RODEO BEGINS BARBECUE TONIGHT



The old west will come to life in Wheeler at the 18th annual Wheeler Riding Club Rodeo as it gets underway Thursday, July 19. Each night's performance of the Rodeo begins at 8:20 P.M.

The rodeo is staged at the rodeo arena northeast of town.

The annual free barbecue will start the three days of festivities. The barbecue is a joint effort of the businessmen and the Riding Club and is served by the Chamber of Commerce. The feed is scheduled to begin at 6:00.

A crowd of 1500 is expected to be on hand to hold out their plates as they go through the "chow" line. The menu for the evening will be barbecue beef, sauce, brown beans, onions, pickles, peaches, bread and iced tea or coffee.

The meal is free to each person buying a ticket to the

first night's performance of the rodeo.

Around 1500 lbs. of beef is being prepared to feed the crowd Thursday evening.

Six rodeo events are slated for the three nights of rodeoing. The first event of the evening will be Bareback bronc riding. Other events are Calf Roping, Girls Barrel Race, Bull Dogging, Bull Riding, Heading and Heeling and Brama Bull Gold Rush.

A shop made saddle will be given away to some lucky person Saturday evening. The saddle will be on display at the rodeo. Anyone wishing to make a donation to the Wheeler Riding Club will be eligible to win the saddle; contact a Riding Club member for more information.

Producing the rodeo again this year will be Charlie Plummer, Jr. of Elk City, Okla. Rose Plummer will serve as secretary.

Riding Club officers are: Gerald Johnson, president; Darrel Moore, vice president; and Stanley Baker, secretary. Serving on the board of directors are: Charles Moore, Larry Finsterwald, Delbert Thomas, Gene Hutchison and Terry McCasland.

BRICKY, STONE TAKE PART IN RESCUE MISSION AT SEA

Robert Brickey and Joey Stone are serving aboard the USS Jonas Ingram and recently wrote this account of a rescue mission in which they and their fellow crewmen participated: "Last week we received an S.O.S. from an Indian Ship which was taking water, fast and sinking. By the time we got there it was too late, the ship had already sunk, taking thirty-five men to their deaths. We spent two days without sleep picking people out of the water and taking care of them.

But, for twenty of them we were just too late. It is sad that people should die, but when a sailor dies, it's different. I guess you would just have to be sea to feel it; because when a sailor's ship sinks, the odds of living is almost zero. He is at the mercy of the elements and God Bless him if he can't swim. If you can swim, you have to fight off the sharks and sea snakes.

WHEELER COUNTY'S ROLE IN 1972 OIL INDUSTRY

The petroleum industry in Wheeler County played a significant role in 1972 in meeting the demand for oil and natural gas. The county was one of 190 Texas counties that produced oil and gas in excess of \$100 million in a record production year for the state's industry, according to a report compiled by the Texas Continental Oil & Gas Association.

The county ranked 116th in the state in the value of oil produced, \$7.9 million. The sale of crude oil brought \$4.3 million; natural gas, \$3.6 million. But despite this record year, due in large part to months of production at a 50 percent of the maximum efficient rate, the county's largest producer of oil could not produce enough to satisfy demand.

To further stimulate production, we need a re-evaluation of the open market," said Robert A. Chapman of San Antonio, president of the Association. This would produce two needed effects: First, to build a channel for the state's oil products to the most efficient and highest paying users; second, it would help provide part of the capital needed so desperately to build refineries and superports and to carry expensive exploration and production activities," Chapman added.

Some 500 entries from all over Texas was there. Don ran the mile. Winners were 1st-K. Gregston, Abilene-4:43.2, 2nd- Jeff Tuinlin, Amarillo - 4:57.2 and 3rd Don Chapman, Wheeler - 5:01.2.

It was a wonderful reunion reports Mrs. C.H. Turner. The afternoon was spent taking pictures and visiting. There were 3 sets of 4 generations present.

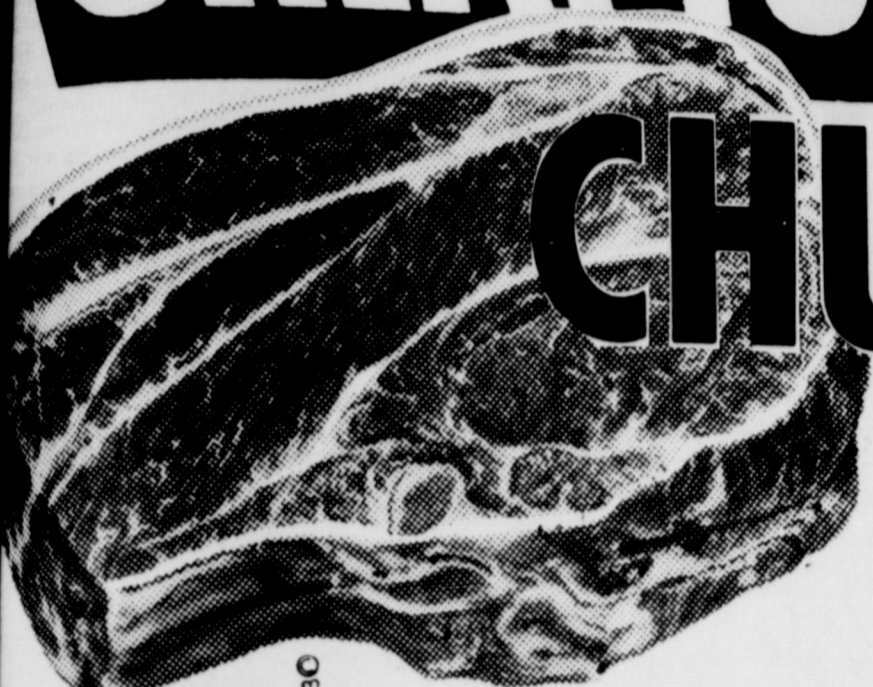
