WHEELER BOYS PLACE SECOND IN MIAMI TOURN.

Wheeler boys brought home second place trophy in the Miami Tournament held over the weekend. Tuesday the boys were successful in their attempt to defeat Briscoe. Wheeler boys first two starts in the Miami Tournament were successful with Darrouzette standing their way of the first place trophy. The boys met Allison Thursday and dropped them 35-31. The game with Miami left the opponents 12 points behind, Wheeler 45, Miami 33. The Wheeler boys fell 10 points short of a victory in the game with Darrouzette. The score in the final game was Darrouzette 57, Wheeler 47.

Villard Hunter was recognized for his efforts in the tournament with the honor of being named to the All-Tournament team. Villard was high point man in two of the three games played in the tournament. He scored 15 points in the Allison game. In the final game he scored 25 points.

High point scorers in the game with Miami were Donald Rives 13 points and Den Gill with 14 points. Allison's Howard Lohberger scored 15 points in the game with Wheeler. Dan Collingsworth had 17 and Duke had 12 points in Darrouzette's game with Wheeler.

Coach Leldon Harrison was proud of the boys having placed second in the tournament. The Darrouzette team is tough competition. They are expected to quite ways this year. One of their defeated opponents is Channing,

a team headed for state. Wheeler girls met two teams in the Miami tournament and met with two defeats. Allison girls outscored Wheeler 16 points in a 32 to 16 game.

The Wheeler girls met defeat once again at the hands of the Bronettes with a 50 to 39 score. Sue Richerson made 23 points for the Mustangettes and Briscoe's Diane Dodd made 38 points in the game.

ELCETRONICS CLASS

Something new is being added to the spring schedule for prospective electronics students at Sayre Jr. Collee. A class for beginning students will start in January.

In past years, if a student wanted to start electronics, he had to wait until the fall semester, as the electronics course is offered in sequence. As it now stands, the new students can enroll in DC Circuits in the afternoon and Technical Algebra in the morning.

In addition to the electronic courses, the individual will complete his subject load by taking courses in the regular junior college curriculum.

"This is a trial program" according to Larry Farmer, Department Head. "We hope to be able to channel these students into the regular electronics curriculum at the end of their second semester." Farmer added. According to Farmer, the college hopes to attract two types of students to the mid-year program;

1. The older student such as the returning veteran who failed to enroll for the fall term and 2. The student who is a mid semester "pushout" from the four year colleges.

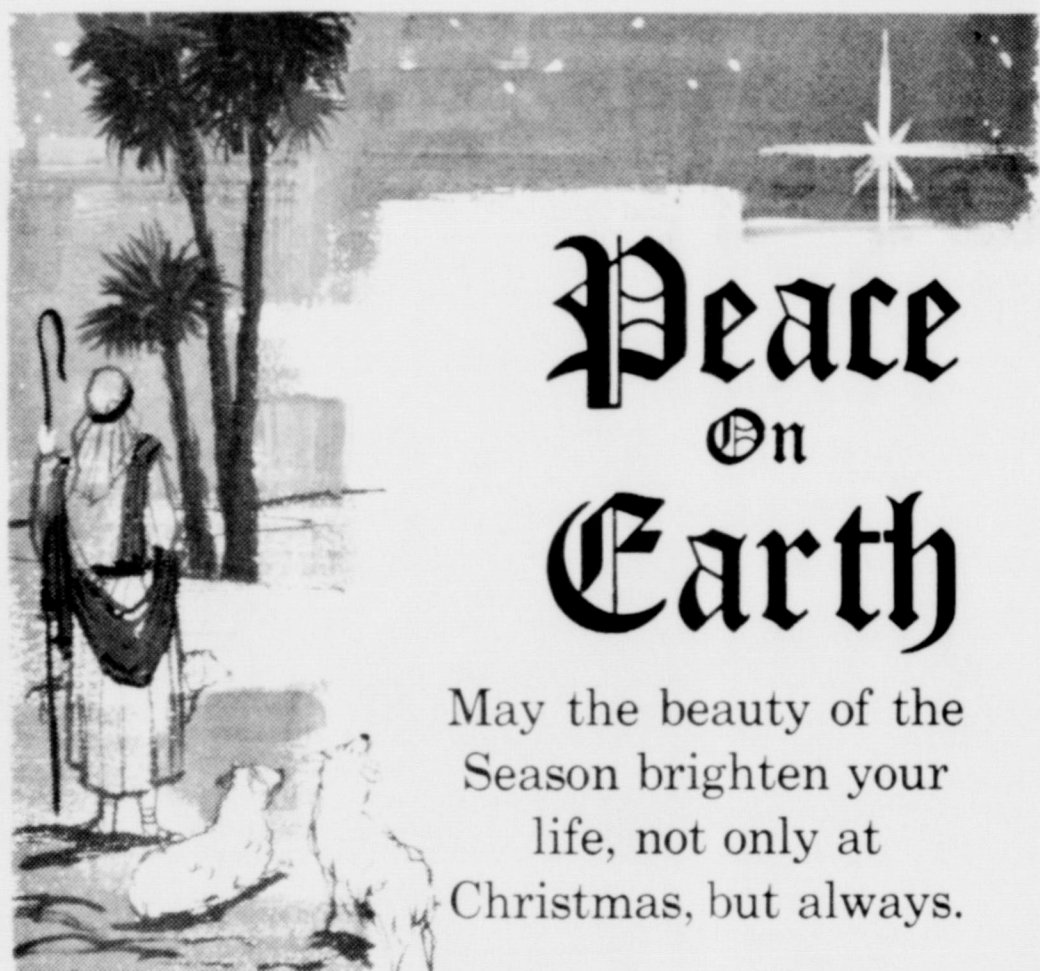

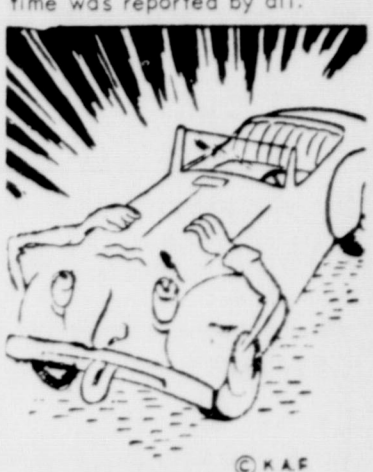

COOKING TURKEY

By Vivian Warminski

Do you ever have trouble cooking turkey to the right doneness? Most people have a tendency to over-cook their turkey. Here are some pointers on roasting and doneness tests.

Turkeys of any size may be roasted. Correct roasting is dry heat cooking at low temperature. It requires no water, no searing, no basting and no cover.

A roasting pan with a rack at least 1/2 inch high raises

the bird off the bottom of the pan, keeping it out of the juices and allowing the heat to circulate around the bird, roasting it evenly.

Always roast turkey done in one continuous cooking period. Low temperatures assure better flavor and appearance, less shrinkings and less loss of juices. Here are the simple steps:

1. Preheat oven to 325 d. F.
2. Rinse, drain and dry the bird. Rub cavity lightly with salt, if desired. Do not salt if bird is to be stuffed.
3. Place turkey breast side up on rack in shallow roasting pan. Brush skin with butter or fat. If a roast meat thermometer is to be used, insert it so that the bulb is in the center if of the inside thigh muscle or the thickest part of the breast meat. Be sure that the bulb does not touch bone.

4. Place in preheated oven. If desired, baste or brush occasionally with butter. When turkey is two-thirds done, cut cord or band of skin at tail to release the legs and permit the heat to reach the heavy-meated part.

Cover with a loose tent of aluminum foil or lay a fat-moistened cloth over the legs and breast to prevent excessive browning.

5. Roast until done. The only positive way to test doneness is with the use of a properly placed meat thermometer. Now, how long to cook? It is best to start the turkey 30-45 minutes ahead of schedule. If dinner is set for a definite hour, this avoids delay should the turkey take longer to cook than was estimated from the guide. And the extra time allows the meat to stand and absorb juices so the bird is easier to carve.

The timetable of roasting periods listed below are based on chilled or completely thawed turkeys at a temperature of about 40 degrees F. Time will be slightly less (1 to 3 minutes per pound) for unstuffed birds.

There is a substitute for a meat thermometer, placed in center of inside thigh muscle (or the thickest part of the breast.) When it registers 180-185 degrees F. the turkey is done. If the bird is stuffed, the point of the thermometer should be in the center of the stuffing and register 165 degrees F.

The traditional doneness test used by many experienced cooks is a feel test. Turkey is done when the thickest part of the drumstick feel very soft when pressed between protected fingers and the drumstick moves easily up and down as the leg joint gives readily or breaks.



Collecting Soil Samples

By Charles David Jackson
December is a good month for collecting and submitting soil samples for testing.

At the present time, samples are processed as soon as they arrive at the laboratory and test reports are mailed within ten days. This schedule should benefit you since prompt service is an important requirement for an effective testing soil device.

Sampling well in advance of planting offers the advantage of allowing time to obtain the fertilizer needed. In many instances, wet soil may be encountered during the winter and cause a delay in sampling, therefore, sampling now is advisable.

Shipping weights can be reduced by allowing the sample to dry a day or two at air temperature. Samples should not be heated since high temperatures cause potassium to be fixed in some soils in such a way that it cannot be removed by chemical procedures.

If reliable information is to be obtained from a soil test, it is necessary for the sample to be as nearly representative of the field on which information is desired as possible. To obtain a representative sample, a composite is made by obtaining a core or slice of soil from 10-15 spots in fields from 20 to 40 acres in size.

Pint boxes, mailing cartons, history sheets and instructions are available from the country agent's office. Instructions for sampling should be studied and followed as closely as possible.

I will be glad to go over these instructions with anyone interested, especially if this is your first experience in collecting soil samples.
