



Examination of these leases to determine if they still fir the needs of a changing agricultural economy, is the purpose of a publication of the Texas agricultural Extension Service. Mp-677, Adapting Leases for Successful Farming, explains that a lease is a legal agreement where by both the tenant and the landlord can employ their resources for a fair return.

A lease is also like credit and can serve as a modified type of farm transfer. To fufill the purpose of a lease two requirements are important. First, income from products must be divided into portions equal to

each parties contributions to the production, harvest and sales process. And second, farm efficiency should be promoted by the provisions of the lease. Since young farmers can

not reasonably expect to obtain enough capital to set up an economical size farm unit, the lease is a means for him to stay in farming. With the price for farm machinery up 38 percent during the period from 1949-1959, and the price of farm real estate up 52 percent, young farmers face a real barrier to their ownerships of farms.


