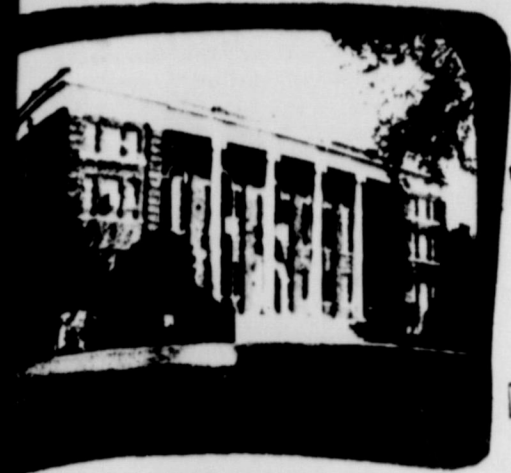

Two thousand people were served barbecue Thursday evening prior to the first performance of the annual Wheeler Rodeo. The barbecue was made possible through the donations of merchants and individuals and the Wheeler Riding Club.

City Council Has Monthly Meeting

The City Council met Monday, July 17 at the City Office. Earl Barnes, fire chief, met with the council.

Ten new fire helmets and bags purchased by the council had been received and were on display by the fire chief. The helmets are well insulated and padded and have a face shield.

The council agreed to purchase a hydraulic threader for use in the water department. In case of a break in the water lines, this could make a difference in the length of time the water was off, according to water superintendent, Bill Golden.

The Wheeler Chamber of Commerce and Riding Club served the barbecue. The serving line opened at 6:00. 1531 lbs of beef were served in generous amounts along with 150 lbs. of beans, 12 gal. pickles, 12 gal. barbecue sauce and 75 lbs. of onions. Apple sauce and/or peaches were also served.

Meads furnished 85 loaves of bread for the event.

An undetermined amount of iced tea and coffee were consumed at the barbecue.

Thursday evening marked the beginning of the 17th annual rodeo and the 14th annual barbecue.

RESOLUTION AND ORDER CALLING 30ND ELECTION
THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTIES OF WHEELER AND GRAY
WHEELER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the WHEELER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT has heretofore adopted the provisions of Article 2784e-1, V.A.T.C.S., at an election held on the 29th day of May, 1965; and,

WHEREAS, this Board of Trustees deems it advisable to call the bond election hereinafter ordered; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF WHEELER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:
SECTION 1: That said election shall be held on the 8th day of August, 1972, at the SCHOOL CAFETERIA, Wheeler, Texas, and the entire District shall constitute one election precinct for said election.

SECTION 2: That the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of the election: HAROLD KENNEDY, Presiding Judge B.K. BARHAM, Alternate Presiding Judge

The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two nor more than ten qualified clerks to serve and assist in holding said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge herein appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of the clerks.

On election day the polls shall be open from 8:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

CLARA MARSHALL is hereby appointed as the Clerk for absentee voting for said election, and the SCHOOL BUSINESS OFFICE in said District, Wheeler, Texas, is hereby designated as the place at which absentee voting shall be conducted for said election. For the period absentee voting is permitted by law, the hours designated for absentee voting shall be from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. on each day except Saturdays, Sundays and official State holidays.

SECTION 3: That at said election the following proposition shall be submitted:

"SHALL the Board of Trustees of the WHEELER INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT of Wheeler and Gray Counties, Texas, be authorized and empowered to issue the bonds of said District to the amount of ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) for school building purposes, to wit: the construction and equipment of school buildings in the District and the purchase of the necessary sites therefor, and shall there be pledged and levied assessed and collected annually ad valorem taxes on all taxable property in the District sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as the same become due, said bonds to be issued in one or more series or issues to mature serially or otherwise not more than FORTY (40) years from their date, and to bear interest at such rate or rates as in its discretion the Board of Trustees shall determine?"

SECTION 4: That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with V.A.T.S. Election Code, so as to permit the electors to vote 'FOR' or 'AGAINST' the aforesaid propositions which shall be set forth in substantially the following form:

"THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS AND THE LEVYING OF THE TAX IN PAYMENT

The word "FOR" and beneath it the word "AGAINST" shall be made to appear on the left of the proposition. A square shall be printed on the left of each of the words "FOR" and "AGAINST", and each elector shall place an "X" in the square beside the statement indicating the way he wishes to vote.
SECTION 5: All resident qualified electors of the District, including those who own taxable

property in said District and who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall be permitted to vote at said election. At said election two separate ballot boxes shall be provided at each polling place. In one box only resident qualified electors who own taxable property and who have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be allowed to vote. In another box all resident qualified electors (who are otherwise qualified but do not

own taxable property which has been duly rendered for taxation) shall be allowed to vote. The votes cast in each of said boxes shall be recorded, returned and canvassed in such manner as will reflect separately the votes cast by the qualified electors who own taxable property and who have daily rendered the same for taxation (including those who own taxable property and who have duly rendered the same for taxation).
SECTION 6: A substantial copy of this resolution and order shall serve as proper notice of said election and said notice shall be published one

time at least ten (10) days prior to the date for the election in a newspaper of general circulation in the District.
