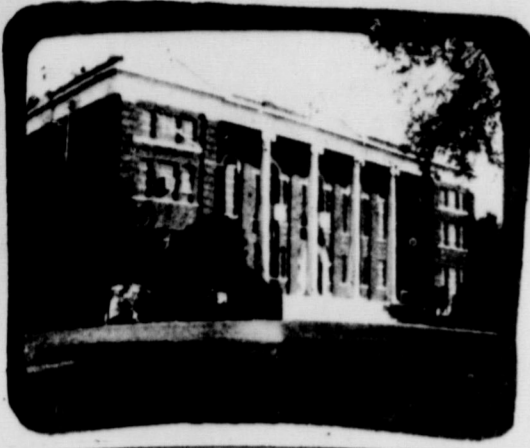

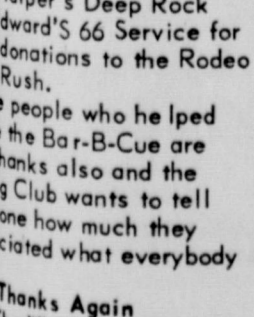

Mobeetie Enrolls Students Aug 20

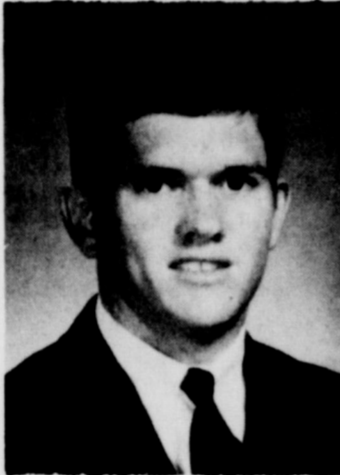
Registration and classes will begin for the Mobeetie School at 8:15 A.M. on Monday, August 20th. Buses will run both morning and afternoon.

GAS SERVICE INTERRUPTED THURSDAY

The City of Wheeler was without gas for 6 1/2 hours Thursday, Aug. 2, as a result of a 4" delivery line being cut. The line, located in the north edge of Wheeler was cut by earth moving equipment working in the area. This caused a complete loss of gas service to the city.

Because of the hazardous nature of gas, when a service loss occurs, it is necessary to turn off all customer's meters before the city mains' pressure is restored.

The line was cut at approximately 1 P.M. and pressure was restored at 7:30 P.M. At the time the accident occurred, several of Wheeler Gas, Inc. employees were working on construction at Reydon - 35 miles away. The local employees were aided in their work by employees of Natural Gas Pipeline of America and Consolidated Utilities of Miami.

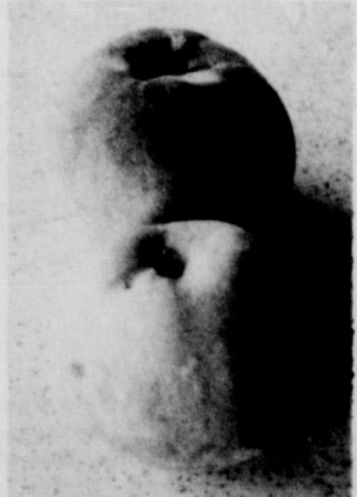

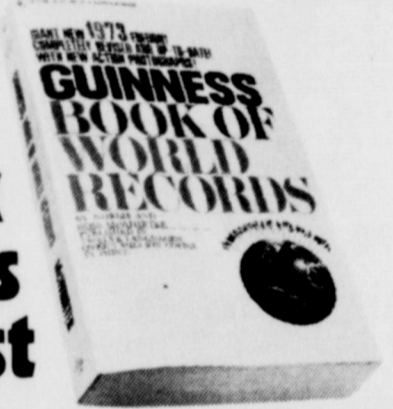

 Many Weeping Lovegrass stands in Wheeler County were damaged this winter due to the severe winter freezes. If you will look around the county, many of these were youngstands seeded late last year or older stands which were heavily grazed or hayed. You have probably heard the statement that Lovegrass will take lots of grazing abuse. It will take more than most of our native grasses but like any living plant it can take only a certain amount of use. When the leaves of a plant are clipped off by a cow or an implement it takes some of the reserves from the root system to replace this leaf growth. When this leaf is mature it will restore the reserve to

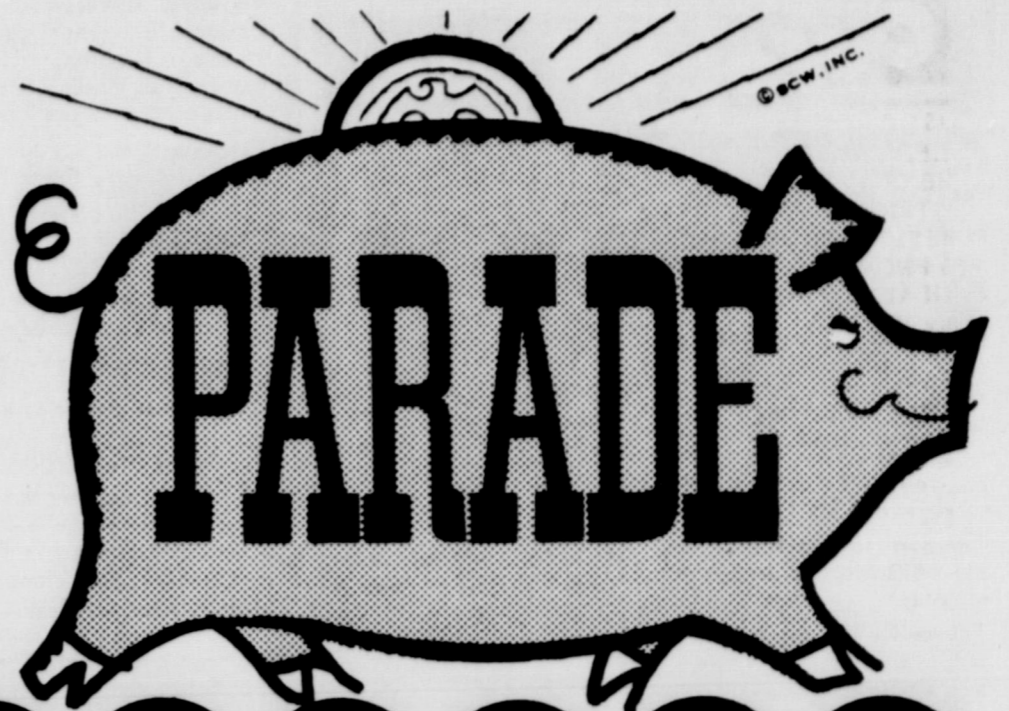
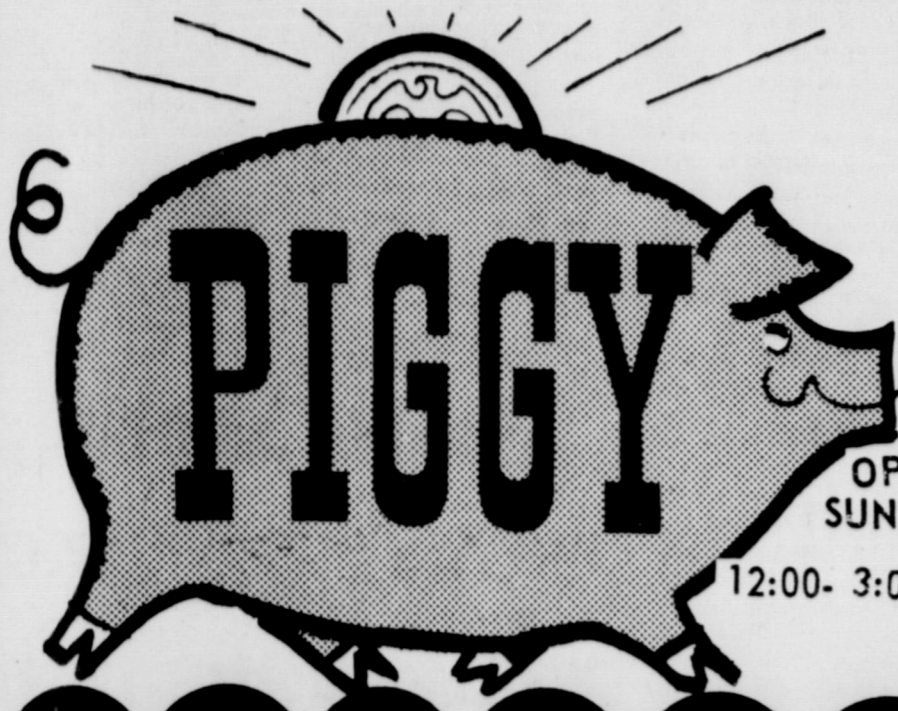

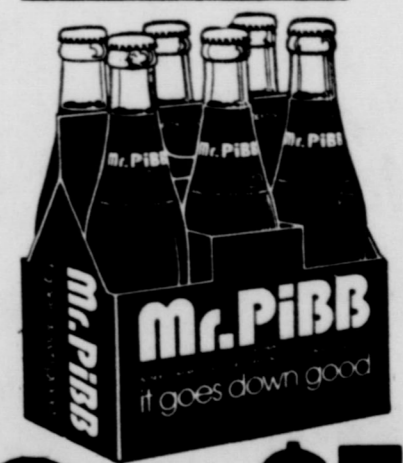
