## Gene Miller, 79, Dies Fri., Feb. 1, In Amarillo

Gene Miller, longtime advertising art director for the Amarillo Globe-News, died Friday, Feb. 1, 2002. He was 79.

There were no services at Mr. Miller's request. Arrangements were by Boxwell Brothers Funeral Directors of Amarillo.

Mr. Miller grew up in Happy and graduated from Happy High School. He studied at Texas Tech University and served in the Army Air Corps during World War II as a photograph technician. He worked briefly for the California aircraft company before his military service in the European Theater.

He had his first association with the Globe-News as a carrier in the 1930's. His first in-house newspaper experience was as a proof-reader for his hometown weekly newspaper, The Happy Herald.

He returned to Texas Tech until 1948, when he was employed by the Globe-News as a layout artist and staff cartoonist. He later was a member of the retail advertising sales staff and became advertising art director in 1951.

He and the former Marcellie Farmer, also a longtime Globe-News employee, were married Sept. 2, 1950, in Portales, N.M. He was a member of Covenant Presbyterian Church.

Survivors include his wife; two daughter, Paige Miller of Amarillo and Brook Bucy of Lubbock; a brother, Robert O. Miller of Amarillo; a sister, Johannah Kuykendall of Durham, N.C.; and six grandchildren.

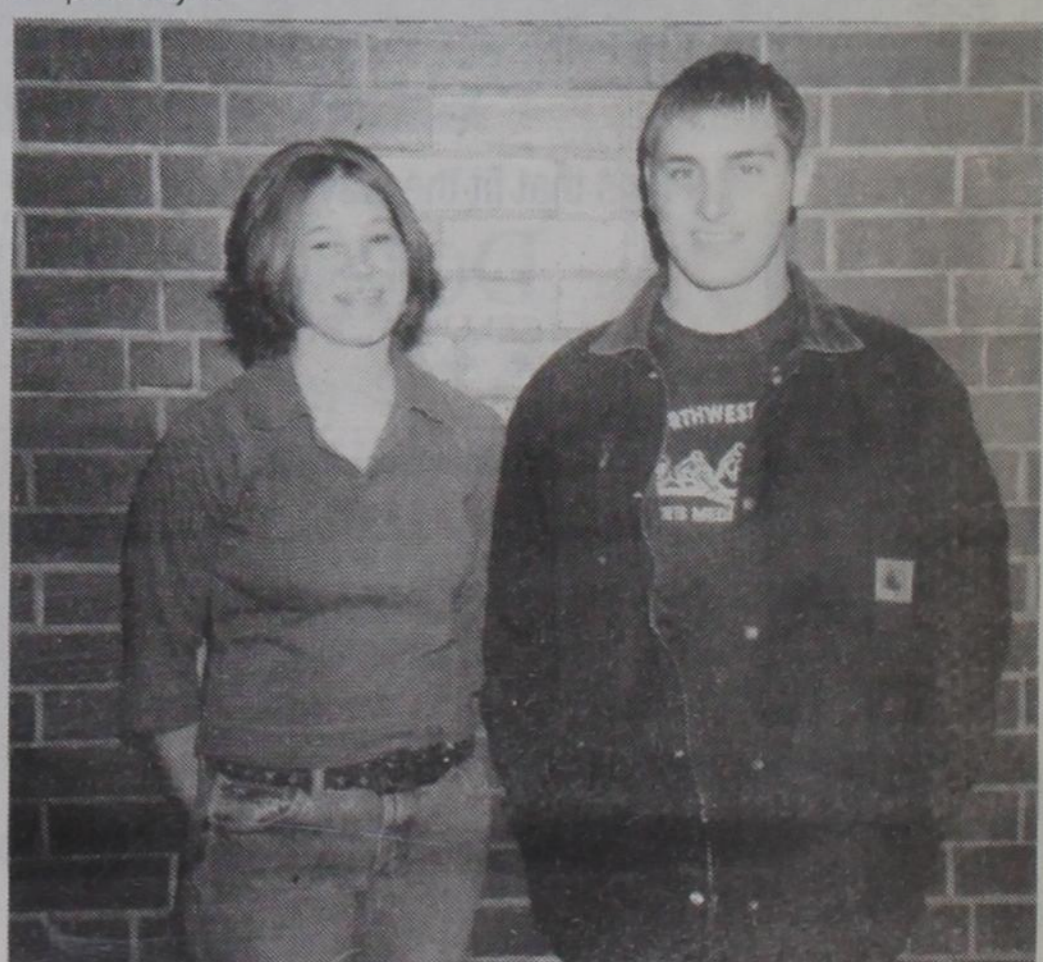

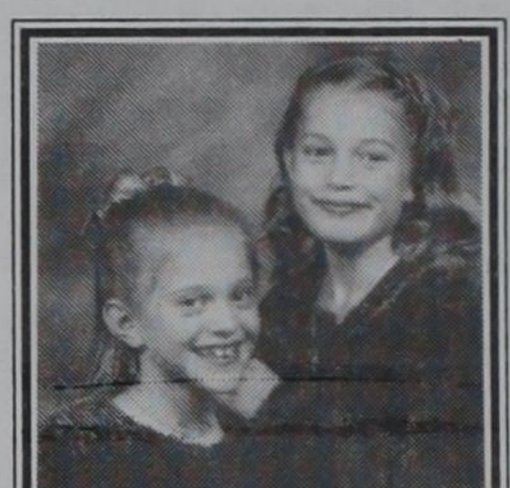


