COUNTY AGENT REPORTS

 Wheeler county swine producers should be encouraged to know that Atrophic rhinitis in swine is finally yielding to research efforts. This common swine disease has almost eliminated swine production in Wheeler county in recent years. According to Dr. W P Switzer in the Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association, the severe form of atrophic rhinitis is usually caused by a bacteria, Bordetella Bronchiseptica. The bacteria is susceptible to several drugs and he recommends treating infected droves by one of the following methods:
 1. Sulfamethazine added to the feed at the rate of 100 grams per ton of feed.
 2. Sulfathiazole added to the drinking water at the rate of 0.66 grams per gallon of water. This form of medication increases water consumption by one third so extra drinking facilities should be available.
 Young pigs with rhinitis should be treated by one of the above methods for four consecutive weeks. Infection in breeding stock can be controlled by treatment for two weeks.
 This information was obtained from recent Research Roundup information obtained from Dr. C M Patterson, extension Veterinarian.

Water Melon Diseases
 The watermelon plants that died on the R L (Bob) Stokes farm east of Shamrock on the Oklahoma line were affected by Fusarium wilt. This is a major disease of watermelons in Texas and takes heavy toll in some areas. Long crop rotations are most useful in controlling wilt. They are more effective when combined with resistant varieties. Charleston Gray is supposed to be resistant, but it is sometimes attracted by new strains of the fungus.

MRS. KIDD'S RECIPE FOR BAKED APPLE DONUTS
 1 1/2 cup sifted all purpose flour
 1 3/4 tsp. baking powder
 1/2 tsp. salt
 1/2 tsp. ground nutmeg
 1/2 cup sugar
 1/2 cup shortening
 1 egg, beaten
 1/4 cup milk
 1 cup grated raw apple
 1/2 cup melted butter or margarine
 1/2 cup sugar
 1 tsp. cinnamon
 Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, nutmeg and 1/2 cup sugar. Cut in shortening until mixture is fine. Mix together egg, milk and apple; add all at once to dry ingredients and mix quickly but thoroughly. Fill greased 2 1/2 x 1 1/4 inch muffin tins 2/3 full. Bake in 350 degree moderate oven 20 or 30 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from pans, immediately roll donuts in melted butter and then in cinnamon and sugar that have been mixed together. Serve warm.

4-H Texans Perform

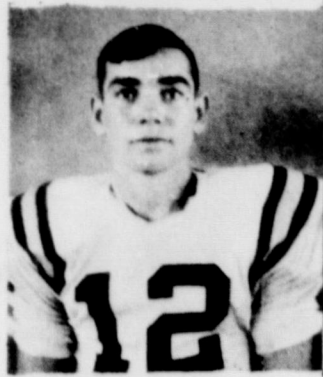
