

Also new from the FDA is

child-proof containers for furniture polish. (Something needs to be extra sturdy, or extra difficult to be "child-proof"!)

After September 13, 1972 manufacturers of certain liquid furniture polishes must package products in child proof containers to comply with a new FDA regulation.

The FDA formulated a test that the packages must children under 5 years of age musn't be able to open the package 85% of the time. However, a panel of adults must be able to open it 90% of the time.

Second, the opening of the container must restrict the flow of polish so that only a half teaspoonful comes out from one shake or squeeze of the opened con-

Such regulations could possible prevent accidents. Again common sense and safety should be practiced in keeping dangerous chemicals out of reach of children. A locked cabinet or drawer may be necessary for extra protection for climbing, active, inquisitive little ones.
