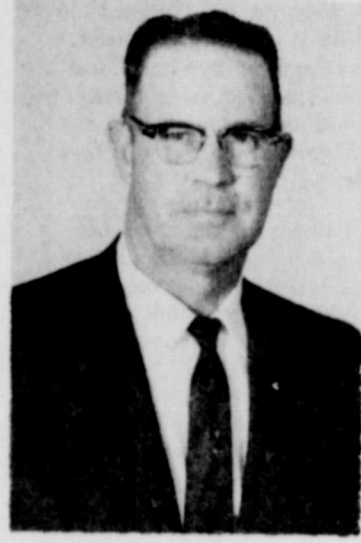

Johnie Burrell, a long-time resident of the Twitty community, announced his candidacy for election to the Wheeler County Judge office at the action of the Democratic Party in May of 1974, in release to the Wheeler Times this week.

Burrell, who has long assisted with the people of the County and many years of experience in commercial and agricultural office work, will enable him to serve in the capacity of County Judge with the interest of all the citizens of the county uppermost in his mind. Burrell is making his formal announcement.

Burrell was born in Vernon in 1916, he has resided in Wheeler County with his wife, Mrs. G. Burrell, the same year. He attended the Wheeler Center Schools and is presently engaged in raising and ranching in the Wheeler area.

Burrell was elected to the office of County Judge in 1935, and Mrs. Burrell has three children: Mrs. Joe Burrell of Palestine and Mrs. Bronnon of Arlington. He has two grandchildren: Richard and Carrie Durbin of Palestine.

Burrell is a member of the United Methodist Church of Shamrock, which he serves as Chairman of the Administrative Board. He is also a member of the Bible Class. Burrell also was elected to the Wheeler County Board of Supervisors, he has also served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Wheeler County Bureau, he has also served on the Resolution Committee of Dallas for one year. He was a member of the Wheeler School Board and was instrumental in working out the details of consolidation of Wheeler and Dallas schools.

Burrell was appointed by the Wheeler County School Board to the Wheeler School Board and he has served in that capacity for a number of years and was elected as Keltion School Board President.

"Having served the past seven years in the office of County Superintendent, I feel I am well enough acquainted with the county government to serve the citizens of Wheeler County as Judge, an office which will include the work of the County Superintendent," stated Morgan. He continued, "It is my intention to give the citizens a good county government and the youth of our county a good education."

The 42-year-old Samnorwood native resides in the Lela Community where he is engaged in a farming operation. He is married to the former Sandra Baker, and is the father of a five-year-old son, Clifton.

Morgan holds a BS degree from West Texas State University in Canyon. Prior to taking office in County Superintendent, he served as administration of schools at Community Center in Childress county and was employed as principal of the Lela school system for seven years.

Only 221 votes were cast in the election Saturday which decided the fate of the County Superintendent's office in Wheeler County.

Of the 221 votes cast, 149 voted for the abolishment of the office and 72 voted against the abolishment of the office.



gift itself. However, gifts aren't limited to baked goods. For example, that jam jelly or exotic chili sauce prepared last summer be a treat.
 Before wrapping canned foods, check all jars to see they're adequately sealed and can withstand a few bumps while being placed under a Christmas tree.
 Here is a prepare ahead from the kitchen of Opal Hefley.
Frozen Cranberry Salad
 Pour 1 1/2 cups of sugar over 1 cup chopped cranberries. Let this set overnight. The next day add 1 pound Tokay grapes, seeded and cut into fourths 1 small can Angel Flake Coconut, 1 cup chopped pecans, and 1 pint whipping cream or prepared dream whip or cool whip. Mix this well and keep in freezer until serving time.
 With lots of good Christmas cooking ahead you may need to check your spice rack. Most holiday recipes make liberal use of spices, and the aromas from your kitchen pre-sell the meal while it is being prepared. Use fresh spices and keep them stored later in airtight containers or even in the refrigerator to maintain freshness.
 Fireplaces are a source of pleasure year round, but at Christmas they seem to have a special glow. A different glow can come from colored flames.
 To have beautifully colored flames in your fireplace there are a number of chemicals which may be used. First, select bits of wood, bark, driftwood, pine cones, sweetgum balls or similar material. Then secure appropriate chemicals from a local hardware store or a manufacturing chemist.
 Colored flames can be produced by chemicals such as red with strontium nitrate or chloride, green with Borax, blue with copper sulphate, orange with calcium chloride, and yellow with common table salt.
 Caution should be taken when using copper salts since they will stain brick, tile, and concrete -- so be careful in placing the colored objects to avoid permanent stains.
 To treat the material either dissolve the chemical in a wooden pail or crock -- the chemical destroy metal containers.
 Use about one pound chemicals to one gallon water to treat 1/2 to 3/4 el of material.
 Dip the material which has been placed in a porous bag, in the solution.
 Remove the container, drip, and then spread material on paper to dry. Air drying overnight, dip and dry. They are now to use. There are also several dry methods of treating the material.
 Dissolve one table of glue in one gallon of water. Dip the container. Remove with a skimmer. Sprinkle with chemicals while the container is hot. A salt shaker large holes makes a satisfactory utensil for the chemicals. Pour melted wax the material. Before the hardens, sift the chemicals onto the cones. The chemical will adhere and will produce a very pleasant effect when burned. Remember to use wax sparingly with this method. Mix chemicals and shellac saw dust and sprinkle of the wood in the fireplace desired.

While the principal business of our feedlot is the production of beef for a hungry world, there are certain byproducts of our operations which are available to help in the operations of other segments of agriculture. 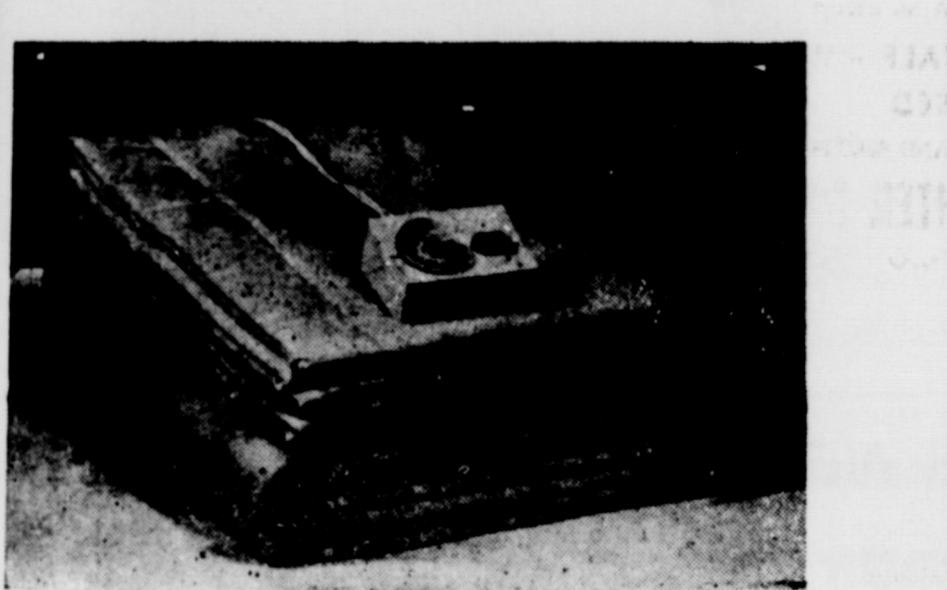
