## RABIES CLINIC

Dr. Tommie Hennard will hold a Rabies Clinic Saturday, June 23. The purpose of the clinic will be to vaccinate all pets against rabies. At the same time, dog licenses will be issued on sale. The clinic will be held at the Wheeler Veterinary Clinic, West Highway 152 from 9:00 until 5:00. Pet owners are urged to have their pets vaccinated to better control rabies.

The vaccination will provide annual protection for a period of one year. The shot will cost \$2.50. This will be the first time dog licenses will be required in the city limits. Licenses will cost \$1.00 for dogs and \$2.00 for cats. For those people who have their dogs vaccinated, but have not purchased a license, it will be necessary to take the animal and have it vaccinated to the clinic to obtain the dog license. All dogs in the city are required to be licensed and vaccinated. Citizens are urged to get their animals in at this time to be vaccinated against rabies.

For those owners who are unable to bring their pets to the clinic, call 826-5821 during the time the clinic is conducted and someone will be on duty to pick up the animals.

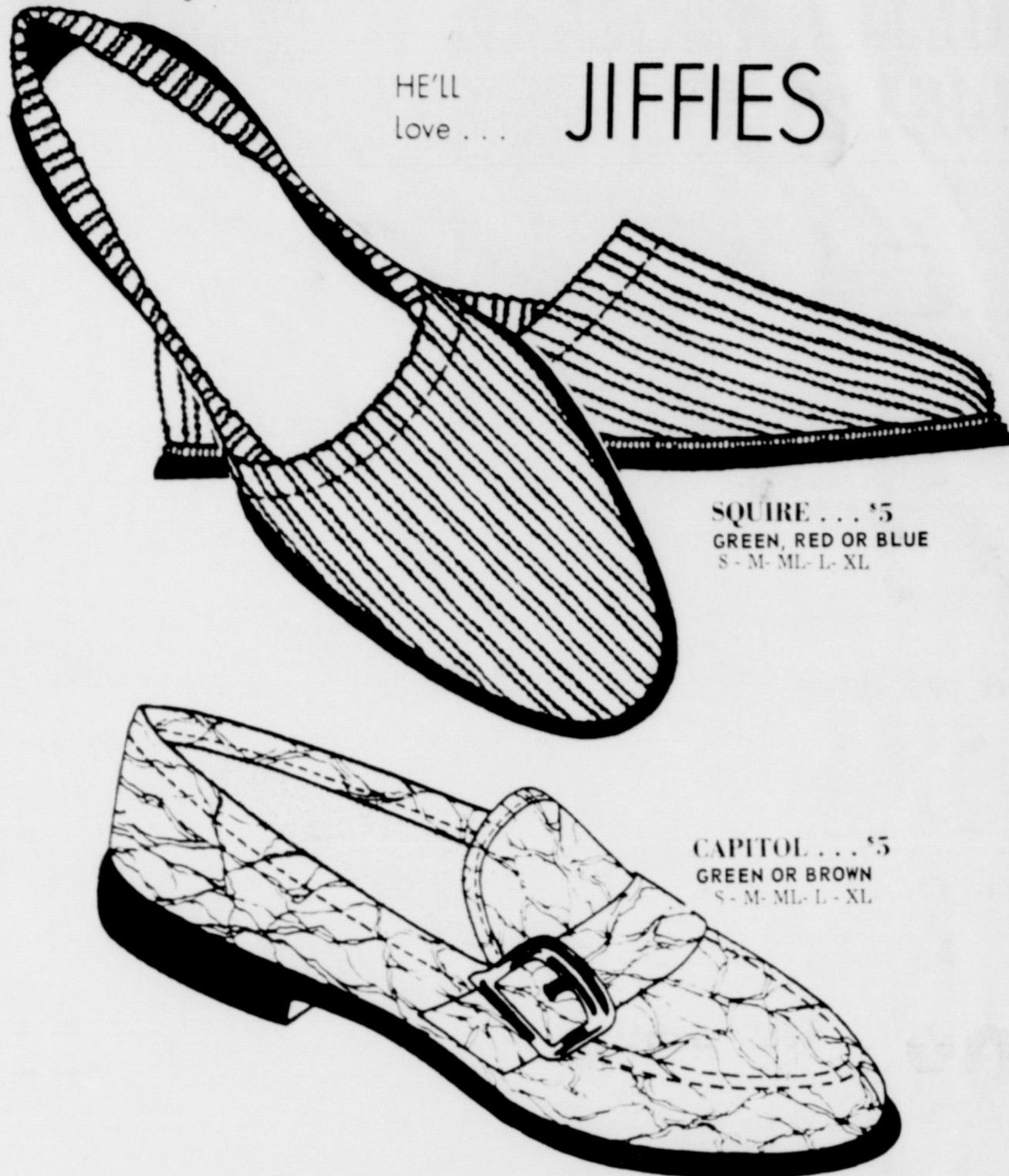

## CHATS WITH GLORIA

Children of employed mothers don't have to suffer! Some mothers who feel guilty about employment outside the home try to make it up to their children and end up spoiling them.

It's the guilt feelings, not the employment that can cause problems.

But these mothers don't need to feel guilty—research indicates it's the quality of time spent with children that counts, rather than just the amount.

If children have adequate care with an appropriate mother-substitute, and if the mother takes time to make her children feel loved and accepted, they won't suffer.

In fact, if a mother feels frustrated or bitter because she does not work outside the home, she may take that frustration out on her family. The result—unhappy children.

Also, even the best mothers and their children get "saturated" with each others' constant company both may need the break that outside employment provides to fully appreciate one another.

Many children develop responsibility and a feeling of worth because they have to do more for themselves—and more work around the home—than they would if the mother were their fulltime to do it for them.

What is Love? Love—a respectable feeling—requires a capacity to care. Love is not just something for Hollywood or adolescents. Love has a place in everyone's life. It involves a willingness to invest ourselves in others to be involved with them and listen to them.

One can love only to the extent that he regards himself as worthy. When a person loves another person they feel the other persons emotions: happiness, elation sorrow and disgust.

Love is sharing the self with others—family, friends, co-workers, even strangers.

We think of love as giving but it has to be two-way street—with the accepting of gifts, material and non-material, from others.

Interaction of love is somewhat like a dance. Partners do not need to hold or tightly, because they move confidently in the same pattern, intricate but free—there's not place here for possessive clutch.

Those in a love relationship know they're partners, and they trust each other. They provide time for self-development as well as development together. Love should be the hallmark of all people's dealings.

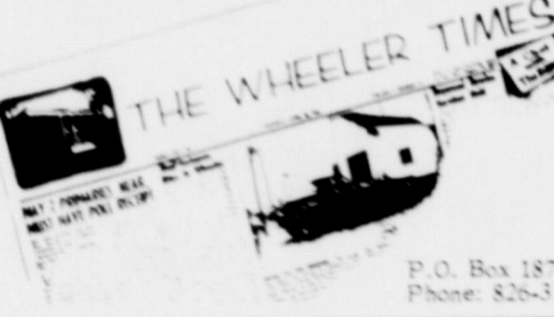
