COMMENCEMENT FOR AREA SCHOOLS

Stock chairman is Russell Hull of Mobeetie. Mac Yarbrough of Shamrock will be announcer. Charlie Plummer of Elk City, Okla. will again furnish the stock for the show. Approximately twenty-five other 4-H leaders and friends from throughout Wheeler County will assist with the show and be in charge of the various events.

NASA's Program Educators Observe

John E. Penick of the University of Miami, was among more than 200 key Florida and Puerto Rican educators who attended a conference on NASA's space programs, held in Cocoa Beach, Fla.

Hal Mehrens, KSC Education specialist, said the purpose of the conference was to bring about a better understanding of the Nation's space programs as they relate to education.

Similar conferences for school administrators and physics teachers are being held at nine other NASA Centers across the country.
