Fireguards On Grasslands
With all of the rains we recei
earlier this year, it has been a $g$ year for grass production on range land, pastureland, and CRP. Although good for erosion control and/or forage
production, these grassland acres primarily lovegrass, have created fire hazard on much of the county.
This problem is not one which This problem is not one which ca
easily be solved, as a wildfire ca jump highways if the conditions are

stop a wildfire in this case, it can be a preventative measure that cauld be
