Since its inception by Milton Morris director of student financial aid and executive vise-president of Op prtunity Plan, Inc. in 1954 the plan has aided 1480 students and virtually every town in the Panahndle has been represented by students using funds provided by the plan. The operation of the plan has proved so successful that Gov. John Connally recently sent an impressive state capital delegation to Canyon to take a first-hand look at Opportunity Plan, Inc.

Under the plan both long and short term loans are made after a 4 year college expense budget has been outlined by the student and Opportunity Plan officials. Students pay back their loan as they can, through employment while in school and after graduation and no interest is charged on the loan. In its eleven year history of aiding students the plan has lost only 2% of loans


