

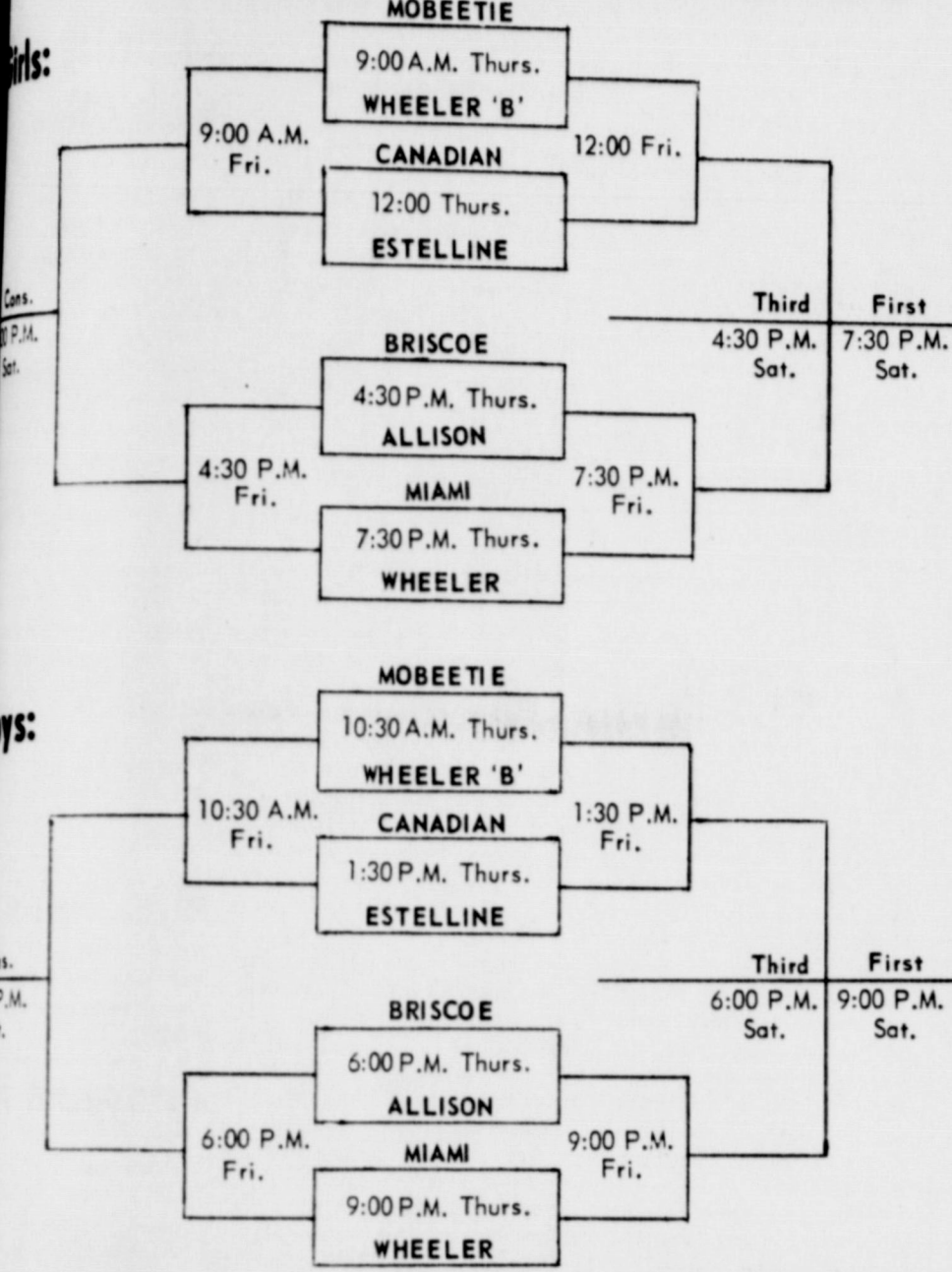

## WHEELER BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD THIS WEEKEND



The annual Wheeler Invitational Basketball Tournament gets underway this week with eight teams entered with the opening tipoff coming at 9 AM Thursday morning with the Mobeetie girls taking on the Wheeler JV girls.

In a last minute change, the Wheeler JV girls and boys teams were entered as the Elk City teams could not come as their football team is playing in the state finals.

In addition to the JV teams from Wheeler, other teams entered in the tournament are: Allison, Briscoe, Mobeetie, Canadian, Estelline, Miami and Wheeler.

There will be two sessions each day of the tournament and after each session the gym will be cleared and cleaned up prior to the starting of the next session. Tournament officials urge the fans and teams to cooperate in this each day.

The consolation finals will begin at 1 PM on Saturday with the championship finals getting underway at 7:30.

Trophies will be awarded to the first, second, third and consolation winners and a sportsmanship trophy will be given to the boys and girls teams that display the best sportsmanship during the tournament.

All tournament teams will be selected by the officials and seven boys and eight girls will be chosen. The officials will also make the choices for the sportsmanship awards. All of the trophies and awards will be presented at the conclusion of the final games on Saturday evening.

The concession stand will be open during all sessions and will be operated by the athletic department of the Wheeler Schools.

## CAR, TRUCK ACCIDENT CLAIMS SIXTH GRADER

### Melvina Meadows Services Tuesday

Services for Melvina Caroline Meadows, 11, who was killed Friday morning when the car in which she was riding crashed into a semi-tractor rig seven miles north of Sayre, Okla., were held at 2 p.m. Tuesday in Wheeler First Baptist Church.

The Rev. David Campbell, pastor officiated assisted by Rev. Ricky Hatter.

Melvina died at the scene of the crash about 10:35 a.m. Friday at the intersection of Oklahoma 6 and U.S. 283.

The Oklahoma Highway Patrol said the victim's father, Melvin W. Meadows, 62, of Wheeler, was driving east on the state highway when his car apparently skidded through the intersection and crashed into the semi-rig.

Patrolmen said the highways were wet because of mist that had been falling Friday morning. At the time of the accident, a heavy fog blanketed the area.

Meadows and his 4-year-old son, Buford, were injured in the accident. The boy was in satisfactory condition Sunday at St. Anthony's Hospital at Amarillo. Meadows was in fair condition at Sayre Memorial Hospital.

Melvina was born March 5, 1962 at Shamrock. She had lived in Wheeler all of her life and attended Wheeler Schools. She was in the 6th grade.

She is survived by her father, Melvin W. Meadows, four brothers, Buford of the home, Bobby Meadows of

Wheeler, and Johnny Wilson and Jim Wilson, both of Butte, Mont., and seven sisters, Mrs. Shirley Scott of Shamrock, Mrs. Gladys Smith of Utica, Calif., Mrs. Betty Skidmore of Elk City, and Mrs. Judy Wilson, both of Butte, Mrs. Gloria Gable of Gruver and Mrs. Mary Hensley of Oklahoma City and her grandmother, Mrs. John Geyer of Wheeler. She was preceded in death by her mother.

Pall bearers were Thomas Helton, Cecil Pierce, Richard Gaines and Larry Tracy. The boys of the 6th Grade Class served as Honorary Pallbearers.

Interment was in the Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Wright Funeral Home of Wheeler.

## Christmas Mail Early Week

Postmaster Hiram Whitener announced today that December 3-8 will be "Christmas Mail Early Week" in Wheeler. The fuel energy crisis is a cause of great concern to the Postal Service as it affects the timely movement of Christmas mail. The Curtailment in the number of air flights as well as the 50 mile-an-hour speed limit for vehicles makes Mail Early Week more important this year than ever before according to Whitener.

"We are handling more mail this Christmas than in any previous year," Postmaster Whitener said. "In order to get this mail to its destination by December 25, we need your cooperation in mailing early."

Due to the energy crises and the 50 mile-per-hour speed limit it has been necessary to change out-going dispatch time from 4:00 P.M. to 3:30 P.M. All mail must be in the post-office no later than 3:30 P.M. in order to be dispatched that day Postmaster Whitener said.

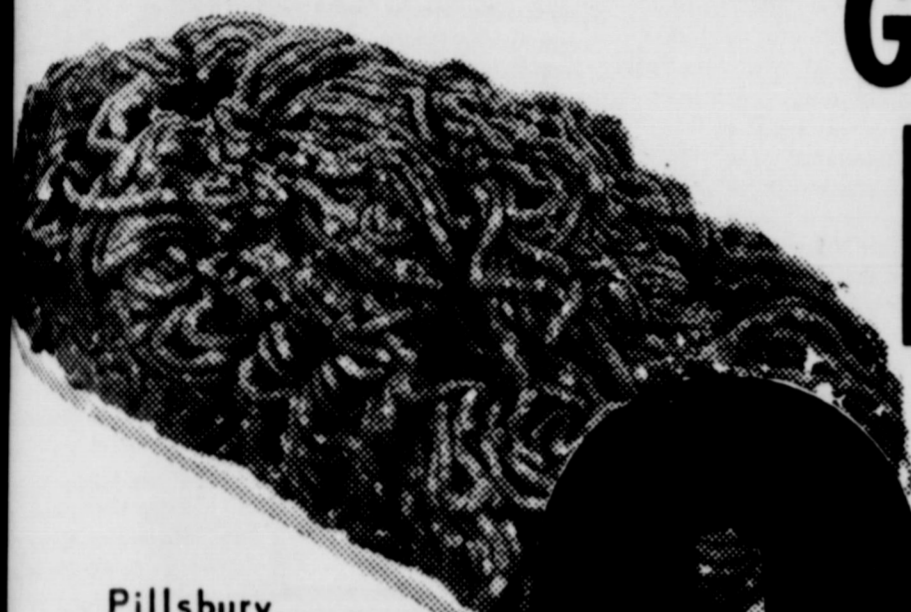

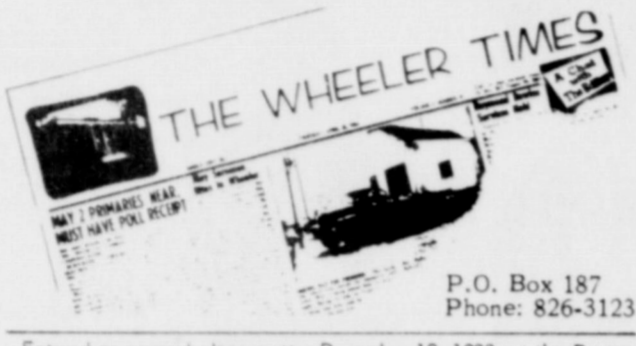

## WHAT'S WITH GLORIA

With the energy crisis heating up, many of us are looking for ways to conserve energy. One way is to use electric blankets. This winter, that's what's needed. Warm blankets to furnish the home. Warm blankets offer the energy advantage. Electric blankets are constructed with a plastic-like construction which is water proof, plastic-like wires that lay net-like over two layers of fabric. The wires are placed at intervals along the wiring automatic control the amount of

To ensure proper fit, measure the width of the mattress then add 13 - 14 inches per side to this measurement. Blanket length, on the other hand, depends on needed tuck-in.

Read and follow all care instructions provided with the blanket. Following cleaning instructions to avoid damaging the blanket. To wash electric blankets fill washer with warm sudsy water and gently feed blanket into agitator water (you can't do this if you have a front loading washer). Run the blanket through the gentle washing cycle adding fabric softener for a fluffy static free blanket. Electric blanket, as a rule, should not be machine dried.

Many Wheeler county residents made their own pickles but for those of you who weren't able to do so here's some information on buying store pickles.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service, the kinds of pickles you can buy are almost as infinite as the different kinds of cooking there are. Just stand in front of the pickle counter in your local store and you can reach that conclusion for yourself. How do you decide which style pickle to buy? Well, it will help to know that all cucumber pickles are related to one or another of an easily-remembered handful of varieties.

First is the dill pickle, flavored primarily with the aromatic herb dill, and sometimes supplemented with various mixed spices. The dill pickle comes in three variations: Genuine dills, prepared by a long process of natural fermentation; processed dills, which start out in a brine of salt and water and are finished later in a dill solution; and the quickly fermented, cucumber-dill "overnight" pickle.

Some dill pickles are "kosher" or "kosherstyle". The term has religious significance in accord with Hebrew law, but in the United States has come to mean that the pickles are more highly spiced with onion and garlic.

After the dill pickle comes the sour pickle. As with the dill, the cucumber is first fermented in a salt brine. Sour pickles are

finished in a solution of vinegar and spices. Some relishes and piccaililli are made from sour pickles.

The third basic kind of cucumber pickle is the sweet pickle. These start as sour pickles from which the vinegar has been drained. They are then put into spicy liquors and aged, until the desired degree of sweetness is attained.

As with many of the other foods you buy, the U.S. Department of Agriculture has U.S. grade standards for pickles. These grades help manufacturers to properly make and accurately label the products they offer for sale.

When buying pickles, check the labels. This should help you decide whether or not the flavorings are the types that suit you. Pickle prices vary from item to item and brand to brand. This is because some types are much more costly spices and other ingredients are reasons for high priced items.

As with all purchases, the decision of whether to buy the higher priced product or may not always depend solely on your purse, but also on your taste buds.

When you buy meat and poultry products produced under federal inspection, you can be assured of the safety of the packaging materials. They must be

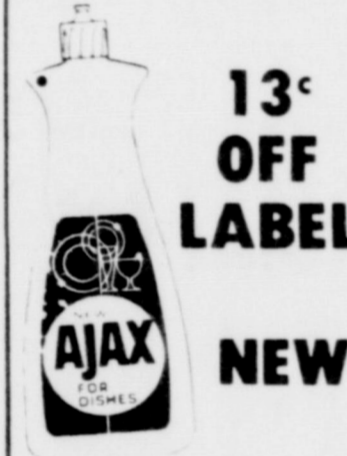

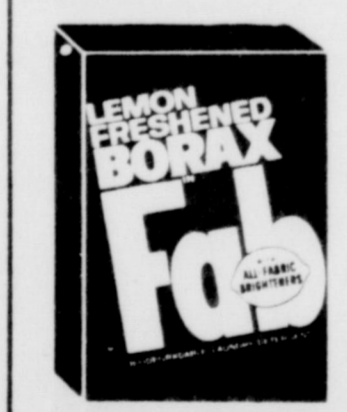
