



Tarleton State tight end Kyle Masters has been the Outstanding College Football Player of the Month by the Sports Committee of the Amarillo Chamber of Commerce, it was announced Monday.

The Sports Committee will present Masters with the award, which goes to Amarillo area standouts, this Thursday at its monthly gathering. Masters, a 6-2, 220-pound redshirt freshman, is a native of Wheeler, Texas, which is located about 100 miles east of Amarillo in the Texas panhandle.

Masters is being honored for the month of November, when he helped the Texans to their first-ever Lone

tist church, where he served as an usher and was a member of the Adult Six Men's Sunday School Class. He was a Gideon. He was a member of the Tex-Mex Diablos of the Carriage Travel Club, serving as president.

He was a loving and loved husband, father, grandfather and greatgrandfather. He had a special place in his heart for children.

He was preceded in death by his father and mother, Amos and Faye






