The 18th annual Wheeler County 4-H Rodeo will be held Friday and Saturday, June 22 and 23 at 8:00 P.M. in the Wheeler Roping Club Arena, Wheeler, Texas.

The stock is being furnished by Charlie Plumber, from Elk City, Oklahoma, who promises there will be many thrills and spills for the contestants.

To add to charm and beauty to the occasion there will be a Queen's Contest. Glenda Lister is chairman of this event. The girls will be judged on poise, beauty, horsemanship, and ticket sales.

The events for this year's rodeo include bareback bull riding, calf roping, ribbon roping, pole bending, barrel racing, and calf doubling. There will also be contests for preschool children such as a boot scramble and a stick horse barrel race.

Saturday night will be awards night for the rodeo. We are giving \$600.00 in belt buckles this year. They will be given to 1st, 2nd, 3rd, places in each event in the Junior and Senior Divisions. High point boys and girls in each division will be awarded a All-Round Cowboy buckle and a All-Round Cowgirl buckle.

RABIES CLINIC SATURDAY

Dr. Tommie Hennard will hold a Rabies Clinic Saturday, June 23. The purpose of the clinic will be to vaccinate all pets against rabies. At the same time the City of Wheeler will have dog licenses on sale.

The clinic will be held at the Wheeler Veterinary Clinic on West Highway 152 from 1:30 until 5:00. Pet owners are urged to have their pets on a leash to better control them.

The vaccination will protect the animal for a period of one year. The shot will cost \$2.50. This will be the first time dog licenses will be required for dogs in the city limits. The licenses will cost \$1.00 for males and sprayed females and \$2.00 for females.

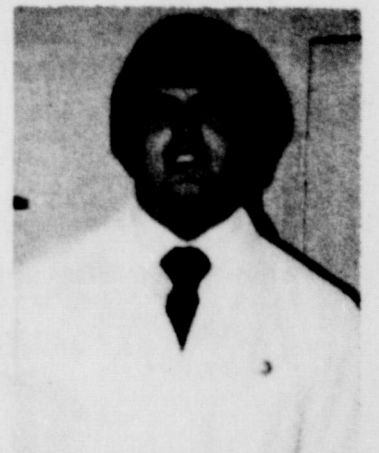
The price of swimming lessons will be \$12.50 for 10 lessons. Due to the swimming lessons there will be no Adult women swimming on the 16th and 23rd of July.
