## Grassland Field Day Tour

Farmers and ranchers attended the Northwest Research Demonstration Grassland Field Day on June 9. The tour at the Wheeler Gin, 16 selected intro-grasses were observed. The next stop was J. Smith ranch, north of Wheeler, where 12 head of cattle were grazed on Morpa Weepinggrass. Other stops on the tour included the Smith farm, south of Wheeler, where cattle grazed on Ermo Weepinggrass and the N.J. Walter farm, also south of Wheeler, where cattle grazed on Common Lovegrass. Farmers and ranchers saw winter perennials that included green Harding grass, Rocky 31 Fescue, Cool Mix, Jose Wheat and Kentucky Bluegrass. ## Movie Chatter

Every now and then a rare film comes along ... one which is unique because it touches audiences on so many levels ... emotionally, aesthetically, intellectually. Such a film is Twentieth Century-Fox's WALKABOUT which comes to the Rogue Theatre this Friday and Saturday. It delights, it amuses, it entertains ... but it also leaves one quite pensive.

WALKABOUT, based on the novel by James Vance Marshall, takes place in the rugged fascinating outback country of Australia. The term "walkabout" describes an Aborigine custom which required young men to wander and survive alone on the harsh land for a period of time. It is their initiation into manhood ... and of course, into the wisest and strongest return.

A man who dwells in an urban society reflects on his limited existence as his wife routinely fulfills her assigned household chores. This man takes his fourteen year old daughter (Jenny Agutter) and six year old son (Lucien John) far into the desert ... ostensibly for a picnic. He stops the car, the children alight. He takes a pistol, aims at his son who has wandered a short distance away, shoots but misses ... then turns the gun on himself after setting the car on fire. The film and her brother scramble behind the rocks ... viewing the catastrophe with bewilderment. Realizing they are now alone, they stroll into the desert in a search for help. By nightfall they realize they are completely lost. Their small food and water supplies have diminished rapidly. Just as their fate seems sealed, the boy notices a black figure moving toward them on the horizon. It is a young Aborigine boy (David Gumpil) strong and healthy, even in this cruel wasteland.

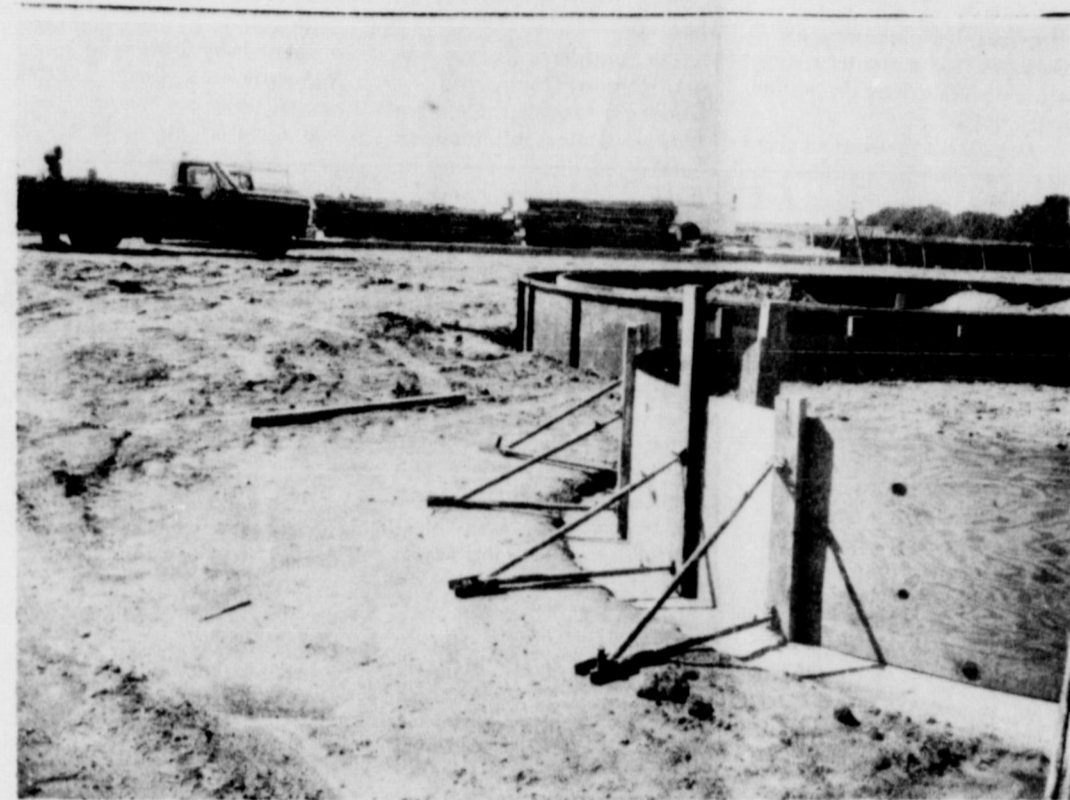
This begins a joyous companionship as they wander together sharing, in a familial way, the joys of hunting for survival, swimming, playing games ... laughing.

Showing at the Prevue and Sunday is "The Great White Hope", the story of Jack Jefferson (James Earl Jones) a black heavyweight boxing champion who meets and falls in love with Eleanor Bachman (Jane Alexander). The fact that he is black and she white does not deter her, but it shakes Jack's manager who warns that many whites would resent a black man being champion and he is correct in predicting the interracial romance will stir trouble.

A massive search is launched to discover a great white hope to beat Jefferson in a title bout. When none is found, the champion is coaxed out of retirement - but Jefferson beats him badly.

Jefferson is now undisputed world heavyweight king, and he returns to his Chicago home, opens the Cafe de Champion, struts his stuff and flaunts his wealth and his white mistress. The blacks resent this and the Establishment cannot tolerate it, for they fear he may become a figurehead encouraging a revolt among the mass of uneducated blacks. He is framed

Cotton and milo planting is well along and some stands are pretty good. Home gardens look like they'll be producing something in a few weeks. The best lovegrass seed crop in several years is being made at this time.

Even though cotton and milo plantings were in full swing last week and plowing had to be done, we had around thirty farmers and ranchers attended the grassland field day tour. Interest in the grass is at a high level. Several thousand acres are planted every year in this area. Grass and cattle will eventually help stabilize the economy of our county.

Grasshoppers continue to eat up grasslands at an alarming rate. Their next target will be tender young cotton plants. Farmers and ranchers have organized a Grassland Protection Association herd and are in the process of protecting grassland from the grasshopper's rampages. Under the program, ranchers pay approximately 66¢ an acre, says Chester Payne, the County Chairman, and the government pays the other two-thirds. If you need to protect your grassland, contact Chester or my office for details. This is the same program when we sprayed here in 1966, only then we were "spraying grasshoppers" and now we're "protecting our rangeland".

Everybody knows about cooking meat balls and spaghetti, but have you ever cooked meat balls and vegetables? Here's a med-

ley of good foods that will bring hearty flavor to your table and a note of economy to your budget. This amazingly easy meal-in-a-dish is called Meat Balls 'N' Vegetables but something like Surprise Casserole might describe it just as well.

Count on this casserole to be a hit with men, women and children. Its mouth-watering blend of flavors pleases every taste, and it's easy to make. First make the meat balls, seasoning them lightly with onion and mustard and binding them together with egg, milk and bread crumbs.

Browned in butter, they're soon ready to go around the edges of your baking dish. Meanwhile you have a chance to make the sauce and vegetables to cook. Frozen mixed vegetables lend themselves beautifully to this

casserole, as they offer such a variety of flavors and jewel-bright colors. The sauce is made conveniently with condensed cream of mushroom soup, enhanced by a favorite herb, old-fashioned sage, and a generous amount of golden Cheddar cheese.

It's a matter of minutes to arrange the meat balls around the sides of the casserole, pour the creamy sauce in the middle and fill it with vegetables. Cover and bake, then serve still bubbling hot. All you need to serve with this one-dish meal is a salad, warm rolls and butter, and a pitcher of milk.

**Meat Balls 'N' Vegetables**  
1 lb. ground beef  
1/3 cup milk  
1/4 cup finely chopped onion  
1/2 cup fine dry bread crumbs  
1 egg, beaten

1 tsp. salt  
1/4 tsp. dry mustard  
1 tsp. butter  
1 can (10 1/2 oz.) condensed cream of mushroom soup  
1 1/2 cups (6 oz.) shredded Cheddar cheese  
1/2 tsp. rubbed sage  
2 pkg (10 oz. each) frozen mixed vegetables

In a bowl lightly combine beef, bread crumbs, milk, egg, onion, salt and mustard. Shape into twenty-four 1 1/2 inch balls. In a large skillet melt butter; brown meat balls slowly on all sides. Combine soup, cheese and eggs. Meanwhile, cook vegetables according to package directions; drain. Arrange meat balls around sides of a shallow 1 1/2 qt. casserole; spoon soup mixture into center. Place cooked vegetables over top. Cover with foil and bake in a preheated 350° oven for 30 min. Serves 6
