CITY COUNCIL MEETS

WHEELER HOSPITAL PROPERTY PURCHASED; PHONE RATE INCREASE

The Wheeler City Council met Monday evening, Jan. 15. Representatives of General Telephone met with the Council.

General Telephone Co. representatives, Bob Douthitt and Bud Richerson met with the council to obtain a rate hike for General Telephone. The company proposed a 61% overall increase in rates. This was proposed at the December meeting of the council, but was tabled to give the council time to study the proposal.

The council presented a rate increase plan which they felt the city could accept. General Telephone will take this increase into consideration and meet with the council in February.

The Harold E. Nicholson Foundation sent a letter to the council offering the Harold Nicholson, Jr. Memorial Clinic to the council for \$3100; the property consists of 1/2 block and the old hospital building. The property will have to be used for the improvement of the community and is to bare the name, "Harold E. Nicholson Memorial".

The council has not made any immediate plans for the property, but will work toward the building of a Community Building and/or Library.

The Council discussed three areas where sewer improvement are needed. McMorries and Assoc. will

be contacted to make a study of these areas.

The Council voted to appoint Charles Hix, Parkview Hospital Administrator, to the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission Health Committee.

M. Kent Sims has been retained by the city as the City Attorney. He met with the council Monday evening.

Great Plains 27th Hereford Sale

The Great Plains Hereford Association announces their 27th annual consignment sale of purebred Hereford cattle to be held at the Panhandle Livestock Commission Company Yard, at Guymon, Oklahoma. Formerly the Texas County Hereford Breeders Association, the group was organized in 1946 and has sponsored one or more consignment sales each year since this date. From 1967 through 1972, nine sales were conducted in which 1289 head of purebred Herefords and Polled Herefords were sold for \$367,150.00, for some 65 plus breeders over the Oklahoma Panhandle, Western Oklahoma, the Texas Panhandle, Northeastern New Mexico, Southeastern Colorado, and Southwestern Kansas. The next consignment sale is scheduled for Saturday, April 7, 1973 at Guymon, and will include approximately 60 to 75 head of young service age and 2 year old bulls plus some 50 to 75 head of heifers, bred heifers and cows.

Keith Green, Dalhart, TX is the organization president with Alfred Pronger of Stratford, TX serving as Vice-President. Directors are: Johnny Summerour, Dalhart, TX; Milton Messner, Laverne, OK; Claude Harland, Texhoma, OK; Floyd Coen, Elkhart, KS; Dale Hoover, Perryton, TX; and Bob James, Boise City, OK. 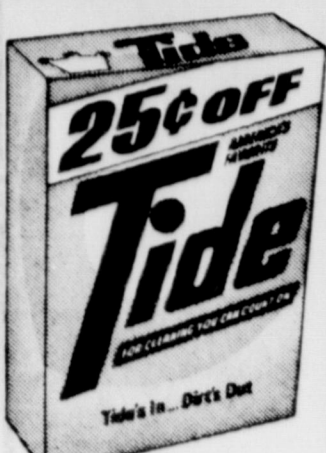
