## BOND ELECTION IS SET FOR WHEELER

An election has been called for residents of the Wheeler Independent School District to decide the fate of a proposed \$150,000 Campus Development project.

The project calls for site preparation which would divide the school campus into four levels. The school property drops 100 feet from the Southwest corner to the Northeast corner. The plan proposes to divide the property into four level plains and put a drain running full length of the campus and carrying the runoff from each level.

The first level will be used for parking and tennis courts at the west end of the school building. The tennis courts would double as basketball courts for use as all times. The parking would be for use by patrons and students. Level two would be the playground. The board has set aside \$10,000 for the development of the playground. The playground would be located north of the school building.

The band practice field and ball diamond would be located on level three. The band practice field would enable the band to practice without having to use the football field. The ball diamond could be available for use in the summer for

softball and little league play.

The plan calls for the construction of a track at the north end of the campus with a practice football field in the middle. The track would have six lanes and be 1/4 mile in length.

The bus shelter would be located at the north end of the American Legion Property with the remainder of the property being used for parking.

In addition to placing restrooms at the north end of the football field, the trustees are considering a gate at the north end of the football field which would help with the parking situation.

### Private Childress Completes Course

Army Private Lloyd W. Childress, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. L.D. Childress, Briscoe, Texas, completed today nine weeks of advanced individual training at the U.S. Army Infantry Training Center, Ft. Polk, La.

A special platform was built at the depot in Miami to unload them from the railroad car. Many ricks and stacks of grain were trashed for miles around.

He also owned one of the first trucks hauling many a cotton bale to the compress at Shamrock from the Zybach gin, as well as grain for his neighbors to Canadian, bringing back coal for the community.

He had the 2nd car registered in Wheeler County, and many a team ran away at the sight of this "new critter," 28 gates were opened between his home

and Canadian.

He is the only surviving Member of the first Elected Trustee Board of the Briscoe High School, where he was an active member. Making many trips on school business to distant towns. Two small schools were on his place in early years. The teachers were boarded free at the Lohberger home.

Across the Fence

By Max Hatter We've had our share of hot dry weather with stronger winds this summer. Folks are spending quite a few summer days putting the hay up for cattle to feed on this winter. If we have this type of wind this winter, a man won't even have to cut the bale wires. A lot of peach tree orchards were severely damaged by this wind several days ago. The demonstration orchard on N.L. Sechrist's place, west of Wheeler, had over a dozen trees with limbs twisted off. We had a nice visit with Dan Slak of the Amarillo Globe News in Amarillo last week. He came by to visit our grass research plots to gather information for their special Agricultural Edition of his newspaper. Mr. E.R. Blacker came in last week for information on what he had to do to sell cattle at the sale in Sayre, Oklahoma. We are presently under a dip-move quarantine. It is necessary in a case of this sort to get an inspection slip from an animal health officer. The Texas Department of Agriculture informed us that their weight truck that usually tests ranch scales in our county is in the process of being replaced and at this time it looks like they will not be able to test our livestock before shipping time. Check ornamental plants for aphids during warm weather. Aphids thrive on new plant growth when nights are cool and days are moderately warm. Most ornamentals are susceptible to one or more species of aphid s. Aphids cause loss of plant vigor, stunted growth, deformation of buds and flowers and curling or puckering of leaves. Aphids pierce the plant with their needle-like mouth parts and feed on plant sap. The insects create a sweet sticky substance called honeydew which attracts ants, flies, wasps and lady beetles and provides a medium for mold growth. Infested arborvitas, pines and other trees drip the honeydew on sidewalks and patios. Aphids can be many different colors, including black, green, yellow, pink, red and gray. These pests cluster in large groups on buds, stems, leaves and the bark of willows and arborvitas. Daily spraying with a strong steam of plain water will discourage light infestations. However, young, tender growth can be broken and buds knocked off. Dizinon, Meta-Systox-R, dimethoate or malathion sprays give excellent control of heavy aphid infestations. When spraying, wet the entire plant with a fine mist. Choose a warm, still day to apply insecticides. Dry systemic insecticides in granular form or in fertilizer mixes are also effective against aphids and certain other sucking pests. However, these should be used as a preventative measure applied soon after annuals become established or when perennials are growing vigorously. If a systemic insecticide is applied to the soil, a heavy watering should follow to distribute the chemical in the soil. If aphids are present, four days to a week may be required for control, depending on the size and vigor of the plant. Another insecticide application may be required in five to six weeks if re-infestation occurs.

Read the labels on pesticide containers and follow all directions and precautions.

## PAT'S PARAGRAPHS

More on "homemade" cleaners. Ammonia, carefully used, can be a helpful cleaner.

To make windows, mirrors, and glassware really sparkle, wash them with four tablespoons of household ammonia mixed with one quart warm water.

To make oven cleaning easier, pour one-fourth cup of ammonia on a small bowl in a cool oven, shut the door and leave four hours or overnight. As the ammonia evaporates, fumes from it will loosen oven grease and simplify cleaning. Add what's left of the bowl of ammonia to your wash water to clean

your oven. Two tablespoons of household ammonia added to one quart of water with two tablespoons of liquid detergent, makes a general cleaner.

Follow directions carefully when using ammonia. Be especially careful in combining it because when ammonia is mixed with a cleaner that contains chlorine the combination forms a very toxic gas. If too much ammonia is used in cleaning woodwork, it tends to soften paint.

July is National Barbecue Month, the cookout season and Summer Turkey Time.

So you have more than just a casual excuse to get the grill heating for a family barbecue.

The many sizes of turkeys mark these days makes this bird and ideal barbecue treat. You'll probably want to select turkeys for the outdoor grill in a weight range of about 4 to 6 pounds. Split the birds in halves or quarters and start the cooking skin-side-up on the grill.

All sizes of turkeys are in plentiful supply now, reports USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service. So serve the family this high-protein item often.

Slow cooking and frequent basting with a good sauce help put the rich barbecue flavor right through to the bone. For basting, a thick sauce should be diluted with about three parts of water to give it a thin consistency. Basting can be done with a brush or with a cloth tied to the end of a long stick.

Avoid too hot a fire, as the bird will scorch or cook on the outside before it is done near the bone. The grill should be at least 24 inches from the heat source. Turn the pieces from time to time to insure even cooking.

Better allow from 2 to 2½ hours of cooking time. Test the doneness this way: the drumstick should twist readily out of thigh joint or wing out of shoulder joint.

Remember that the great outdoors stimulates appetites, so have plenty of turkey on hand.

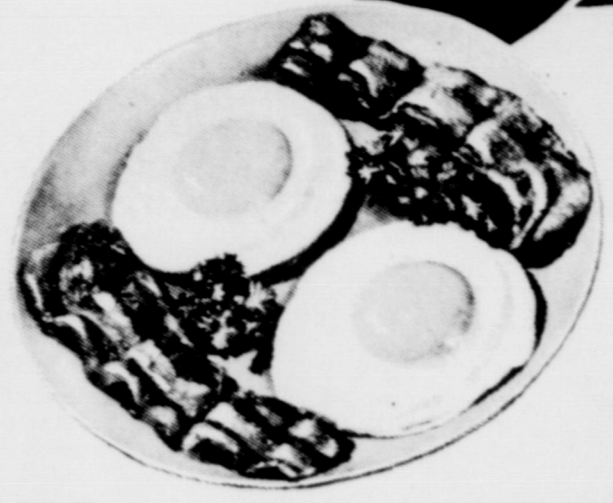
