Betty Joy Gaines— A Survivor's Story

How and when were you made aware you had cancer?

I had discovered a lump under my left arm. After numerous appointments with my family physician, an appointment was made for a mammogram at the Harrington Women's Health Center where a mammogram and sonogram, and later a biopsy, was performed.

Circumstances surrounding the discovery, life circumstances at the time of diagnosis?

I am a widow of 11 years. I have two sons, Phillip and Russell, five grandchildren, Kandra, Trenon, Nicholas, Caleb and Michael Gaines. I have been employed by Market Square Thriftway for seven years. I was diagnosed with small lymphocytic lymphoma in early October 2006. I started chemotherapy treatments on November 15, 2006. I had a total of eight treatments to take, one every three weeks. No surgery was required. My family was very supportive from diagnosis throughout each of my treatments. I don't think this has affected any one member any more than another. It affects everyone.

Feelings now? How have you adjusted being a cancer survivor? What has transpired since the

Any child who will be 5 years old on or before September 1 of this year is eligible to attend Kindergarten. Any child who will be 4 years old on or before September 1 of this year may attend Pre Kindergarten at Fort Elliott CISD.

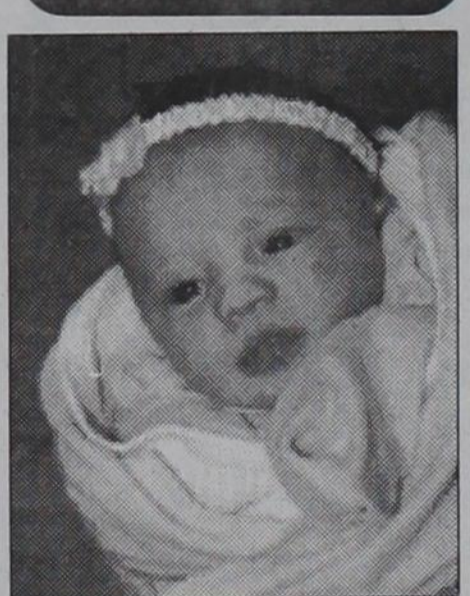

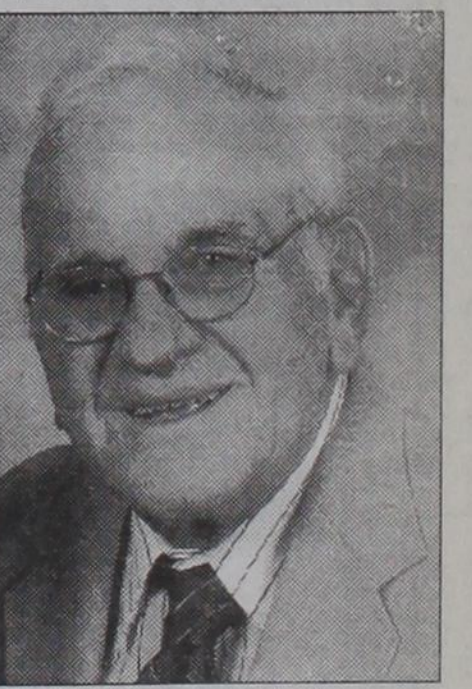

Sidewalk Donations

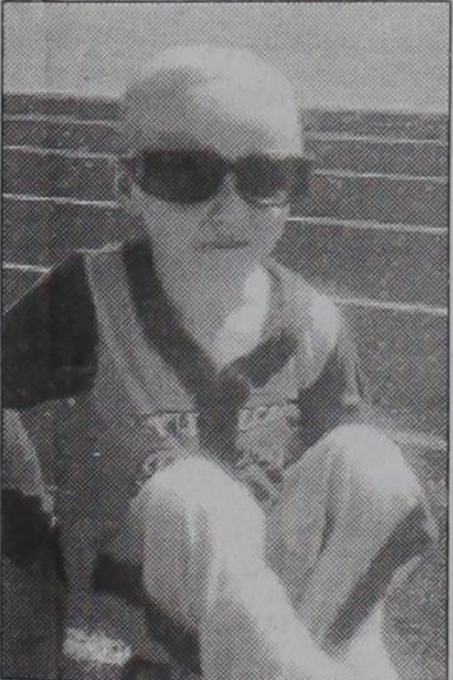
A group of Wheeler citizens met with the Wheeler City Council in a special session, Tuesday, July 23, 2007, concerning building sidewalks on the east and west sides of Highway 83, since the new highway will be several feet narrower than the old. The main concerns of the citizens was for the safety of our children; they will have no place to walk or ride their bikes in a safe place on their way to school, to the park or pool.

Unfortunately, TxDOT has no funding for the sidewalks, but have agreed to do the dirt work if we can raise money to pay for the sidewalks while the present contractors are still in Wheeler. The council voted at a special meeting July 30, 2007, to approve the project if private funding is available.

The cost of the project will be approximately \$100,000.00, which must be raised by August 10, 2007, in order to get the sidewalks now.

This notice concerns 2007 property tax rates for WHEELER COUNTY. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Vance Hutton of Double Springs, Alabama, wrote the following entitled, *Then the End*.

Solomon said that the end of a thing is better than the beginning (Ecclesiastes 7:8). We rejoice at births and weep at deaths, but even that end can be better than the beginning. Paul said for him to die was gain (Philippians 1:21). There is an end coming to the world just as surely as there was a beginning. 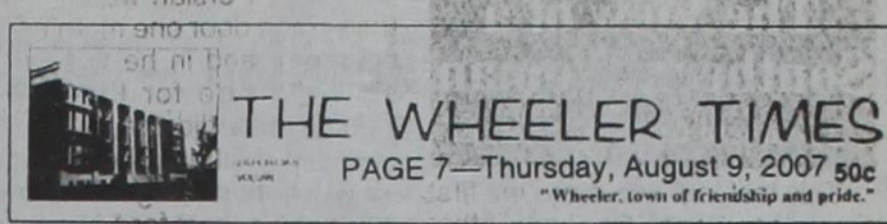

Parkview Artery Thunderstorms and Lightning

It is late afternoon. The white puffy clouds that have been growing all day are replaced by a greenish sky. A distant rumble is heard...then another. It starts to rain. A flash of light streaks the sky, followed by a huge BOOM. Welcome to a thunderstorm. Thunderstorms are one of the most thrilling and dangerous of weather phenomena. Over 40,000 thunderstorms occur throughout the world each day. Thunderstorms have several distinguishing characteristics that can cause large amounts of damage to humans and their property. Straight-line winds and tornadoes can uproot trees and demolish buildings.

Hail can damage cars and crops. Heavy rains can create flash floods. Lightning can spark a fire or hurt you. Safety during a thunderstorm is really important.

Here's a little information about what thunderstorm is. A thunderstorm is formed from a combination of moisture, rapidly rising warm air and a force capable of lifting air such as a warm and cold front. All thunderstorms contain lightning.

Some thunderstorms can be seen approaching, while others hit without warning. It is important to learn and recognize the danger signs and to plan ahead. Learn the thunderstorm danger signs. Dark, towering, or threatening clouds. Distant lightning and thunder. Because light travels much faster than sound, lightning flashes can be seen long before the resulting thunder is heard. Estimate the number of miles you are from a thunderstorm by counting the number of seconds between a flash of lightning and the next clap of thunder. Divide this number by five. You are in danger from lightning if you can hear thunder. Knowing how far away a storm is does not mean that you are in danger only when the storm is overhead.

A severe thunderstorm watch is issued when the weather conditions are such that a severe thunderstorm (damaging winds 58 miles per hour or more, or hail three-fourths of an inch in diameter or greater) is likely to develop (Lightning is an electrical discharge that results from the buildup of positive and negative charges within a thunderstorm. When the buildup becomes strong enough, lightning appears as a "bolt." This flash of light usually occurs within the clouds or between the clouds and the ground. A bolt of lightning reaches a temperature approaching 50,000 degrees Fahrenheit in a split second. The rapid heating and cooling of air near the lightning causes thunder. Thunderstorms can bring heavy rains (which can cause flash flooding), strong winds, hail, lightning and tornadoes. In a severe thunderstorm get inside a sturdy building and stay tuned to a battery-operated radio for weather information. Lightning is a major threat during a thunderstorm.

What do you do when Lightning Strikes a Person? (Check for injuries. A person who has been struck by lightning does not carry an electrical charge that can shock other people. If the victim is burned, provide first aid and call emergency medical assistance immediately. Look for burns where lightning entered and exited the body. If the strike cause the victim's heart and breathing to stop, give cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) until medical professionals arrive and take over. Lightning is the most deadly aspect of a thunderstorm. While most lightning victims recover, twenty percent don't survive.

treatment described? What is going on now? Has your life shifted back to a normal status? Any changes?

Right now, I'll feel much better after my next PET scan in October. I'm not sure that I have adjusted yet. This will affect my life from now on; you're just glad to wake up each day. I have to have treatments for the next 2 years, one treatment every 3 months, so my life isn't any where near normal. My whole life has changed...its always in the back of your mind...it never leaves. I'm just thankful to be here.

What advice do you have for other people who are at risk?

You need to get yearly check-ups. If it hadn't been for the lump under my arm, I would have never had the mammogram. I had been going to the doctor for 6 months because I was so tired and nothing was ever found. And, always be truthful with your doctor about how you are feeling.

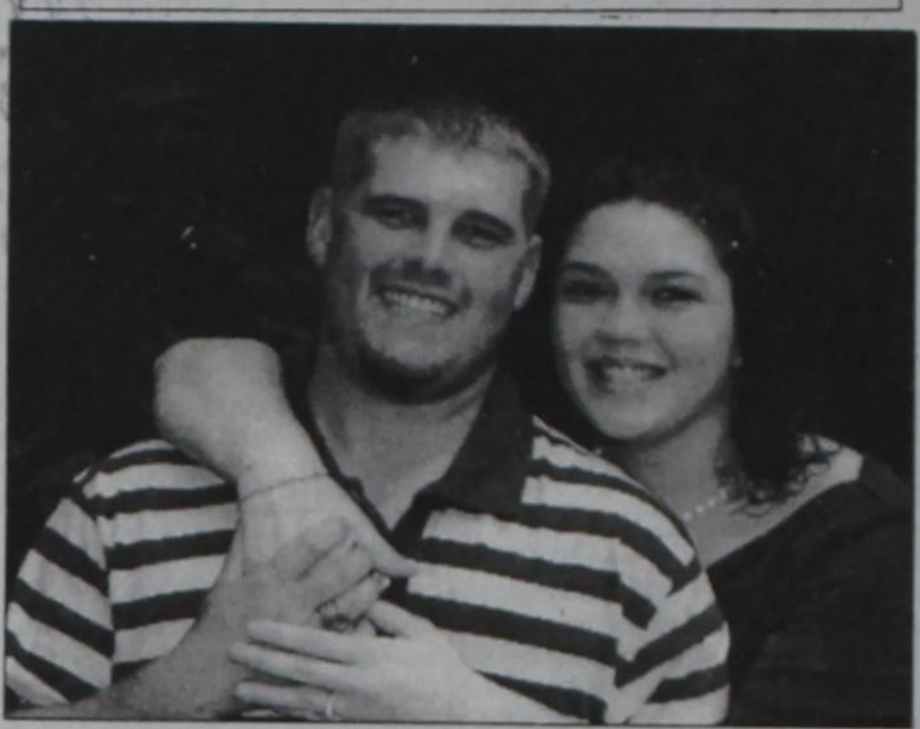
