The screw worm fly has been eradicated from the southwest. But a barrier of live sterile flies must be maintained along the U. S. - Mexico border to prevent fertile flies from Mexico reinfesting the U. S. Approximately 100 million sterile flies will be needed each week during April and June. If funds are not available, the southwest stands to lose the gains that have already been made.

Charles D. Jackson, county agricultural agent, said in the three years the program has been in existence, savings of more than \$168 millions have been realized by producers. He said no screw worm infestation was detected in this county last year. Congress is considering a USDA request for \$5 million which would make the program financed entirely by the Federal government beginning July.

## Savings Bond Sales for Jan.

January savings bond sales Wheeler county totaled \$14,070. This announcement was made recently by Mr. R. J. Holt chairman of the Wheeler county savings bonds committee. This represents 7.4% of the 1965 goal of \$190,000. During January sales of series E&H bonds in Texas totaled \$14,311,691 or 9.3% of the states goal of \$152.8 million. In announcing the figures for the county, Mr. Holt pointed out that the rallying cry of this year's bond campaign is Practical Patriotism. The purchase of savings bonds is practical because it is easy and sure. It is patriotic because the purchase of bonds is a mark in the faith of our country and its future. Practical patriotism is just good common sense and I urge all the citizens of our country to buy bonds where they work or bank, Chairman Holt said.

The Opportunity Plan is a unique part-time program combining part-time employment and financial assistance for worthy students. The plan is specifically designed for students who possess ability, ambition and character and yet for financial reasons cannot attend college. The plan offers no free ride to an education, but is only for those who want to help themselves and have the courage to do so.

Since its inception by Milton Morris director of student financial aid and executive vice-president of Opportunity Plan, Inc. in 1954 the plan has aided 1480 students and virtually every town in the Panhandle has been represented by students using funds provided by the plan. The operation of the plan has proved so successful that Gov. John Connally recently sent an impressive state capital delegation to Canyon to take a first-hand look at Opportunity Plan, Inc.

Under the plan both long and short term loans are made after a 4 year college expense budget has been outlined by the student and Opportunity Plan officials. Students pay back their loan as they can, through employment while in school and after graduation and no interest is charged on the loan. In its eleven year history of aiding students the plan has lost only 2% of loans through non-payment.

Because of the Opportunity Plan Inc. West Texas State University needs no government financed loan program. The plan is financed by philanthropic contributors in the Panhandle area, both individual and group.

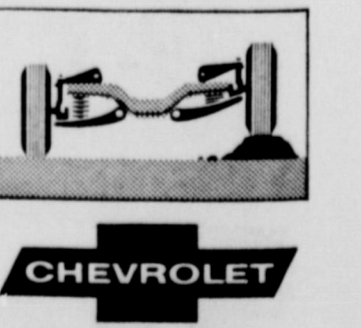

Many of you have read articles written by Dr. Bonsma in selection of animals for fertility.

The program will be held March 26 at the Bull Barn Hereford and will begin at 8:45 a.m. It should be concluded about 4:00 p.m.

Mr. L A Maddox Jr Animal Husbandman Texas Agri. Ext. Service will also appear on the program to discuss Selecting and Breeding cattle for functional efficiency.

Listed below is background information concerning the two speakers that will appear on the program.

Dr. Jan Bonsma--Professor in Animal Husbandry Pretoria University, Pretoria, South Africa. Since 1937 Dr. Bonsma has measured an average of 800 cows a year and has correlated the external measurements with a rating of the animal in fertility. Dr. Bonsma received undergraduate training in South Africa and took post graduate work in Iowa University under Dr. Jay Lush the very eminent geneticist at that University. He was a distinguished professor at Centennial Conference at the King Ranch in 1953. He has to his credit more than eighty publications on scientific subjects.

Dr. Bonsma is research officer in department of animal husbandry, South Africa mainly in charge of ranch research work. Personal field animal climatology and livestock ecology and fixing a new breed adapted to the sub-tropics "Bonsmara" named by the cattle farmers after Dr. Bonsma and Mara research station. At the present time, he is visiting Professor at Texas A&M filling a chair provided by the Worthman Foundation.
