of Wheeler.

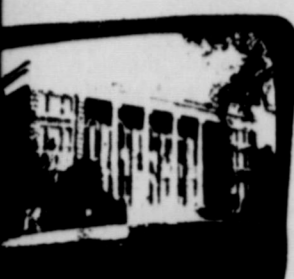

Pig Show Results & Sale

The dedication of the Wheeler County Show Barn was held Monday evening, February 24, followed by the sale of pigs exhibited at the 4-H and FFA Calf and Pig Show.

A crowd of 800 was served free barbecue by Beta Sigma Phi Sorority. The meal was furnished by May I Insurance of Mobeetie, Thurman Rives Insurance of Wheeler, John C. Vise Insurance of Wheeler, Richardson of Wheeler, Webb Livestock Auction of Sayre, Okla., Western Oklahoma Livestock Inc., of Elk City, Lancaster Dept. Store and the Wheeler County Agriculture Commission.

The 100' x 125' structure was just completed and is the result of a cooperative effort of the County of Wheeler to offer the youth of Wheeler county a place to exhibit their projects of 4-H and FFA. A total of 22,500 was raised through donations and \$40,000 was provided by the Commissioners Court. The committee is still in need of \$10,000 in funds.

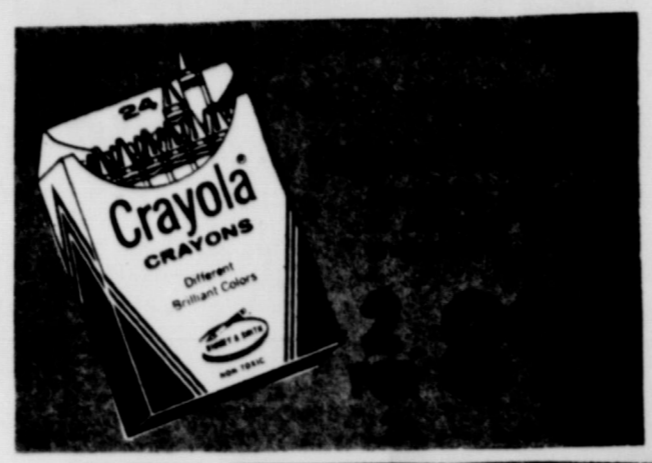

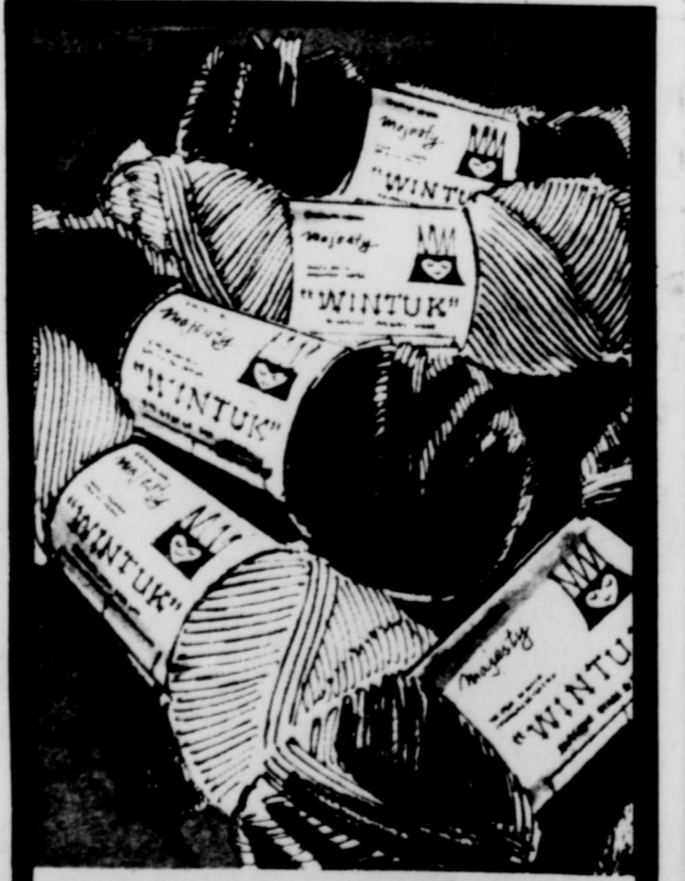

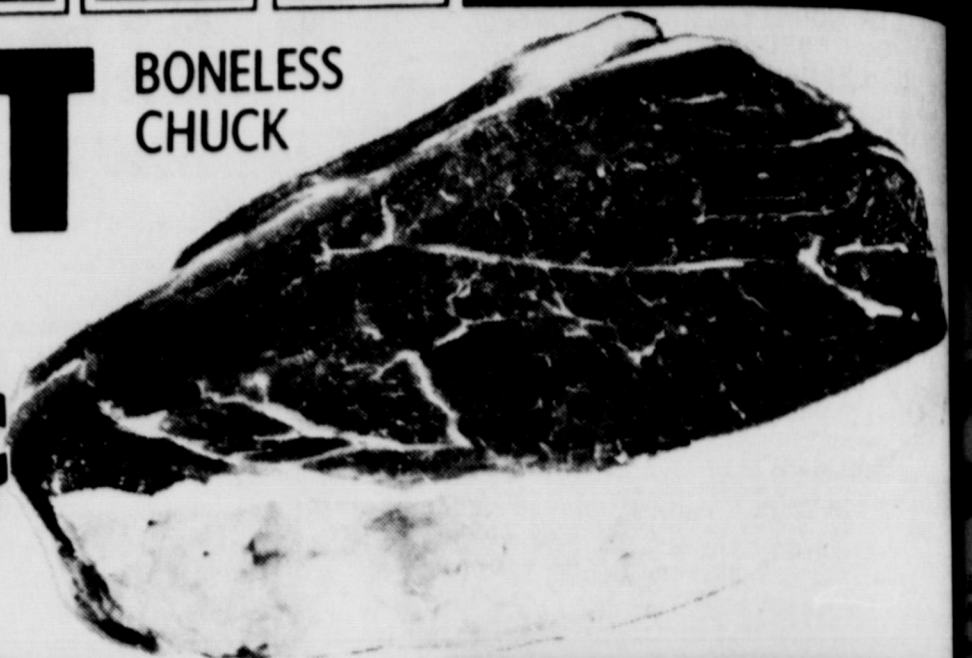
