

# MARSHALL TO REPRESENT WHEELER AT PERRYTON

Carla Marshall of Lubbock will be one of 30 entrants in the Wheatheat of the Nation Pageant this week. Named Miss North Wheeler County at the recent local pageant, she will be in the annual pageant in Perryton

which will be held on Saturday night, August 23 at 7:30 p.m. in the Perryton high school auditorium.

The daughter of Mrs. Clara Marshall of Lubbock, the brown-haired, brown-eyed Miss Marshall is a student at Texas Tech University. She is a 1973 graduate of Wheeler High School. Miss Marshall is taking her training in general business and secretarial work and hopes to be an airline stewardess when she graduates.

Girls from four states will compete in the annual contest this year in a program that is expected to be more elaborate and diverse than it has been in the past. Theme for the pageant this year is "I Am Woman" and in line with that there will be two production numbers performed by the contestants. One will be titled "I Am Woman" and the second will be "Hey Look Me Over." Competition will include

both swim suits and formals. Master of ceremonies this year will be Chamber of Commerce Manager Leo Meyers. The contestants will have a noon luncheon Saturday and interviews with the judges at the same time. Judges will be Mrs. Linnie (B. M.) Simms of Wellington, Former Congressman Bob Price of Pampa and Mrs. Jack Geddes of Lubbock.

Entrants will ride in the parade Saturday morning that marks the start of the last of the celebration.

Nationally famous and drawing entrants from Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Kansas and Colorado, the event is closely tied to the history of the high plains and the phenomenal wheat harvests grown there in the 1940s. The earliest event of this type was the National Wheat Show held in Perryton in 1941, the first good crop year after the dry dust bowl days of the 1930s.

Planned to raise money for the USO in the face of a pending war, the Wheat Show was broadcast across the state by radio and carried across the nation by the Associated Press and United Press International.

One percent of the nation's wheat crop was raised in Ochiltree county in 1944, and after wheat crop of 11 million bushels of grain, the first "Wheatheart of the Nation" pageant was held along with the Perryton Birthday Celebration that year. The two events have been held at the same time ever since.

This year the winning candidate in the contest will receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college of her choice. First runner-up in the contest will receive a \$500 scholarship, while the second runner-up will be presented with a \$250 scholarship. Other top contestants will receive prizes for their participation in the event.

Reigning "Miss Wheatheart," Kim Higgins of Guymon, will present the new queen with the crown she will wear for the coming year and a bouquet of flowers.

Week long festivities in Perryton for their annual Birthday Celebration will kick off Monday night with "World Championship Goat Roping" at the rodeo arena when over \$600 will be hanging on the horns and hooves of Spanish and Catalina goats. Only the first 32 entrants in this event will be accepted.

Other action will include a donkey baseball game between the Perryton Jaycees and the YMCA Men's Club on Tuesday night. All week there will be a carnival at the fairgrounds.

### CITY OF WHEELER RECEIVES \$100,000 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT

A \$98,250 community development plan for the City of Wheeler, Texas, was approved today by the Federal government.

At a ceremony held in Wheeler, Mayor Harrison H. Hall received a formal letter approving the city's application for funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. "Now," he said, "we can start building."

The new law will eventually provide \$2.5 billion for 1,271 cities and 85 counties across the United States this fiscal year.

Mayor Hall also received a personal letter from Secretary Hills congratulating the city and asking the Mayor to ensure "total public participation" as the development plan is carried out. It was also presented to him at the ceremony.

The plan calls for water improvements, including drilling new wells, new transmission lines, new storage, replace old inadequate lines, and increase number of fire hydrants.

Secretary Hills said the 1974 law under which the plan was submitted is designed to "change the old, helter-skelter system of helping U.S. cities grow." She said the new act "is designed to let the cities and counties of our nation set their own priorities with maximum discretion—within broad federal guidelines."

The Secretary aid approval "is only the first step." "I urge that you enlist all your citizens in helping to carry out this plan. This is a new direction in Federal policy and requires total public participation if it is to succeed," the Secretary added.

The formal presentation was made by Don Eamey, Director, HUD-FHA, Lubbock. He told newsmen at a brief-

ing prior to the ceremony that the next step is for a formal contract to be signed, and then a letter of credit will be insured. He said this will be done "shortly."

The HUD official emphasized that the new law provides for local direction and local priorities in creating and carrying out development plans, but he said one of the few strict guidelines is in the civil rights area.

He has been doing evangelist work for the last two years. Everyone is invited to attend the revival.

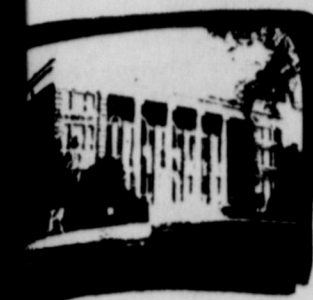

## Using Cattle to Harvest Grass

It has been said that a ranching operation is not raising cattle, but is growing grass. The cattle are only used to harvest the grass. This is very true and a rancher can never know too much about the business of growing grass.

If using cattle to harvest grass stocking rates should be analyzed and be flexible. If the growth of grass is normal during the year a normal stocking rate can be planned. If the growth is below normal during the year steps should be taken to reduce cattle numbers. If the grass growth is above normal extra cattle can be purchased or in some cases fields

can be hayed. In good years the rancher should get that extra production so that the bad years can be somewhat compensated for. To do this, the rancher must make wise use of extra production when he has it. To do this he must have management programs, not just a couple of management practices a year. If the personnel of the Soil Conservation Service of Wheeler can be of service in developing stocking rates or other management practices please call or come by the office.

Another Federal Agency is moving closer to the farm. This time it's the Environmental Protection Agency. EPA officials are now sifting through the chemical analysis of nearly 35-thousand pesticides to decide which ones will require a government restriction. Those chemicals classed as restricted may be applied only by persons certified. Although the starting date for the certification requirement is more than a year away (October, 1976), many farm operators are already checking the requirements for certification. The establishment of two levels of certification will make things easier for most ag producers. To be certified as a private applicator (applying pesticides on your own land) boils down basically to being able to read and follow instructions. Commercial certification will involve passing a written test which will cover chemical formulas, equipment specifications and EPA rules and regulations.
