of these three gifts, only gold is still today a familiar and precious commodity. However, in the time of Christ, with frankincense and myrrh were equally valuable and reli-known commodities, used in trade between the Middle East and Mediterranean countries.

Gold, because of its rarity and beauty has been the wild's most precious metal since its discovery more than 1000 years ago. Then, as now, it served as a medium of achange, and was considered a symbol of wealth and ower. Because gold is soft and pliable, it was also used in making fine jewelry and artifacts.

Both frankincense and myrrh are gum resins of trees, thich grow only near the monsoon regions of Ethiopia, maliland and Southern Arabia.

Frankincense, which comes from a tree of the same same belonging to the balsam family, is an aromatic gum resin and was an important used as an air purifier and as a remedy for certain physical ailments.

Myrrh is a fragrant, bitmyrrn is a fragrant, bit-ter-tasting gum resin ex-uded from any of several shrubs, which grow in the same sections as frankin-cense. It was used mainly as a base for ancient cosmetics and perfumes. It was also used medically as a pain-killer and in mouthwash mixtures. It is used in some mouthwashes today. * * * * * * U.S. "CHRISTMAS" TOWNS SWAMPED WITH CHRISTMAS MAIL

Because many people want a Christmas postmark in their cards, letters and packages, each year mil-ons of pieces of mail are sent to post offices in those laces named "Christmas."

Christmas, Florida, population about 300, handles in average half-million pieces of mail during the Christmas season. Located near Orlando, it began as a fort that was completed on Christmas 1835.

Uhristmas Nostalgia Portrayed By America's Favorite Artist

Norman Rockwell is perhaps better qualified than any other artist to portray a typically American Christmas leene. In this illustration of a trio of quaint-looking musicians playing carols in the street, he has captured the favor of an old-fashioned Christmas in a small town. It is the authenticity in this painting as in all Norman Rockwell's work that inspires such lasting, universal appeal Norman Rockwell never fakes a detail.

Local, small town residents posed for the three musicians in clothing that had been carefully selected from Mr. Rockwell's huge wardrobe of costumes. The lantern and musical instruments were garnered from antique shops across the countryside.

The painting shown was originally commissioned by halimark for a Christmas card.

According to legend, remnants of the manger at Bethlehem were brought to Italy by early Christians. So it is not surprising that some 1300 years later, St. Francis of Assisi should have chosen to renew its spirit and meaning in the hermitage of Greccio in the Umbrian mountains.

"I desire to represent the birth of that Child in Bethlehem in such a way that with bodily eyes we may see all that He suffered for lack of the necessities for a new-

far and wide.

Inspired by St. Francis, artisans and craftsmen began to make miniature manger scenes for their homes, and the creches spread all over Europe.

Whole families fashioned the little figures from wood or clay and created replicas of Bethlehem, as they imag-ined it would look. Often these scenes looked more like their own villages than the Holy Land.

In Naples, these creches developed into a fashion-able art because of the interest of the Bourbon King Carlo III, who set the pace by the elaborate settings of the Nativity scene, which he had set up in his castle every Christmas Eve.

The members of the court took up the hobby of their king and soon all the great Neapolitan families were vying with each other to produce brilliant and lavish

In England, Boxing Day, the first weekday after Christmas is so named from the practice of giving boxes of food, gifts and money to tenants, tradesmen and servants.

The Irish place lighted candles in their windows on Christmas Eve as a guide and an invitation to all, who like Mary and Joseph, may be seeking shelter.

The word "wassail" derives from the Anglo-Saxon "waes hael" which meant "Be in health." Wassail was a mixture of mulled ale, eggs, curdled cream, roast apples, nuts and spices.

His friend, Giovanni Vellita, proceeded to carry out these instructions, setting up a life-size manger with straw and a live ox and ass. A great throng assembled to worship at the site on Christmas Eve 1223. these figures were produced in the workshops of Naples during the second half of the eighteenth century. Most of these are from the famous collection owned by the great Neapolitan Catello family.

Each year whole forests of young spruce trees are chopped down in their prime and displayed with decorations as Christmas trees in millions of Ameri-can homes. After the two-week holiday season, they But Christmas trees can now be recycled. They can be given a second life in which their organic com-

ponents can be put to work nurturing other life.

A machine known as a wood chipper instantly reduces them to valuable garden mulch.

This mulch retains soil moisture and can be applied on top of snow to protect bulbs and stems of young trees and shrubs. Also, this coarse sawdust-like stuff is as good as salt or sand for improving traction

How Santa Claus Became An American Christmas Tradition
