RODEO WELL ATTENDED

The crowd consumed 125 lbs. of red onions and 80 loaves of bread which was furnished

by Meads. The second most popular item offered at the barbecue was iced tea prepared as usual in the old wooden barrel.

According to House Bill 787, every school district in Texas shall provide a kindergarten for all five year old children. A school district may select one of six options in providing a kindergarten.

The Board of Trustees of the Wheeler Independent School District selected option No. 4, whereby to offer a full day program for one half of the five year old children for the first semester and the remainder the second semester.

Due to the small number of first grade students for the 1973-74 school year, the kindergarten students will be handled by the first grade teacher with the assistance of a teacher aide.

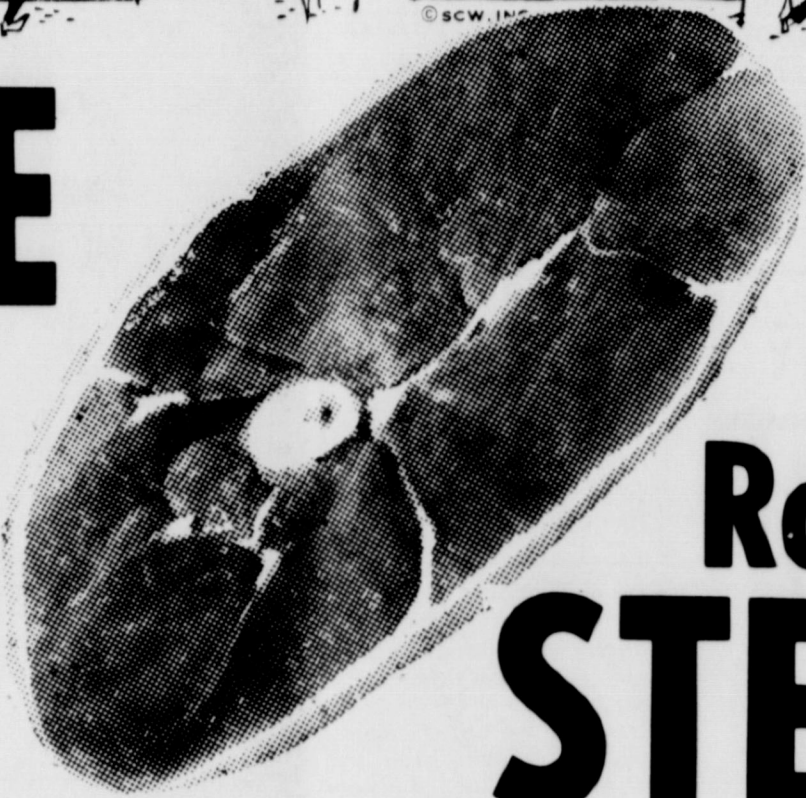
