

## FIRE DESTROYS DeWOLF HOME

Mr. and Mrs. Clint DeWolf returned home from Shamrock Wednesday, Jan. 8 to find their home on fire. The home and furnishings were totally destroyed

by the blaze; a loss estimated at \$30,000. The DeWolf home is located 18 miles east and 7 north of Wheeler.

The loss Wednesday evening was the second time the DeWolfs have lost their belongings in a fire. In 1969, a trailer home and contents were completely destroyed by fire.

When the DeWolfs arrived home at 8:45 p.m. flames had burned a hole in the roof approximately 3' across. Clint immediately grabbed the water hose and sent his wife for help. As he was about to control the blaze, the fire burned the line

from the house to the water pump. Without water, DeWolf could only watch the structure burn.

Wheeler and Erick, Okla., fire departments answered the call but were unable to save the structure.

It is believed the fire was caused from an electrical short, as the fire started above the brake box by the back door.

DeWolf, a retired brick mason, built the 35' x 60' structure in 1969 after

their trailer home was destroyed at the same location. He plans to clear the site, rent a trailer home and rebuild.

### Other Fires

The Wheeler Fire Department was called Saturday evening to a fire at the Kelson Gin. The burn pile was burning.

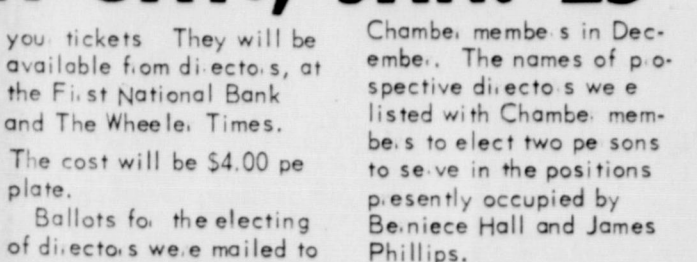

Herbert A. Eisenmenger, 74, a longtime Mobeetie farmer, died Monday of an apparent heart attack.

Funeral services were held Wednesday, Jan. 15, 1975 at 2:30 p.m. at First Baptist Church, Mobeetie. With Rev. Allen Hale, officiating. Burial was in the Mobeetie Cemetery under the direction of Wright Funeral Home at Wheeler.

Mr. Eisenmenger was found dead late Monday on a Kelson farm where he had been working.

Mr. Eisenmenger, born at Roundtop, Texas, April 18, 1900.

Mr. Eisenmenger moved to Mobeetie at the age of 8 after the death of his parents. He was raised and made his home with Mr. and Mrs. Herman Eisenmenger at that time.

He had lived in Mobeetie for 66 years and had been a farmer all of his life. He was a veteran of World War II.
