# Courthouse Vacated, **Locations Of County**

Wheeler County offices have been moved out of the courthouse to make way for the restoration. The offices are located in five locations over town, on the square

The building at 410 S. Main houses the County Judge's office, County Clerk's office, County Attorney's office, County Treasurer's office and will be the meeting place for the

Commissioner's Court. The County Tax Assessor/ Collector is located at 106 W. Texas, the old SPS building. Wallace Fields, County Veterans Agent is also in this building ev-

ery Monday. The District Clerk and District Judge have offices at 206 E.

Texas, behind Production Credit. The District Probation Offices are located at 110 W. Oklahoma, the old L. & F. Repair.

Just down the street at 112 W. Oklahoma, the old FHA office is the County Extension Service

To renew your driver's license, you will need to be at the old Jail, courthouse square. The Driver's License Trooper will have a room with the District Attorney, and is in the office on the second and fourth Tuesday of the month.

Justice of the Peace, Brady Meadows has moved his office to the County jail building.

The phone numbers for all the offices are the same, as listed in the phone directory.
