Girl Scout Cookies To Be Sold Here

The Quivira Girl Scout Council announces the opening of their Cookie Sale beginning March 16 through the 31, 1973. The profits from this sale will be used for construction of sanitary facilities at Camp Cibola, Clarendon, Texas.

Mrs. Celia Fowler, Executive Director of the Quivira Girl Scout Council, reports that United Funds support their General Operating Budget, but no money is available to support camping costs and development. Cookie sales will enable the Council to provide a year-round camp program for the 1700 girls of the ten-county area. This year's goal is 30,000 boxes.

The cookies, distributed by the Southern Biscuit Company of Richmond, Va., are \$1.00 a box and come in five different family-size varieties, Assorted, Sandwich, Mint, Butter-Flavored Shorties, Peanut Butter Sandwich and Chocolate Chip and Nut. There are 10 boxes to a case. Brownie, Junior, Cadette and Senior Scouts will all sell cookies, with the Brownies being allowed to sell an unlimited number of boxes this year. Troops will receive 10¢ per box profit to supplement their troop budgets. Each girl selling two cases of cookies will receive a cookie patch; for each additional case sold, girls will be given two dollars credit toward their Day of Established Camp fee. This credit is not transferable.

Wind and Rain is March News

March is a month of wind and rain for the Wheeler area. Tuesday morning began as a quiet, foggy day. The fog cleared and a promise of a pretty day was at hand. Within a short time, the clouds

rolled in and .57 inches of rain was dumped in a matter of minutes. The rain was accompanied with high winds which continued through the day and into Wednesday. A total of 3.72 inches of moisture has fallen during March. Wheeler received .52 inches on March 7 and 8. 2.63 inches fell March 9, 10 and 11 with .57 falling March 13.

Wheeler has received 5.95 inches of moisture so far this year with .05 recorded for the same period last year. Wind gusts ranged from 55-60 miles per hour.

The barometer reading was 29.25 which is the lowest reading for Wheeler in the 20 years Joe Rogers has been recording Wheeler weather.

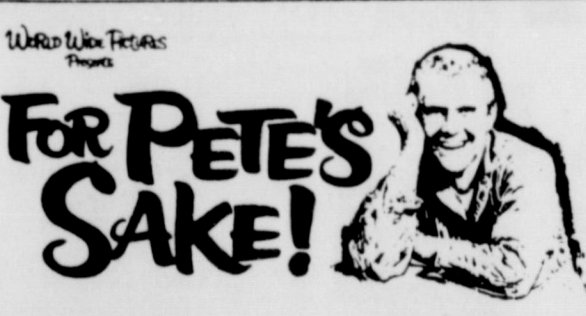

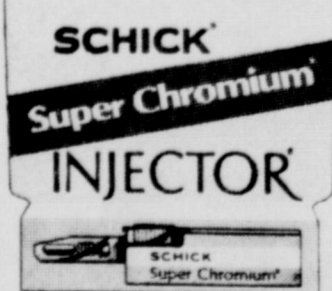

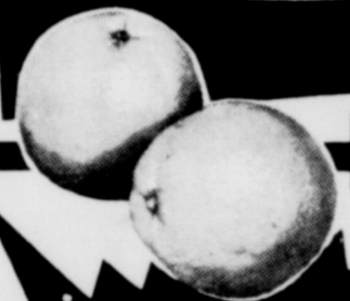
