Up to 8 inches of rain has fallen in portions of Wheeler county during the first 9 days of June. The 8 inches fell the first four days of June. This is very close to the 7.6 reported by R J Smith northeast of Wheeler. Wheeler county's rainfall is stopping field work & in many cases will delay cotton planting for several weeks with weather forecasters predicting rain for Thursday.

Wheeler's warning siren has not sounded this year, however the fire men have been putting in a number of hours watching the storms in their cave on the west edge of town.
