Billy Jack Thompson and Wayne Harris of Shamrock Billy Thompson signed an affidavit June 10, 1966 to the effect that there was discussion during deliberation by the jurors, as to why Tommy Wall did not testify in his own behalf. Thompson was asked if he felt his aff-

ected the decision of the jury. He did not. Thompson further testified as to the standing of the

jury at different times during dei

deliberation. The point to this question was later brouaht out in the questioning of Sheriff Bus Dorman and Deputies Ramsey and Topper in an effort to determine how an accurate standing of the jury was reported at different times during deliberation. The defense made several efforts to show that a juror had been questioned on this matter. It was stated that the standing was overheard through the wall or door of the deliberation room and not obtained through a juror.

Thompson was asked if the jurors were of the opinion that they were deadlocked. The answer to the question was no.

Harris's testimony indicated that discussion was held concerning the fact that Mrs. Wall did not testify. Harris stated that he had not voted for conviction at the time of the discussion. It was pointed out by the court that in the selecting of the jurors they were asked if the defendent's not testifying would affect their decision.

The jurors were accepted on the basis that this would not be a factor in deciding the guilt or innocence of the defendant.

T.A. Wall, father of the defendant, was called to the stand. Wall stated Harris made a statement to him as to the judges feelings in the case. Wall testified Harris felt the jury was of the opinion that the judge thought

jurors in an effort to get the new trial.

Tommy Wall was arrested on December 9, 1965 and charged with the rape of an eleven year old girl. The defendant was tried May 18 and the jury returned a verdict of guilty May 19. The County ASC offices ---jury sentenced Wall to 71/2 years in the state peniten-

Notice of appeal was given. Bond is set at \$10,000. Wall will be held in the Wheeler County Jail until bond is posted or the case is reversed in the Court of Criminal Appeals.
