### Reserved Seats

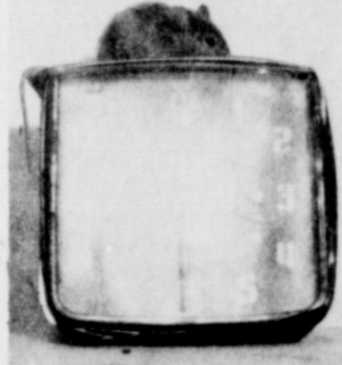
Reserved seats for the four home games of the Wheeler Mustangs are now on sale by the Quarterback Club, Dick DeArment, president of the club announced this week.
