Defensive Driving Course

The Wheeler Kiwanis Club will sponsor a Defensive Driving Course in February. Persons taking and passing the course taught by the Department of Public Safety will receive a reduction in the cost of their auto insurance. The eight hour course will be offered Feb. 10, 13 and 14 in the school cafeteria at a cost of \$3 per person. Classes will be 7-10 p.m. Monday and Thursday and 7-9 p.m. Friday evening. Coffee and drinks will be furnished for the students.

Those interested in taking the course are asked to pre-register. Registration is possible by contacting the Wheeler Veterinary Clinic at 826-5821. A 10% reduction in auto insurance will be given each driver passing the course. The reduction will apply to collision and liability; it does not apply to comprehensive. A driver will receive the reduction on only one vehicle where there are two licensed drivers in the family. It will be necessary to attend all three sessions.

COINS ON SALE FEB. 15

The Wheeler County Centennial, U.S. Bicentennial Commemorative Medals will go on sale at The Four Wheeler County Banks on February 15, 1975. The medals will be on sale at the First National Bank and Farmers Merchants State Bank in Shamrock, The First State Bank in Mobeetie and First National Bank in Wheeler. To order by telephone or mail contact Harry Clay in Shamrock, Melvin May in Mobeetie and Adrian Risner in Wheeler. The profit from the sale of these medals will be used solely in the restoration of Old Town Mobeetie.

The Wheeler County Bicentennial side has great historical significance in that it depicts Fort Elliott near Mobeetie, Texas. Reverse side denotes the development of the Panhandle.

The medals are mented in Gold Electroplated .999 Fine Silver, .999 Fine Silver, Antique Silver, and Antique Bronze.

The medals will be on sale in the following manner: **25 Sets of 4 Medals** of each type of metal in an attractive plastic case. These sets are numbered 1 thru 25 and sells at \$100.00 per set. 25 sets available in the 4 medal set.

3 Medal sets consisting of the .999 fine silver, antique silver, and antique bronze medals in an attractive plastic case. These sets are numbered 26 thru 50 and sell for \$35.00 per set. 25 sets available in the 3 medal set.

2 Medal sets consisting of the antique silver, and antique bronze medals in an attractive plastic case. These sets are numbered 51 thru 100 and sells for \$10.00 per set. 50 sets available in the 2 medal sets.

25 Gold Plated Silver Medals numbered 26 thru 50 in an attractive plastic case. These single Gold plated medals sell for \$50.00 each.

75 .999 fine Silver Medals numbered 51 thru 125 at \$25.00 per medal.

400 Antique Silver medals numbered 101 thru 500 at \$5.00 per medal.

400 Antique Bronze medals numbered 101 thru 500 at \$3.50 per medal.

500 Unnumbered antique silver medals at \$4.00 per medal.

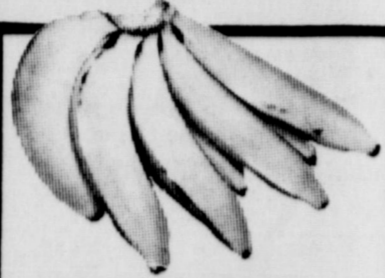

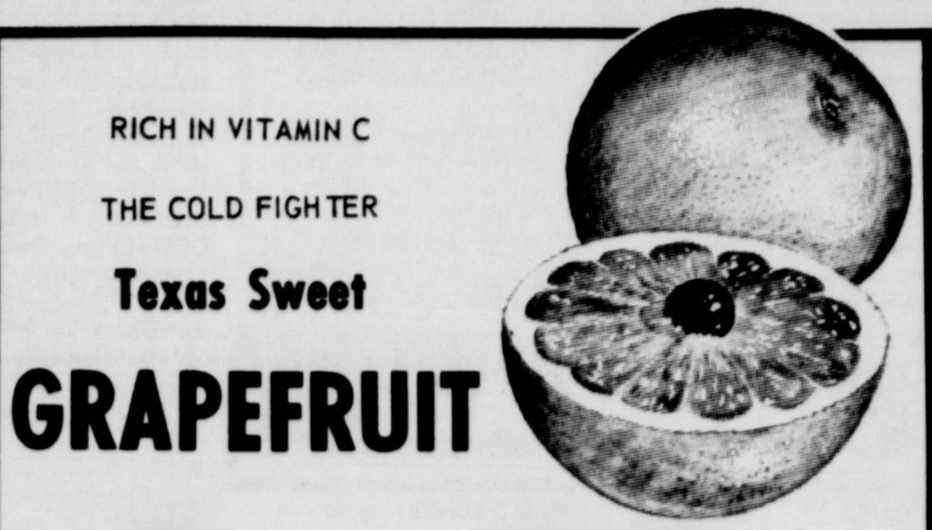

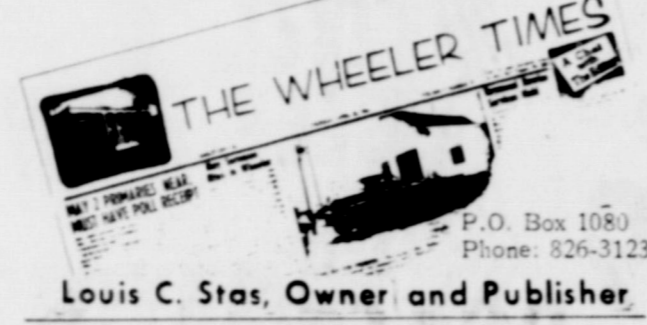

LINES FROM LINDA

By Linda Horton, Asst. County Extension Agent

There is a great deal of interest shown by homemakers today in a recipe from the past-sourdough. Sourdough biscuits were an essential part of the cowboys menu along with a thick steak and strong coffee. A sourdough starter and other sourdough favorites.

Here are some recipes for sourdough starter and other sourdough favorites.

SOURDOUGH STARTER

Put the following in a large bowl (never metal):

- 2 cups warm potato water (saved from cooking peeled potatoes)
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 3/4 cups sifted flour

Mix well. Cover and set bowl in a warm, draft free spot. Allow the starter to work 12 to 24 hours before using it in your recipes. Makes 2 cups. A 12 hour starter gives a milder flavor and is more lively than a 24 or 36 hour starter.

HOW TO FEED THE STARTER

Add to the original starter which was left in the bowl.

- 3/4 cup warm water
- 1 1/2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 7/8 cup flour

Set bowl in a warm spot to work. After 3 or 4 hours you can then store it (covered) in the refrigerator.

SOURDOUGH BISCUITS

Sift into a bowl:

- 1 cup unsifted flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

Add:

- 1/2 cup warm milk
- 1 cup sourdough starter

Mix well and turn onto floured board to knead eight or ten times. The dough should be spongy and slightly sticky. Pinch off a piece of dough, form a biscuit and place in greased pan. (Turn each one so that top is glazed) set in warm place 20 to 30 minutes. Bake in 400 degree oven about 25 min.

SOURDOUGH FLAPJACKS

Measure into bowl:

- 1 cup starter
- 1/2 cup warm milk (estimated)
- 1 tablespoon melted shortening
- 1 beaten egg

Mix well.

Sift together and add to liquid:

- 3/4 cup unsifted flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon soda

Beat until light. Cook till golden brown on a hot greased skillet.

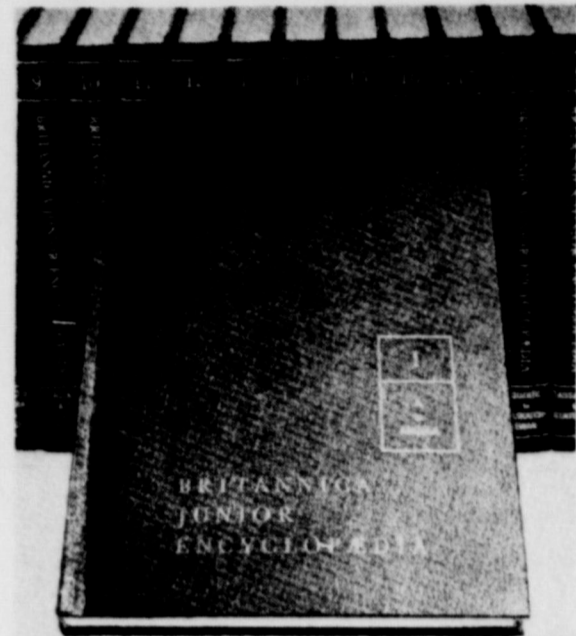

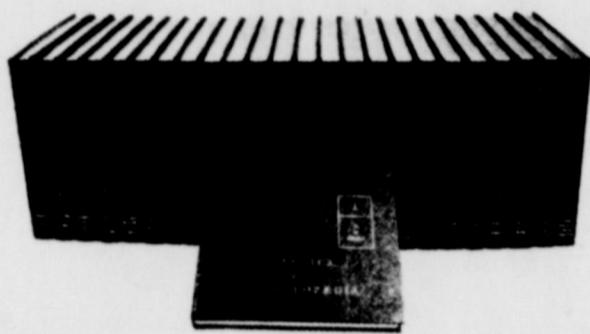
