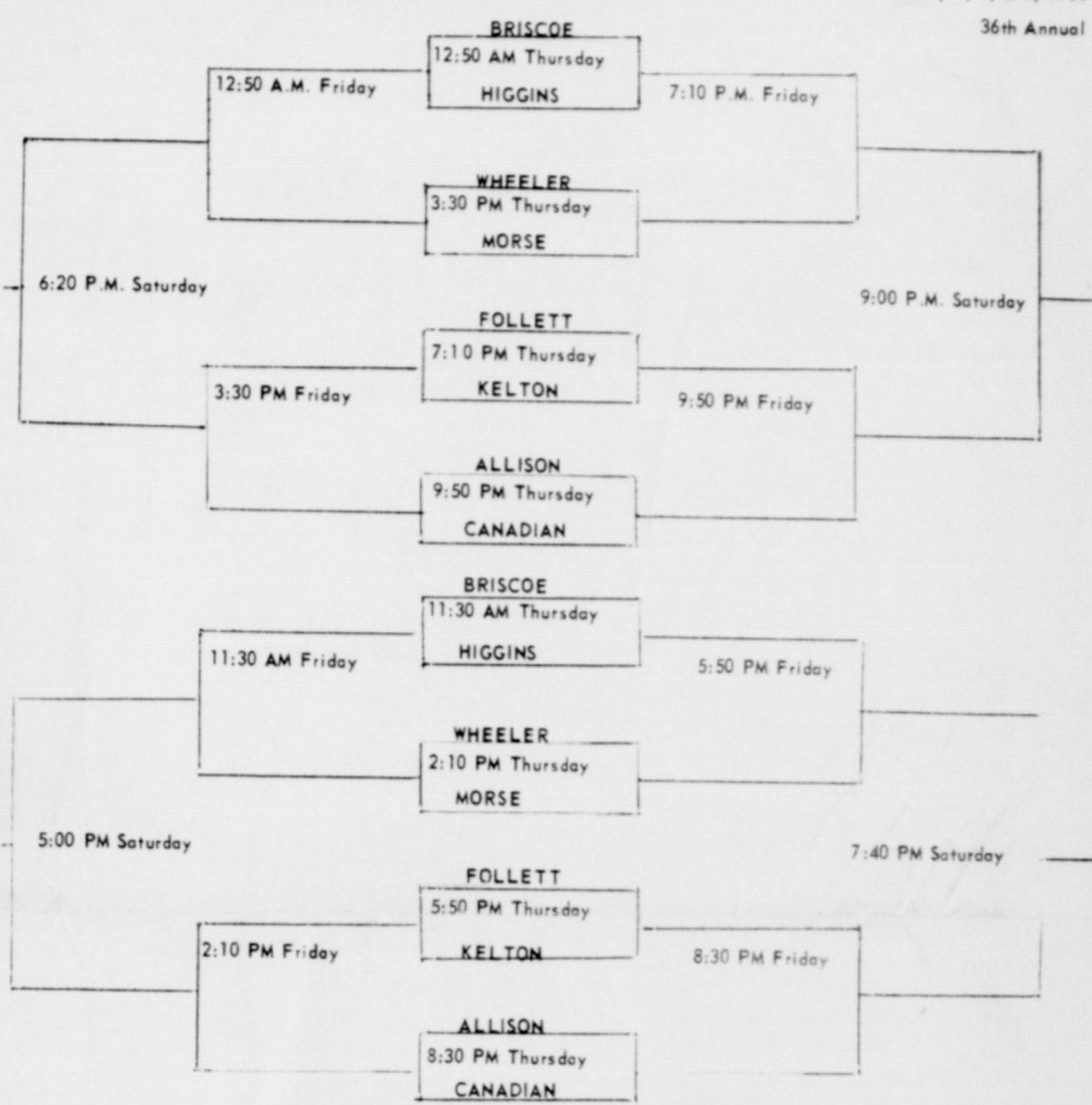
One son and her husband preceded her in death.
