Wheeler to Decide Fate Of School Superintendent

December 15, the election will be the usual voting for the abolishment of the County Superintendent's office. The vote is affirmative, and will be consolidated with the County Judge's election, saving some \$10,000 to the State. It is now, more than \$100,000 is expended on the election. The superintendent has authority over all 150 school districts and all common schools. The County Judge can be easily removed from the Judge's

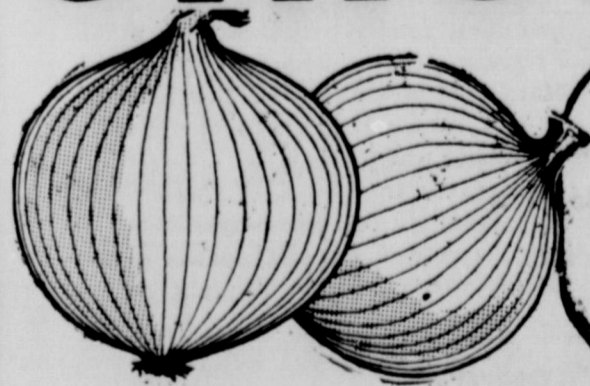

KING'S KOMMENTS

By Joe Don King

We have recieved a few copies of a booklet entitled "Income Tax Management for Farmers". If you would like to have a copy to help you in preparing your income tax, come by the County Extension Office and pick up one. We should also be receiving the "Farmers Tax Guide", that many of you have used in the past, sometime in Dec. If you would like a copy of that leave your name and address at the office and we will mail you a copy when it comes in.

During the last half of November and in December, some 75,000 Texas farmers and ranchers will receive either a crop or livestock questionnaire from the Tex. Crop and Livestock Reporting Service. Accurate estimates

have always been of great importance to producers and are even more important in light of the supply-demand situation facing agriculture today. Data collected in this survey will provide an accurate picture of agriculture for each county and for the state of Texas.

This roundup survey of crop production and livestock Reporting Service. The Texas Department of Agriculture and the Statistical Reporting Service, U.S. Department of Agriculture, work together to provide comprehensive information on Texas agriculture.

Producers from each county in Texas are selected proportional to size of operation. The small producers sampled, represent only themselves. It is therefore, equally important for all farmers and ranchers receiving a questionnaire to complete and return it promptly.

All reports are confidential available to no other Government agency or anyone except the few persons required to process the data. The state and county estimates published are available for everyone at the same time.

County statistics for 1972 and January 1, 1973, are available on Livestock, Poultry, Dairy, Field Crops, Poultry, Dairy, Field Crops, Small Grains, Cotton, Vegetables, Fruits and Pecans, and Cash Receipts from the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service, P.O. Box 70, Austin, Texas 78767, or by writing John C. White, Commissioner of Agriculture, P. O. Box 12847, Capital Station, Austin 78711.

Above average rainfall in East Texas and the states along the eastern seaboard, where the majority of stocker cattle for this area are obtained, has occurred for the past two years. These ideal conditions have caused a tremendous increase in internal parasites.

Parasitism in some cases are severe enough to cause death. The symptoms in severe cases, are decreased appetite, weight loss and watery diarrhea. In all cases, even if symptoms are absent, this parasite load increases the cost of gain, or in the case of wheat pasture, requires more forage than normal to be consumed to produce a pound of gain. Therefore, it is more important to worm you that you are placing on wheat pasture this year, than it has been in the past.

The normal cycle of an internal parasite is the larvae is ingested by the animal with grass. The larvae then invades the lining of the gut and undergoes further development. It finally emerges into the intestinal tract where they attain adulthood and begin laying eggs.

The medium stomach worm (Ostertagia) has been the primary offender in some cases where responses to normal worm remedies has been ineffective. Under certain conditions, usually in the fall of the year, the larvae of the medium stomach worm does not continue its regular development on to adulthood but rather cease development and remain in the lining of the stomach for long periods of time. This causes in collection of fluid in the tissue, making the lining of the stomach many times thicker than normal.

This accumulation of fluid disrupts the acid producing cells in the stomach that are necessary for the digestion of protein. This is one of the reasons affected animals lose weight so rapidly. Much of the fluid collected in the tissues pass into the intestinal tract and this contributes to the watery diarrhea observed in these animals.

Response to treatment with most worm demicines is highly effective against the adult parasites found in the stomach or intestine; however, the larvae formations in the lining of the gut are much more resistant to medication. In this case, for treatment to be successful on the larvae formation, it must be repeated at two-week intervals for as long as necessary.

Your veterinarian may wish to utilize other methods to reduce the fluid collection in the gut and to provide intravenous protein-type nutrients to the animal.

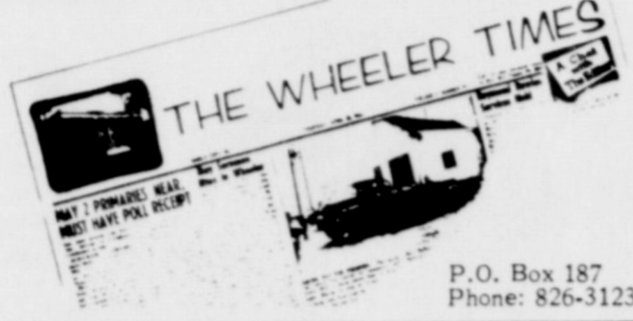
