

Please don't bite the hind-Looks like cows stand accused, in the public press and in the minds-eye of the consumer, as Public Enemy No. 1. Cows have been pictured as "turncoats" who have twin calves every. year, one for beef and the other for inflation. A gallop pool, which you

can do either on foot or horseback, reveals the following truisms: "It wasn't the cow that voted higher taxes, signed the morgage on the house, bought a car on contract, picketed for higher wages, bought a swimming pool on time, used a credit card for a vacation, insisted on build-in maid service by buying oven ready foods or a whole host of other things that has built inflation into the economy. When it's all said and done, the old cow feels pretty bad about having the hind quarter bitten that's been feeding all of us; at least while she's wearing it!

Bill Gentry at Hereford got close to 1200 pounds of beef to the acre on an irrigated alfalfa grazing demonstration conducted from July 18 to Nov. 8, 1972. A molasses Poloxalene mixture was used exclussively to control bloat. He used 35 head of freshly shipped cattle on 7 acre of irrigated alfalfa. He had no death loss. We believe that a number of these type programs, utilizing irrigated alfalfa will be done right here in Wheeler County this summer. Several producers here got a taste of it last summer, It looks good if the death loss can be kept to a minimum. We have further information on this demonstration at


