## DIST. ATTORNEY WATERS WILL NOT BE CANDIDATE FOR RE-ELECTION

District Attorney Bill Waters announced Saturday that he will not be a candidate for re-election.

Waters was first elected District Attorney of the 31st Judicial District in 1954 and has served continuously in the office since January 1, 1955. He has held the office longer than any person in the history of the District. Prior to becoming District Attorney, Waters was County Attorney of Gray County for two terms. He was 25 years of age when first elected to public office in 1950, and upon completion of his present term, will have held public office for 18 consecutive years. The 31st Judicial District is composed of Gray, Wheeler, Roberts, Hemphill

and Lipscomb Counties. Waters is a past president of the state-wide Texas District & County Attorneys Association.

In announcing his decision, Waters stated: "I have thoroughly enjoyed my years in public office and deeply appreciate the opportunity of serving the people of this area. My decision not to run is greatly influenced by my desire to have more time for my family and my practice of law. Through the years, I have always appreciated the fine cooperation of all peace officers, the consideration of the courts and the willingness of citizens to serve on juries. I have been privileged and honored to hold this office of public trust."

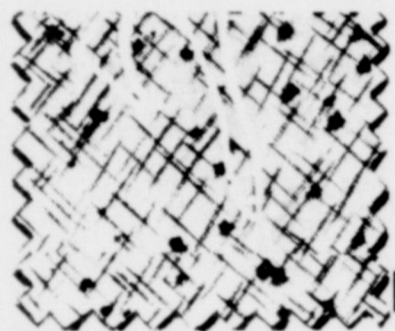

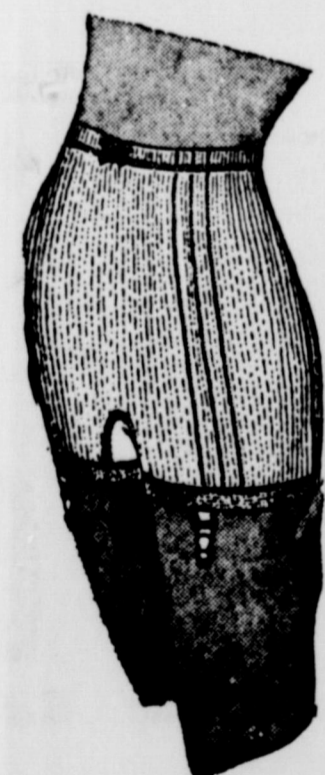

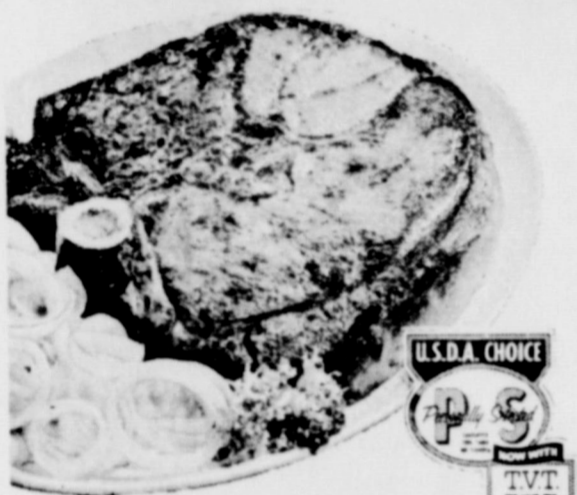
