



Notice is given that DUDLEY R. STANLEY 6306 Elmhurst Amarillo, Texas 79016, applicant, seeks a permit from the Texas Water Rights Commission to divert and use 62 acre-feet of water annually from an existing 14 acre-foot seep pond reservoir on Coburn Creek, Red River Basin, for irrigation purposes in Wheeler County, Texas.

Midpoint of the dam is 1800 feet SE of the NW corner of the H&GN RR Co. Survey, Block A-3, Section 49, Abstract No. 219. The diversion will be from the perimeter of the seep pond by one portable pump at a maximum rate of 500 apm. The proposed irrigation will be for 48 acres of applicant's land in the aforementioned survey, seven and a half (7-1/2) miles NE of Wheeler, Texas, all being more fully set

out in said application.

Across the Fence

Most pastures are turning green rapidly. The rest are turning green at the pace an old cow approaches a salt

A lot of folks are seeding lovegrass. Moisture has brought some earlier seeded grass up. This lovegrass idea is sweeping the country. It looks like the answer to holding a cow herd together in dry years. We're doing some research grazing studies enough to hold a walking this year on Common Weeping stick and rope. Love grass, Morpha Weeping lovegrass and Ermelo Weeping lovegrass. Some of the ranchers passing by our grazing studies on the Curvala Ranch at Wheeler say that the grass is so green that the grazing calves just stand with their mouths watering. Several of the calves, we heard, didn't have to go for a drink more than a couple of times a week cause their mouths watered so much!

The cattle on all plots are doing good. Dust bags to control flies, worming the cattle and keeping the grass tender are management practices we install into our studies. These practices cost little and we believe take the loopholes out of the possibilities of the cattle not performing well. It's hard to get sick, wormy, mineral deficient cattle pestered by flies to gain weight. You can't control the weather. The amount of rainfall always dictates whether or not you're going to grow grass. But, you need to get on top of those things you can control!

The alfalfa weevil is becoming a serious pest to Wheeler County, Damage to alfalfa at the Cecil Piercc farm, near Wheeler, resulted in a first cutting loss in some areas of his field. The weevils, by the way, are in the adult stage now. This adult stage will go dormant soon. We encourage producers to always cut alfalfa plants clean and close. Be sure and remove all the hay from the fields as soon as possible. The alfalfa left standing and hay left on the ground offer the weevils food and shelter. Sunlight on the old stubble will cause the new adults to leave cleancut fields.

Wintergreen harding grass, a new cool season winter perennial was the top forage yielder on our grass clipping study trials last month. Kentucky 31 Fescu came in a close second. More farmers and ranchers are looking for a permanent grass that remains green in the winter, like wheat, but doesn't have to be reseeded. We encourage folks to go by the Wheeler Gin and see the plots we have under observation.

If you grow wheat, you might like to hear the latest in research ideas and studies for practical application, Wheat Field Day slated for

May 25 at Bushland. The afternoon program wil begin at 1:30 p.m. at the U SDA Southwest Great Plains Research Center, according to Dr. Kenneth Porter, profess r in charge of research for the Texas Agricultural Experiment station.

A 2 hour field tour will include wheat improvement plots, new varieties, tansy mustard control and irrigation studies. In addition, visitors can see testing being done with triticale and male-sterile wheat-rye crosses, as well as small grains for forage in the High Plains. These include wheat, rye, barley, oats, triticale and agrotricum.

Wheat production with minimum tillage and rainfall conservation cultural practices will also be covered.




