'I'll give you four,' another countered. When the flurry of impromptu bidding hit \$5,000, one avid bidder blew the lid off. 'I'll give you whatever you want,' he shouted."

"What would you have done? Which offer would you have taken? In that pressured moment Bryan Johnson proved himself to be an extraordinary fellow with exceptional values.
