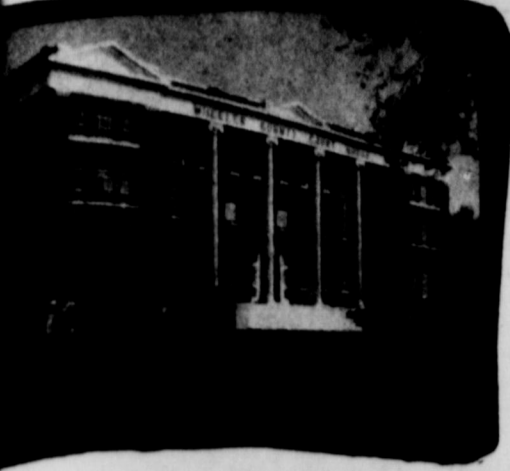

Peetie School begins a new school year on Monday, August 14th, at 8:00 a.m. Students in all grades will register and begin their classes on that day. Lunches and lunches will be served in the Cafeteria beginning with the first day. Free lunches and milk will be provided to those who need them. Application blanks for purpose will be provided with the students. Fees will be \$5 for everyone but Kindergarten and First Grade. Kindergarten will be provided by day sessions and will start at 11:30 a.m. each day after lunch, if they are to eat in the Cafeteria. Kindergarten will dismiss at 1:00 p.m. Transportation will be provided by the Kindergarten when they are dismissed. They are welcome to ride the buses in the mornings. Immunization requirements must be met by all students prior to enrollment. Lists of students entering Peetie School for the first time or those who have Kindergarten age children, should check with a doctor or the school about these requirements. Free clinics are being provided throughout the area and those interested should watch for announcements of times and places. There will be a short assembly program in the gymnasium at 10:00 a.m. and all parents and patrons are invited to attend. Pre-Registration For Wheeler High

Wheeler Public Schools will hold pre-registration Thursday, August 14, for the high school students. Friday, August 15, will be the first day of school. Seniors through Freshmen will enroll according to the following schedule: Seniors 9:00 to 10:30; Juniors—10:30 to 11:00; Sophomores—1:00 to 2:30 and Freshmen—2:30 to 4:00. School starts on Friday at 9:00 a.m. for Kindergarten through 12th grades. Buses will run on Friday.

4-H Jr. Rodeo Aug. 15-16

The Wheeler County 4-H Junior Rodeo has been scheduled for Friday and Saturday, August 15 and 16. The rodeo will be in the Wheeler Riding Club Arena beginning at 8:00 p.m. each night. The stock contractor for this year's show is Charlie Plummer of Sayre, Oklahoma. The rodeo is open to all youth that will not have passed their 20th birthday by the first day of the rodeo. There will be 4 age divisions with 4 or 5 events in each division. Boys and girls 5 years and under may enter the stick horse barrel race, boot scramble, goat ribbon race, calf riding, pole bending, and goat ribbon race. Boys 10-14 can enter yearling bull riding (approximately 700 pound bulls), breakaway roping, ribbon roping, goat tying and calf dobbing. Girls in the 10-14 year division may enter the flag race, calf dobbing, goat tying, barrel race and pole bending. Events for boys 15-19 include calf roping, ribbon roping, bull riding, bareback riding, and rescue race. Girls 15-19 may enter breakaway roping, yearling bull riding (approximately 700 pound bulls), goat tying, barrel race and pole bending. Buckles will be awarded to all first place winners except in the 5 and under division. First place winners in the 5 and under division will receive rosettes. All-around buckles will be given in all divisions. A contestant must enter at least 3 events to be eligible for the all-around buckle. A queen's contest will be held on Friday, August 15th at 7:30 p.m. just prior to the rodeo. The queen contest is open only to Wheeler County girls. For entry blanks or more information, contact Don King, County Extension Agent, Box 448, Wheeler or phone 806/826-5243. Wheeler County 4-H members are now selling rodeo tickets. The members selling the most tickets will receive a 4-H jacket. Tickets are \$1.25 for adults and 75c for children 6-12. Children under 6 will be admitted free.

For the second year in succession, the Wheeler Mustangs will have two of their stalwart performers on the gridiron participating in the annual Greenbelt Bowl football classic in Childress. Kent Ware and Raymond Martin were chosen for this year's game which will be played Friday night with the kickoff at 8 P.M. The 1974 contest had Lewis Britt and Dale Helton representing the Mustangs in the game and this year's selection of Ware and Martin continues the tradition of some of Wheeler's top performers being chosen to play in the Greenbelt all-star game. Kent is the 18 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. N. D. Ware and the 4 year letterman will represent the Mustangs on the East Squad which again this year will be staffed by coaches from Howard Payne College in Brownwood. In his four playing years for Wheeler, Kent spent playing time in the offensive backfield at three positions, quarterback, fullback, and tailback, and played line-backer on defense. Last year, Kent was one of the Mustangs captains and gained over a 1000 yards running with the pigskin from his tailback spot. Kent made the District 2-A all district second team at a linebacker position following his junior and senior seasons and was a first team selection this past year on offense at running back. This fall, Kent will continue his education at Texas Tech. Raymond is the 17 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Martin and this Mustang stalwart has been placed on the West squad which will be coached by the staff from Tarleton State College at Stephenville. 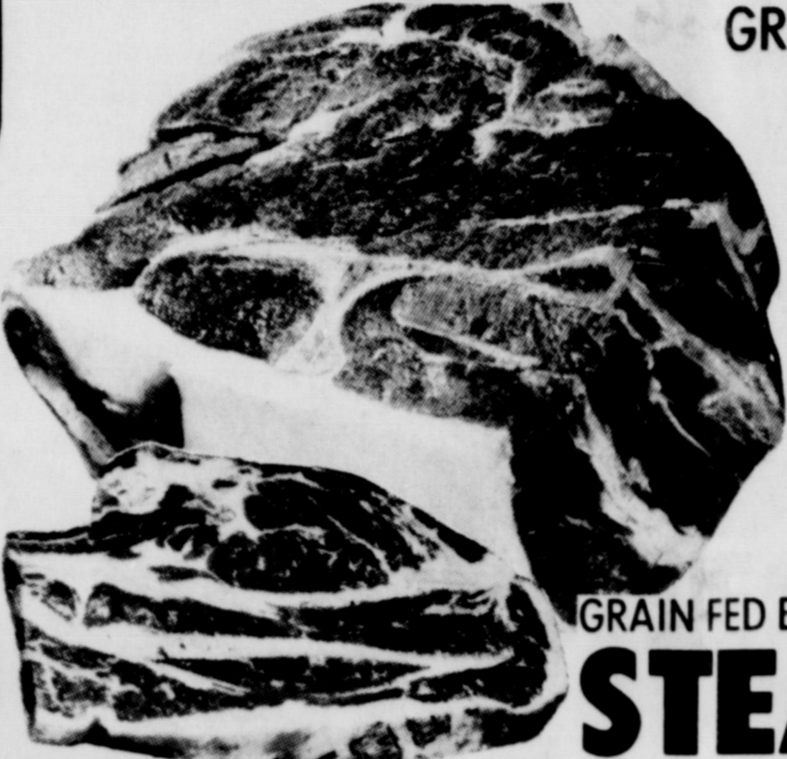
